



## NIA carries out searches in Kashmir, arrests 3 ISIS operatives

SRINAGAR: National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Sunday carried out raids at several places in Kashmir valley and arrested three 'operatives' of proscribed terrorist organization Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) and The Resistance Front (TRF), considered a shadow outfit of the banned Lashker-e-Taiba terror group, which has claimed responsibility for a spate of targeted civilian killings.

An NIA spokesperson said that the searches were carried with the assistance of CRPF and Jammu and Kashmir Police at eight locations in Kashmir.

A case was initially registered at Bahu Fort police station relating to the recovery of an IED from a Lashker-e-Taiba terrorist.

### Kashmir target killings: NIA summons 40 teachers

SRINAGAR: In connection with civilian target killings, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) has summoned 40 teachers on Sunday as the agency has formally taken over the investigations from the local police.

Top officials are camping in Srinagar under the directions of the Union Home Minister, who has taken a serious note of the civilian killings by the terrorists.

The J&K Police have already detained over 400 people in connection with the FIRs lodged in different police stations pertaining to the civilian killings in the Valley.

Top sources said the detained people have known links with the proscribed Jamaat-e-Islami,

## J&K Accession files: Disclosure of Bucher papers in 'national interest', CIC observes

NEW DELHI: The disclosure of files provided by India's second army chief General Sir Roy Bucher to Nehru Memorial Museum and Library about Jammu and Kashmir related to the period of 1947-49, which may throw light on Accession, is in "national interest", the Central Information Commission has observed in an order.

The Commission stopped short of ordering disclosure of these crucial documents, withheld from the public on orders of the Ministry of External Affairs.

Agitated Sarpanchs, Panchs withdraw resignation in Ramban

## NC suffers major jolt in Jammu; 2 prominent leaders Devender Rana, Slatia resign

JAMMU: The National Conference suffered a major setback in Jammu as two prominent leaders Devender Rana and Surjit Singh Slatia resigned from the party on Sunday.

They are likely to join the BJP in Delhi on Monday.

"Dr Farooq Abdullah has received & accepted the resignations of Mr Salathia & Mr Rana. No further action or comment is deemed necessary," a National Conference spokesman tweeted.

Rana, who was NC's provincial president of the Jammu region, also

announced the decision to quit the National Conference during a brief interaction with media persons outside his house here, ending over week-long speculation about



him leaving his party and joining the BJP.

"I along with (senior party colleague and former minister) S S Slatia resigned from the basic membership of the National Conference," he told reporters.

JAMMU: Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh on Sunday said the Modi Govt is giving special impetus to Agriculture Start-

ups.

He said, this is the golden period of Agriculture happening in India under Prime Minister Narendra Modi and technological interventions, research and innovation in agriculture under his leadership will double the farmers income by 2022.

The Minister said this while attending the concluding ceremony of 5-day long

Northern India Regional Agriculture Fair 2021 as chief guest at SKUAST Jammu.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Jitendra Singh said that PM Narendra Modi is serious towards agriculture development in India that can be judged from the fact that two new Ministries, Jal Shakti and Skill Development & Entrepreneurship have been created only to promote agriculture and doubling the farmers income by 2022. He further mentioned that one of its important links is the recently launched 'Helio-Borne Survey Technology for groundwater management & to map groundwater resources in arid regions for drinking and agricultural purposes.'

Dr Jitendra said that the agriculture and farm production has been revolutionised in India under the current government which is evident from the various initiatives taken by the government for the welfare of farmers like the Soil Health Card,

Police bust TRF module, arrest 4 terror associates

SRINAGAR: Police on Sunday said a module of The Resistance Front (TRF) was busted and four terror associates involved in the conspiracy behind the killing of Mohammad Shafi Lone last week were arrested in Jammu and Kashmir's Bandipore district.

"A special team of Bandipore Police was entrusted with the investigation of the case and after thorough human and technical corroboration, the module was busted by arresting four terrorists associated with the TRF," a police spokesman said.

## AC reduces tax on aviation turbine fuel to 1 pc in J&K

Approves rehabilitation package for affected families at Ramban

SRINAGAR: The Administrative Council (AC), which met here on Sunday under the chairmanship of Lieutenant Governor, Manoj Sinha, decided to reduce the Sales Tax on Aviation Turbine Fuel to one per cent.

Farooq Khan and Rajeev Rai Bhatnagar, Advisors to the Lieutenant Governor, Dr Arun Kumar Mehta, Chief Secretary, J&K and Nitishwar Kumar, Principal Secretary to the Lieutenant Governor attended the meeting.

This decision is part of slew

of measures taken by the Government recently to promote air traffic to Jammu and Kashmir. Recently, the air strip at Jammu Airport was extended and consequently, airlines were allowed to operate flights to full capacity. Additionally, late evening flights were allowed both at Jammu and Srinagar Airports.

In another decision, the Administrative Council approved the proposal of the Revenue Department for rehabilitation of six families whose structures are

## Ladakh row: India, China hold 13th round of military talks

NEW DELHI: India on Sunday pressed for an early disengagement of troops in the remaining friction points in eastern Ladakh at the 13th round of military talks with China that lasted for around eight-and-a-half hours, sources in the security establishment said.

It is learnt that a major focus of the Corps Commander-level talks was to complete the stalled disengagement at Patrolling Point 15 (PP-15).

India has been insisting that the resolution of outstanding issues in all friction points including in Depsang

is essential for an overall improvement in ties between the two countries.

The Indian delegation is understood to have conveyed this view firmly at the 13th round of talks while pressing for bringing down tensions at Depsang.
