SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir Police is organizing 'Run for Peace' Kashmir Marathon on October 17 under its Civil Action Programme (CAP) in Srinagar.

A police spokesman said on Thursday that the event is being organized under the patronage of Director General of Police (DGP) Dilbagh Singh as a part of 75th Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.

Additional Director General of Police (ADGP) Armed SJM Gillani is the Chairman of this event and Inspector General of Police (IGP) Kashmir range Vijay Kumar is its Organizing Secretary.

He said various committees have been constituted for making the event a great success in all respect.

Gillani discussed all the activities of the event with the members of designated committees and officials today at Conference Hall of

Earlier, Syed Sajad Hussain Private Secretary to ADGP Armed, having additional charge of Deputy SP Sports APHQ briefed the

meeting through a visual presentation about all the activities to be carried out during the event. He enlightened the meeting about all the routes and arrangements proposed for the event.

Gillani apprised the house that the event is organized for the people of all walks of life, adding that it is an "open for all" event. He advised that vast publicity should be made to ensure participation of one and all.

The various events which are scheduled to be held during Kashmir Marathon "Run for Peace" on October 17 at

Police Golf Course Boulevard Road Srinagar included 21 Kms Half Marathon (Men), 21 Kms Half Marathon (for Police/ Army/ CAPF Personnel), 10 Kms Road Race (Open for Boys above 14 years), 10 Kms Road Race (Open for Girls above 14 years), 5 Kms Road Race (Sub-Junior Boys Under 14 Years) and 4 Kms Road Race (Sub-Junior Girls under 14 years), 2 Kms Road Race for specially challenged (Boys/ Girls), 4 Kms Run for Fun (Open for All Senior Citizens/ Children) and 4 Kms Run

for Fun for Senior Citizen and Children.

During the meeting it was also announced that four registration counters shall be established at Srinagar with effect from October 10 2021 at SDPO Office Nehru Park, Lake View Police Golf Course Srinagar; SK Indoor Sports Complex Srinagar and Kashmir University Srinagar. Athlete shall collect and deposit their registration forms at these registration counters. SSP APCR Kashmir has also been asked to liaise AIG (W) PHQ for creation of link for online registration.

The participants shall have to assemble at the venue on 0545 hours for scrutiny and distribution of Chest Nos and T-Shirts from 0600 hours to 0630 hours. The Half Marathon Men 21 Kms shall be flagged-off at 0645 hours followed by other categories within a gap of 2 to 3 minutes one after another.

JAMMU: Chief Engineer (Distribution) JPDCL, Jammu on Thursday informed that the power supply to Governor House, New Plot, Rehari Chungi, Sarval, Rehari, B.C. Road, Shakuntla, Ustad Mohalla, Amphalla, Manda and their adjoining areas shall remain affected on October 01 from 6 am to 9 am.

Similarly, the power supply to Snailpur, Raya, Gurah, Mandal and their adjoining areas shall remain affected on October 01 from 8 am to 2 pm.

Likewise, the power supply to Baspur, Kotli, Kalyana, Miran Sahib and its adjoining areas shall remain affected on October 01 from 8.30 am to 9 am and 1

pm to 1.30 pm. Similarly, the power supply to Krishna Nagar, Chand Nagar, Jewel, Vinayak Bazar, PHE, Company Bagh, MA Stadium, Jammu Club & adjoining areas shall remain affected on October 01 from 9 am to 2 pm. Likewise, the power supply to Greater Kailash, Birpur Industry, Seora, Kanal & adjoining areas shall remain affected on October 01 from 7 am to 9.30 pm. ## Major road projects in J&K reviewed

SRINAGAR: The Chief Secretary, Dr.Arun Kumar Mehta on Thursday chaired a high-level meeting to review the progress of various road projects in Jammu and Kashmir under execution in the different schemes of UT and Central governments.

Administrative Secretaries of Home, Power Development, Public Works (R&B), Mining, besides Divisional Commissioners of Kashmir/Jammu, officers from BRO,NHAI, NHIDCL and concerned Deputy Commissioners participated in the meeting.

It was informed that the Mining department has allotted short-term permit for extracting the minor minerals to the executing agency to ensure continuous supply of construction material for the Jammu semi-ring road project.

It was further informed that NHAI has constructed crash barriers/parapets at all the critical stretches on Udhampur-Ramban sectionto

prevent occurrence of fatal accidents on the National Highway-44.

Dr Mehta directed the installation of such barriers on all critical stretchesof Ramban-Banihal section within a week, especially in the areas prone to frequent landslides and slip-pages.

'To facilitate smooth traffic flow on the Ramban- Banihal stretch of the National Highway, the traffic police and district administration were directed to properly demarcate single-lane driving zones and ensure lane-driving and traffic discipline among the commuters.

The Chief Secretary further directed the District

Administration, Ramban to reduce response time to 15 minutes for clearing up traffic snarl ups on the highway caused by vehicles breakdown or accidents by deploying adequate number of cranes on Ramban-Banihal stretch, particularly on the 'under-construction stretches.

Dr Mehta further directed NHAI to operationalize 8 rest areas ( wash rooms with mini eating joints) by 31st October, 2021 and all 3 vehicle holding areas/parking bays on NH-44 by 30th November, 2021 to provide ease of travel to the commuters on the National Highway.

He also directed the JKTDC to set up similar facilities on

national highway for use by the public by 31st October, 2021.

The Chief Secretary also reviewed the progress on the Z-Morh tunnel; Srinagar-Shopian-Qazigund road; Srinagar semi-ring road project; Chenani-Sudmahadev-Gohra road; Jammu-Akhnoor-Poonch road and the upcoming Delhi-Katra expressway and fixed specific timelines for their completion.

Dr Mehta also reviewed the status of works on bridges like Noor Jahan bridge, Brazloo bridge, Gadora bridge among others and gave specific timelines for their operationalisation so that they could be dedicated to the people of the UT.

It was directed that the Srinagar-Shopian-Qazigund along with bypass should be made operational by July, 2022.

The Chief Secretary asked the DC, Udhampur to hand over the 3,3842 hectares land to the executing agency by 7th October, 2021 so that work on the Chenani- Sudmahadev Gohra road is commenced.

District administrations of Jammu and Samba and Kathua were directed to hand over the possession of land for Delhi Amritsar Katra express way to the executing agency by 1st November, 2021.

Dr Mehta further directed that land acquisition for Z morh tunnel should be completed by 15th October 2021.

Similarly, the department was asked to make the Noor Jehan bridge trafficable by 31st December; 2021 besides readying Gadora bridge ready for inauguration by 1st January, 2021.

The Chief Secretary further directed that the condition of the road from Panthachowk to Badami Bagh cantonment should be improved by 15 October, 2021.

The Chief Secretary urged all the concerned Deputy Commissioners to expeditiously resolve all the land acquisition issues bedevilling the construction work on the highway and complete the land acquisition early so that the all ongoing projects are completed within the stipulated timelines.
