

Protests for open admissions in Cluster University Jammu continue

Police detains several students during scuffle

JAMMU: Hundreds of students continued their agitation and held a massive protest demonstration outside Cluster University campus GGM Science College Jammu against the dictatorial attitude of the administration. Students alleged Cluster University administration of playing with their future. They allege that Cluster University did similar in last year and had learned nothing from that. Protesting students raised slogans against Vice-chancellor of Cluster University and demand open admissions for all.

Gathered students further tried to block the Canal road where they indulge in the scuffle with the police. Meanwhile police detained eight students and took them to the Police Post Canal road. One student Rahul Sharma also got injured during the protest. The protest was led by student leaders Atul Sudan

(State Vice President Jammu Joint Students Federation), Anshu Sharma, Parteek Raina, Piyush and others.

Addressing the massive gathering of the admission seekers Parteek Raina said that it is very unfortunate that instead of increasing the capacity of the city college the administration in connivance with the state government is hell-bent to destroy the future of student community of Duggar region as the capacity of the city colleges was almost 15000 which is reduced to 6000 for this session. He

said that students who have passed their higher secondary examinations have every right to take admission in the colleges for further studies.

Meanwhile addressing the gathering of another students leader Anshu Sharma said that this struggle shall not end till each and every student is admitted in the college. He said that students are not getting the aspired combinations in the newly opened colleges and although there is no proper infrastructure and laboratories etc in those colleges so that students can take

admission there.

Atul Sudan in his address alleged that UT administration has failed to address the genuine grievance of students. He said it is now more than a week that students are on road fighting for the their basic fundamental right of right to education and there are students who have secured more than 85% and are yet not provided admissions in Cluster University. He alleged that Vice Chancellor of Cluster University is playing with the careers of thousand of students from Jammu region which will be never tolerated. He said administration should not test the patience of students community as this can result in mass agitation for which the administration will be responsible. He allege this is total failure of administration as they were very well aware of the facts that government has mass promoted the students in 12th and there was dire need to

increase the intake. He said every year students have to fight for admissions on road and raised serious allegations on Cluster University administration of deliberately playing with students career.

Students appealed Lieutenant Governor to intervene and save the future of thousands of students who have passed with good percentage in their 12th class examinations by declaring admissions open for all pass out students. They further warned higher education department and administration cluster university that if soon they will fail to address their issues they will take this agitation to all districts and colleges making it a mass movement.

He further said that it is a legacy of the previous regimes and governments that casual/daily rated workers with least hope of regularization and non-payment of decent wages are working in departments.

He further said during the last Legislative Assembly he along with other companion BJP legislators had vociferously raised the issue of strict implementation of Minimum Wages Act and a time bound regularization

of all daily rated/casual /contractual workers.

Contract killer awarded lifer by Session Court Kulgam

JAMMU: The Court of Principal Sessions Judge Kulgam, Presided over by Tahir Khurshid Raina, awarded life imprisonment to an accused named Shah Jahan padder alias Shahal padder son of Gh. Hassan padder of Mirhama, kulgam, in FIR NO- 96 / 2010 of police station Kulgam. He was facing trial for last 11 years in a murder case for killing Mohd Altaf padder of Mirhama, Kulgam. The case was based on circumstantial evidence wherein the prosecution succeeded in proving motive and last seen theory corroborated by disclosure statement of the accused leading to recovery of weapon of offence and other articles on the identification of the accused coupled with medical evidence and FSL report.

Briefly the case of prosecution was that the deceased Altaf padder had a strained relationship with

his father Ali Mohd padder owing to his second marriage and not giving the deceased his due share in the property. On account of it the deceased had a grudge against his father and finally he wanted to get him eliminated. The deceased paid rupees fifty thousand to the accused as a contract money to kill his father. But meanwhile the things got settled between the deceased and his father and consequently the deceased demanded the money back from the accused. Not ready to part the money, the accused planned a ploy to kill the deceased to avoid repayment. He executed his plan by abducting the deceased from his home in the evening and killed the deceased in the intervening night of 25th/26th April 2010.

The whole chain of events were proved by prosecution especially by the unflinching depositions of the mother and the wife of the deceased who established last seen theory

followed by murder of deceased, disclosure , recoveries and expert evidence .

Court observed that as the case is based on circumstantial evidence so chain of evidence to be proved without break is sine quo non for conviction of the accused and in instant case all the prominent incriminating facts stand proved by the prosecution beyond reasonable doubt. Addressing the argument of defence regarding lapses in investigation, court observed that the settled position of law on the point is that if case is otherwise proved by the prosecution against the accused, lapses will have no bearing on conviction of the accused.

While addressing the issue of award of punishment, court observed that after taking holistic view of the case and after hearing the counsels for the parties , I do not find it a case of rarest of rare. Accordingly court awarded life imprisonment to the accused.

Court awards 8 years RI to self style God-man in rape case

JAMMU: Additional Sessions Judge Kathua Kamlesh Pandita today awarded eight years rigorous imprisonment and fine of Rs 10,000 to one Balkar Singh self styled God-man who was facing trial in rape case.

According to the police case that on August 2, 2016 that Complainant that she was suffering from some disease and was undergoing mental agony and during that period complainant came in contact with the accused person namely Balkar Singh who was self styled God-man assured her recovery if she agreed to undergo his divine treatment. The accused became Familiar with the family members of the complainant and start-

ed visiting her house and thereafter developed physical relation with the complainant on the assurance of marrying her. The complainant further reveals that in the month of April accused came to house of complainant and impregnated her. She disclosed to the accused that she was pregnant.

He flatly refused to marry her and told her that whatever she wanted to do, can do but he would not marry her. On this complainant approached the police and a case under FIR no 70/2016 came to be registered u/s 376 RPC. After completion of investigation challan was presented which was today decided and Court awarded eight years RI and fine Rs 10,000.

CWS organises 5th Gender Sensitisation Workshop for students

JAMMU: Under the Gender Sensitization Workshop Series, the Centre for Women Studies (CWS), University of Jammu organized fifth workshop for the PG students of Department of Zoology, Institute of Human Genetics and school of Bio-technology University of Jammu on Thursday. Dr. Anurekha Chari Wagh, Associate Professor, Department of Sociology, University of Hyderabad was the resource person.

Dr. Anurekha spoke about the



concept of gender, how it is seen and perceived in our day today life and how unequal power structures in the form of power differentials and inequality in various spheres is taken as normal and taken for granted.
