The project, to be accomplished in two phases includes installation of six large outdoor video walls at prominent locations on the track in the first phase, which was inaugurated today, and 20 Indoor LED screens at major establishments of the Shrine Board during the second phase.

The locations where the video walls would be displayed include Darshani Deodi Banganga, New Darshani Deodi Tarakote Marg, Langer Point at Tarakote Marg, Adhkuwari Complex, Bhairon ji platform, and Sanjichhat platform.

This project would primarily facilitate the pilgrims by way of Live Atka Arti, Mata Ki Kahani (Stage Play), and Live Darshans on their way to Bhawan. Moreover, it will also provide advisory/display features (24X7) regarding Disaster Prone Locations on the track during rainy season and otherwise, besides, providing information of missing persons or items, and early warnings of weather forecast.

The project also provides general information to the visiting pilgrims such as medical & ambulance facilities, accommodation & catering arrangements, water & toilet locations, general announcements, assistance information, dos and don'ts, etc.

The Lt Governor directed the concerned officers to devise a Standard Operating Procedure for hi-tech Multipurpose Video Walls so that the facility could be utilized efficiently.

Patoli-Mangotriani here and assured the family of all support from the Union Territory administration, the spokesperson said.

He told the bereaved family members that the administration fully stands with them in this hour of grief.

Two teachers -- Supinder Kour, a Srinagar-based Sikh, and Chand, a Hindu from Jammu -- were shot dead on October 7 by members of The Resistance Force (TRF), a shadow outfit of proscribed terror organisation Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT).

They were killed two days after the outfit claimed responsibility for three more killings in the Union Territory.

Makhan Lal Bindroo, a prominent Kashmiri Pandit and the owner of Srinagar's most famous pharmacy, was shot dead at his shop on the evening of October 5. Minutes later, a 'chaat' vendor, Virendra Paswan from Bihar, was gunned down elsewhere in the city. Around the same time, another civilian, Mohammad Shafi Lone, was killed at Naidkhai in Bandipora.

On October 2, terrorists shot dead Majid Ahmad Gojri at Srinagar's Karan Nagar locality and Mohammad Shafi Dar at the city's Batamaloo area.

Sikhs, both of whom had been targeted in the recent days.

"All of us should try our level best to ensure that we do not see a fresh exodus of minorities from Kashmir", he said, adding that no one community feels safer than the other.

"Whatever can be done to stem this and to restore the sense of security to these communities must be done. Obviously, the lion's share of this work has to be done by the administration but as the majority community, we also carry some of that responsibility. We must fulfil that responsibility", he told PTI in an interview here.

Castigating the administration for trying to 'score propaganda and public relations victories rather than focus on the ground realities', Abdullah asked the authorities to "take a long hard look at why we have reached where we have".

Abdullah, however, refrained from terming the recent attacks as an intelligence failure, saying: "... I think it's the failure to act on intelligence. That is a failure you cannot just blame the police for because the counter-militancy operations are conducted by police, paramilitary and military. It is the collective failure of our counter-insurgency grid."

He reasoned that for the last few months there has been chatter about targeted attacks against minorities, particularly against Kashmiri Pandits.

"So obviously, if somebody like me who has no association or anything like that with the government and is not privy to any intelligence reports, if I could hear this, then I am sure the intelligence agencies also picked it up and if they have picked it up, they would have passed it on to the people who matter," he said.

Expressing concern about locals joining various terror groups, he said this is an issue that the government and political parties should be concerned about.

I am not privy to statistics, I don't know the numbers but from my own colleagues, I do understand that this trend continues and it is not a trend limited to a particular area, we hear these reports from south, central and north Kashmir; he said.

"It is something that should concern us and again it is for the government to create the necessary conditions that these youngsters do not get attracted to the idea of picking up a gun," he added.

Abdullah recalled the statement of Prime Minister Narendra Modi on June 24 this year of removing dil ki doori and Dilli ki doori (removing distance between hearts and between Delhi and Srinagar) and suggested, "If we take some concrete steps in this direction, even this move towards joining militant tanzeems, I think we will be able to reduce it to a great extent. We may not be able to eradicate it but we will be able to reduce it".

Abdullah, however, cautioned against detaining people across the valley and said, "We need to be very careful not to get into knee-jerk reactions. Reactions for the sake of reacting, just because we have to show something, we do this."

"I am sure that I don't doubt that perhaps these 400 plus people have some sort of dossier with the government, for whatever reason -- whether they were involved in stone pelting, linked to proscribed organisations. The fact is, are they directly connected to this attack or is there any linkage between them and this attack?"

"If there is, by all means proceed and file charges and let the courts decide about the guilt but this sort of random and wanton sort of arrest, it doesn't help the situation and in fact anything it makes the situation worse," Abdullah said while replying to a question about the recent crackdown by police in Kashmir and detaining over 400 people.

He said the government needs to be very careful and should not be seen to be carrying out activities with a view to take revenge. Instead, it should be seen as an organisation or as an "entity that delivers justice by all means," he said.

Abdullah, who was the chief minister of the erstwhile state for six years between 2009-14, had been able to clear central and north Kashmir of terrorists and their supporters.

Asked whether he was disheartened that the place has been infested by terrorists again, he said: "Disheartened will perhaps be a strong term, disappointed and concerned yes because we know militants are moving around in areas that have been free of militancy."

"Srinagar city was completely cleared of militancy. Same is true for Ganderbal and Budgam districts. It is disappointing but again the government needs to take a long hard look at why these areas have been occupied again and then see what corrective measures the government needs to take. The corrective measures that are not at the cost of everybody, they know they have to be very careful how they go about their activities," he said.

Abdullah asserted that the situation in Afghanistan would have no impact on the security situation in Kashmir other than the distinct possibility that it may act as a morale booster for terror groups operating in the Union Territory.

"In politics there are no permanent friends, no permanent interests, and no permanent enemy's just permanent interests," Omar Abdullah told Karan Thapar in an interview for national channel.

He said, "It clearly did not serve their interest to be associated with the National conference any longer. They are not the first people to leave the National conference, they won't be the last, we have survived many departures, we will continue to survive the departures," he said.

"He said more than a setback for his party, the National Conference; this was a personal loss for him. "Because I have invested a lot in my relationship particularly with Devendra. For years now I have been shielding Devendra Singh and to an extent salathia from the sort of conspiracies in the party," he said.

Omar Abdullah looked visibly upset and emotional and took his time before he answered about the resignation of Devendra Singh Rana.

The association with Devender Singh Rana goes back, as he put it, two decades and more.

The Minister said, India is willing to participate in this programme provided some of the concerns on issues related to IPR Sharing, scope of the joint call, Signing of Model Grant Agreement and Joint Evaluation are addressed at the satisfaction of both the sides.

Dr Jitendra noted with satisfaction that India is closely collaborating with the European Union in the mission innovation programme which is currently led by EU. He said, India is closely involved in shaping up Mission Innovation 2.0 where focus will be on development of time bound missions with clear deliverables and resource commitment. At the same time India is engaged in development of platforms for

organised ways to cheat/defraud gullible citizens.

The typical mode of operation in such cases usually includes that these fraudsters withdraw money from accounts of victims and transfer it to bank accounts based in different parts of country and ultimately withdraw it. But a very unusual modus operandi was found wherein Kashmir-based bank accounts were found involved in this incident. The two arrested accused were found to have created dozens of local bank accounts fraudulently and provided the same along with their ATM Cards to co-accused located outside J&K. Most of the bank accounts have been created in the name of destitute women from South Kashmir and Srinagar, who have been provided some monetary benefits by arrested persons. Moreover, Cyber Police Kashmir also recovered 7 Mobile Phones, 13 Sim Cards, 47 ATM Debit/Credit cards of different banks, 36 FINO Bank account Kit books, 4 Cheese Books, 6 blank cheques, 7 Passbooks and other documents from their possession.

Rs 21,800 fine recovered from SoPs violators in Ramban

RAMBAN: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Wednesday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 21,800 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 59,18,750.

The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC. District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh informed that as many as 1,995 persons were administered first and second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district on Wednesday.

As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Farzed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1,485 samples including 351 RT-PCR and 1,134 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 1,995 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

5 narco smugglers arrested with heroin

KATHUA/SAMBA: Police on Wednesday arrested five narco smugglers in separate actions and recovered heroin from their possession.

As per details, a team of Police Station Hiranagar led by Insp Anil Kumar Sharma SHO Hiranagar under supervision of SDPO Border Sachit Mahajan during Naka checking duty at NH Londi Morh noticed a Maruti Ciaz (JK08E-2492) moving from Jammu towards Kathua and signaled it to stop for checking. On thorough checking, a yellow polythene containing approximately 60 gm

Both sides agreed that IPR, data sharing and materials/equipment transfer would be done as per relevant provisions in India-EU S&T Agreement and principles and policies of IPR. A joint panel will be created to draft the IPR and data sharing mechanisms.

Excise sleuths destroy 35 lts illicit liquor, 300 Kg Lahan during raids

KATHUA: Excise Department destroyed 35 litres of illicit liquor including 162 pouches and 300 Kg Lahan during different raids carried out to arrest the menace of illicit distillation and sale of illicit liquor in Kathua Excise Range

On the directions of Excise Commissioner, Kishore Singh Chib and supervision of Deputy Excise Commissioner (Executive) Jammu, Kusum Sharma, a team of Excise Eradication/Enforcement Wing led by ETO, Eradication Narinder Singh Anthal, comprising Inspector Dr Anil Kumar Sharma, Sub Inspectors Mohd Salim, Kulbhushan Singh & Guards Karnail Singh and Shahbaaz Khan raided the Upper Saktaehak, Lower Saktaehak, Buddhi, Barnoti and other adjoining areas of Kathua to arrest menace of illicit distillation of liquor. In the process, 35 litres of illicit Liquor including 162 pouches and 300 Kg of Lahan was recovered by raiding team from state land & later destroyed on spot.



Cyber Police Kashmir busts KYC fraud gang

STATE TIMES NEWS SRINAGAR: Cyber Police Station Kashmir Zone, Srinagar was receiving multiple complaints regarding KYC frauds wherein victims were receiving unsolicited communications in form of calls and SMS, urging them to call on some provided numbers for updating their KYC. Thereafter, the victims are asked to share certain personal details, account/login details/card information, PIN, OTP; installing some unauthorized /unverified application through links provided in the communication. Such communications have also been reported to include threats of bank account freezing, blocking or closure. When victims share information over a call/message or access unauthorised application, fraudsters gain access to customers' bank accounts and defraud them. Cyber Police Kashmir also learnt that the messages are sent out to people for updating their KYC on their mobiles. The messages sent to victims are in format as Dear xyz, your SIM card KYC documents will expire soon. Please call on 9xxxxxxx9 our JIO customer care team. Service will be stopped within 24 hours. Thanks. When the complainants call on these numbers, the cyber criminals pose as representatives of leading telecom companies and ask callers to recharge by very small amounts like Rs 10, 15 etc through mobile apps.

The fraudsters make victims to download remote access applications like 'Anydesk, Quick Support or Team viewer' and then make them to provide their personal and financial details. When unaware victims follow their directions and make recharge payment, they receive messages related to withdrawal of money from their bank accounts. Huge amounts have been siphoned by the Cyber Criminals in Kashmir valley through these frauds.

On receiving such complaints, Cyber Police Kashmir registered FIR No. 19/2021 and started investigations. During the course of investigation, Cyber Police Kashmir Zone Srinagar tracked down two persons involved in such crimes who were arrested from a rented accommodation at New Theed Harwan area of Srinagar. They were identified as Mohammad Hanzala Beigh, son of Mohd Shafi, resident of Court Road Vailoo, Kokernag and Mohammad Rajab Khan, son of Ali Mohammad, resident of Wairad, Kokernag. During preliminary investigation, it came to fore that for illegal monetary gains, the accused persons in connivance with non-local cyber criminals operating from UP, Bihar and other states in
