# India, China fail to resolve remaining issues in Ladakh during talks

NEW DELHI: India and China failed to make any headway in resolving the 17month standoff in the remaining friction points in eastern Ladakh with the Indian Army on Monday saying the "constructive suggestions" made by it at the latest round of military talks were neither agreeable to the Chinese side nor Beijing could provide any "forwardlooking" proposals.

In a strong statement after the 13th round of talks on Sunday that ended in a stalemate, the Army also said the situation along the Line of Actual Control(LAC) had been caused by "unilateral attempts" of the Chinese side to alter the status quo and it is necessary that China takes appropriate steps to restore peace in the region.
