

Union Power Minister visits Gurez

BANDIPORA: Union Minister for Power and New and Renewable Energy R K Singh on Friday visited Gurez where he visited the Dam Site of Kishenganga Hydroelectric Power Project (KGHEPP) in Gurez valley of Bandipora district and took stock of the working of the power project. The Minister is on a two day visit to the Union Territory as part of the Central Government's Public Outreach Initiative.

He was accompanied by Principal Secretary, PDD, J&K, Rohit Kansal, NHPC CMD Abhay Kumar Singh and Union Additional Secretary Power S K G Rahate.

On the arrival at the dam site in Gurez, the Minister was presented guard of honour by the CISF personnel who are guarding the dam site.

During his visit to the 330MW KGHEPP, the Minister reviewed the genera-

tion capacity of the project besides assessing its other relevant aspects. He interacted with the officers who apprised the minister about the power generation capacity, working, implementation of CSR and other related issues.

Talking on the occasion, the Minister said that the Central Government is committed to improving the power scenario of Jammu and Kashmir as the development of the place is high on the agenda of the Prime Minister.

He said a lot of schemes have been introduced to improve the overall efficiency of the power sector in Jammu and Kashmir and they have set a target to provide electricity connection to every household in the Union Territory.

Union Minister said the government has taken commendable initiatives to harness hydroelectric power generation in J&K.

He said the KGHEPP has helped in uplifting the socio-economic conditions of the people as it offered jobs to a number of local people besides helping in resolving power crisis of the UT.

Later the minister held a public interaction programme wherein the people apprised him about various public issues. The locals raised the demands with regard to absence of regular power supply in the Gurez valley, pending compensation, implementation of CSR and other related issues.

The Minister gave patient hearing to the delegations and assured positive response from the government with regard to their demands.

Deputy Commissioner Bandipora Dr Owais Ahmad, District Development Council member Tasleena Begum and SDM Gurez besides other senior officers and officials were also present on the occasion.

"Sardar Patel had said that we should not let castes and religious faith become a hindrance for us. We are all sons and daughters of India and we all should love our country. We all should love each other. People of Gujarat always believed in strengthening Sardar Patel's teachings."

"Nation First" is the motto of Sardar Patel's children," Modi said. The prime minister also recalled the contribution of several prominent reformers and educationists from Gujarat, including Chaganbha of north Gujarat and Bhai Kaka of the Charotar

region.

He also spoke about Sankalchand Patel, Ganpat Patel, Mohan Lalji Patel and Karshan Virani.

He gave the credit to some of the initiatives started during his tenure as chief minister for improvement on the education front and a dip in the school drop-out ratio among girl students.

"There was a time when Gujarat did not have good quality schools and teachers. With the blessings of Maa Umiya and Maa Khodal (deities of the Patidar community), we included people in the movement and launched initiatives like

Praveshotsav and Gunotsav," Modi said.

As lack of toilets at schools was leading to girls dropping out, these facilities were provided and as a result the number of girls leaving schools midway significantly decreased, he said.

While Mahatma Gandhi had the dream of creating a society which followed the ideals of 'Ram Rajya', people of Gujarat were walking on that path and strengthening those principles, the prime minister said.

Modi also lauded the new Gujarat chief minister Bhupendra Patel, saying though he speaks less, one can not find any flaw in his work. Patel has been in public life for over 25 years and had started out as a councillor of a municipality, the prime minister noted.

He also mentioned that he was addressing the people of the state for the first time after Patel took over as CM in September.

In the first phase of the project undertaken by the

Saurashtra Patel Seva Samaj near Valak village, a hostel for 1,000 male students of the Patidar community will be built. In the second phase, another hostel having the capacity to accommodate 500 girl students will be constructed.

Kanji Bhalala, president of the trust, said the boys' hostel will also have a large auditorium, a digital gallery showcasing the history of the Patidar community and its leaders and a library which can be accessed by students of all castes.

There would be a 31-foot statue of Sardar Patel on campus, while a statue of Patel's daughter Maniben will be installed on the campus of the girls' hostel.

The boys' hostel will mostly cater to students who are preparing for professional courses such as Chartered Accountant and competitive exams such as UPSC. While a nominal fee will be charged to boys, the trust will not charge anything to girl students, Bhalala added.

PIL in SC seeks direction to Centre to come out with steps to deal with hate speech

NEW DELHI: A plea has been filed in the Supreme Court seeking a direction to the Centre to examine various international laws and come out with "effective and stringent" measures to control hate speech and rumour mongering in the country. The PIL, which may come up for hearing before the apex court after the Dussehra vacation, has also sought a direction to the Centre to take legislative steps to implement recommendations of the Law Commission to deal with the menace of hate speech and rumour mongering.

The plea, filed by lawyer and BJP leader Ashwini Upadhyay in his personal capacity through advocate Ashwani Dubey, has made the ministries of home affairs, and law and justice and the Law Commission of India as parties. "The petitioner is filing this writ petition as a PIL... seeking writ/order/direction to the Centre to examine the international laws relating to 'hate speech' and 'rumour mongering' and take appropriate effective stringent steps to control 'hate speech' and 'rumour mongering' in order to secure rule of law, freedom of speech and expression and Right to Life, Liberty and Dignity of citizens," the plea said.

It further sought a direction that the courts, while awarding punishment for the offences against "public tranquillity, offences relating to elections etc", shall pronounce sentences running consecutively and not concurrently.

It urged that the government be asked to take appropriate steps to implement recommendations of Law Commission Report-267 on hate speech.

"The injury to the citizens is extremely large because 'hate speech and rumour mongering' has the potential of provoking individuals or society to commit acts of terrorism, genocides, ethnic cleansing etc. Hate speech is considered outside the realm of protective discourse.

"Indisputably, offensive speech and rumour mongering have devastating effects on people's lives and risks their health and safety. Hate speech is harmful and divisive for communities and hampers social progress. If left unchecked, hate speech can severely affect not only the rule of law but also the right to life, liberty and dignity of the citizens," it said.

The plea referred to incidents and termed them as "classic examples" of hate speech and rumour mongering.

In 2012, around 50,000 citizens from northeastern states moved from their residences across India and rushed to their native places after "circulation of false images of violent incidents that took place not in India but in Myanmar several years ago", it said.
