HC quashes defamation proceedings against Editor Republic TV & ors

JAMMU: The Jammu & Kashmir High Court today quashed Criminal Defamation Proceedings against Editor Republic TV and Ors. The petitioners have challenged the complaint filed by the respondent against them before the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Srinagar, alleging commission of offences under Section 499 and 500 RPC, as also the order dated 27.12.2018 passed by the said Magistrate whereby cognizance of the offences has been taken and process has been issued against the petitioners. They have also challenged order dated 23rd February, 2019 passed by learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Srinagar, whereby bail-able warrants for securing attendance of the petitioners have been issued. Petitioner No.3 happens to be the Editor-in-Chief of the news channels Republic TV and Republic Bharat/R. Bharat and Managing Director of

ARG Outlier Media Asianet News Pvt. Ltd whereas petitioners No.1, 2 and 4 are associated with the aforesaid news channels. Justice Sanjay Dhar while allowing the petition, quashed the complaint titled "Naeem Akhter v. Arnab Goswami & others" pending before the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Srinagar, and the proceedings emanating therefrom. Justice Sanjay Dhar while allowing the petition quoted two quotes "Those who fill a public position must not be too thin skinned in reference to comments made upon them. It would often happen that observations would be made upon public men which they know from the bottom of their hearts were under served and unjust; yet they must bear with them and submit to be misunderstood for a time and "Whoever fills a public position renders himself open thereto. He must accept an attack as a necessary, though unpleasant, appendage to his office."

DB quashes order of Trial Court, directs CIK to give protected witness statement of Parra

JAMMU: In a much publicized case in which Waheed-ur-Rehman Parra, a senior PDP leader and close aide of former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti, based on a police charge sheet claiming that he was an asset for Pakistan-based terror groups and that his 13-year journey as a journalist and politician from 2007, was a "saga of subterfuge, deceit and double-dealing" Trial Court directed CIK to give statements of protected witness. Against the order of Trial Court CIK filed present petition. A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir High Court comprising Chief Justice Pankaj Mithal and Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul allowed the appeal and set-aside the order of the Trial Court. DB observed that in the present case, once

the Trial Court, while passing order dated 1st June 2021, allowed application of prosecution/apellant, declaring the witnesses (A-1 to A-5) as protected witnesses, keeping them and their statements in a sealed cover; it cannot now by impugned order dated 11th September 2021 revisit and review its own orders, and pass such an order, which exposes the protected witnesses to vulnerability. Impugned order has been even passed oblivious to the Order dated 1st June 2021, requiring and warranting it to be interfered with by allowing the instant Appeal. The submission of learned senior counsel appearing for respondent that impugned order is an interlocutory, has no substance as in terms of impugned order, as stated above, the Trial Court has finally decided an application which, in essence and core, has reviewed its earlier order and has exposed the protected witnesses to susceptibility.

D&FCO disallows operation of 26 erring establishments

JAMMU: Drugs & Food Control Organization (D&FCO) (Retail/Wholesale) on Wednesday disallowed operation of Twenty Six Sale Establishments for violation of Drugs & Cosmetics Act, 1940. The sleuths of the Drugs & Food Control Organisation carried out surprise checking of Drug sales establishments (Retail/Wholesale) under the supervision of respective Assistant Drugs Controller in Jammu Province under the overall supervision of Lotika Khajuria, State Drugs Controller. "During the drive, operations of Twenty Six Sale Establishments were disallowed u/s 22 (d) of Drugs & Cosmetics Act, 1940 on spot which included six in Jammu, four in Doda, three each in R.S Pura, Ramban and Rajouri, two each in Samba, Kishtwar and Kathua Districts and one

in Poonch District for violation of conditions of the licenses. The licenses were warned of severe action in case the deficiencies are not removed within the stipulated period of time" a handout issued by the Organisation stated. Statutory samples of more than one hundred fifty drug formulations viz Antibiotics, PPI, Steroid, NSAIDs etc, were lifted from public institutions & private firms particularly situated in far flung areas and government institutions for determination of strength and purity. These samples were referred to Drug Testing Laboratories located within & outside the U.T of J&K for framing legal opinion to ascertain their quality parameters. Moreover, the Department has broadened its scope in the other fields and initiated a special exercise wherein statutory samples of cos-

metics and medical devices were also lifted and have been dispatched to the notified laboratories outside the U.T of J&K to ensure their quality parameters. Stocks of Drugs worth Rs 10,672 that were found to be contravening the provisions of Drugs & Cosmetics Act were also confiscated from the supply chain by the Regulatory Officers of the Organisation under the relevant provisions of the Drugs & Cosmetics Act. Meanwhile, a court case that was under trial before the Court of CJM, Reasi has been decided by the Court and the accused was fined a sum of Rs 10,000 and imprisonment till rising of Court. The State Drug Controller has impressed upon the trade fraternity to follow the conditions of licenses in letter and spirit failing which the department shall be constrained to initiate action against the defaulters.

JK High Court sets aside order of Trial court

JAMMU: Justice Rajnesh Oswal, Judge of High Court of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh on Wednesday set aside the order of Trial Court (Session Judge, Rajouri) dated December 2, 2020 in a case FIR 107/2020 under Sections 8,21,22,25,27-A and 29 of Narcotic Drugs Psychotropic Substance Act 1985 registered against Mohd Rafiq for having Rs 5 lakh with approximately

4 grams of Heroin like substance. The High Court Judge remanded back the case for deciding the same afresh. Monish Chopra, the Counsel for the petitioner vehemently argued that a bare perusal of the Challan as well as evidence collected by the IO reveal that there is absolutely no evidence on record with regard to the commission of the offence under these sections. Bhann Jasrotia, GA appearing for the

respondent also argued that the learned trial court after hearing the arguments of the parties had framed the charges and there is no illegality in the order impugned. The High Court Judge held that a person to be charged for commission of a particular offence, the material relied upon by the prosecution must be of such nature that can be translated into evidence. As the learned trial court has not

returned any findings with regard to the contentions raised by the petitioner so this court does not deem it proper to consider the same in the revision and leave the same to be considered by the trial court. The court has thus ordered that the impugned order dated 02-12-2020 is set aside and the matter is remanded back to the trial court to decide the same afresh after affording opportunity of being heard to both the parties.

Fake Job Scam: CBK registers case against Sr Assistant in AG Office

SRINAGAR: Crime Branch Kashmir on Wednesday registered a case FIR against Sr. Assistant in Advocate General J&K office in fake recruitment scam. According to a statement to GNS by the Crime Branch, the accused Mohammad Yaqoob Bhat son of Gulam Ahmad Bhat of Budgam has been arrested in connection with case (FIR No. 56 of 2021 U/S 420 467,468,471, 120(B) r/w Section 66 IT Act), today on 13 October 2021. "The FIR has been regis-

tered after receipt of a communication from Z. A. Dewani, (Administrative Officer, Office of the Advocate General, J&K) alleging therein that fake orders bearing No's 76 AG of 2021 and 79 AG of 2021 dated 13.07.2021 are being circulated on social media showing the selection of 33 persons as Jr. Assistants and other 33 persons as Orderlies," the Crime Branch said. However, no such orders have been issued by the office of the Advocate General, J&K. "Accordingly an enquiry

was initiated at CBK and during the probe, it came to fore that some touts have conspired with Mohammad Yaqoob Bhat, (Sr. Assistant) posted in the office of the Advocate General, J&K who have lured the candidates on the fake promise of providing jobs," the CBK said, adding, "During probe it also surfaced that some beneficiaries have transferred huge amount of money in the account maintained in the name of Mohammad Yaqoob Bhat," the CBK said, adding, "The investigation of the case is going on and the involvement of other officials and individuals is being looked into."
