

Chairman UGC meets Dr Jitendra, discusses NEP implementation in J&K

NEW DELHI: Chairman, University Grants Commission (UGC), Prof D P Singh on Saturday met Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh and discussed the New Education Policy (NEP) implementation in Jammu & Kashmir.

Dr Jitendra said, the New Education Policy was long-awaited and credit goes to Prime Minister Narendra Modi for taking the initiative to replace the 34 years old education system which, in the years to come, will prove a major move in the direction of strengthening India as a

global power.

In the context of a peripheral territory like Jammu & Kashmir, said Dr Jitendra Singh, the New Education Policy had a special relevance because it provides for holistic, multi-disciplinary and broad based education with flexible study plans and focus on vocational education.

This will certainly help smaller or far-flung States

and Union Territories like J&K and Northeast to streamline their education system and become a part of uniform mainstream as well as that of the current global trends, he added.

Jammu & Kashmir has two Central Universities and other J&K UT Universities. After the introduction of the New Education Policy, there will be more flexibility in the

existing post-graduation with authorized certification, undergraduates will have the option to choose the number of years, as per the requirement ranging from 1 to 4 years with appropriate certification. For example, certificate after one year, advanced diploma after 2 years, license after 3 years and research license after 4 years.

This will enable stu-

dents from different socio-economic strata to pursue their education as per their requirements and circumstances without being at any disadvantage which they might have faced while pursuing the earlier graduation and diploma courses.

Prof D P Singh informed the Minister that the New Education Policy will possibly get implemented in the next academic year. He further informed that all types of occupation and education training will be fundamental part of the higher education system in order to strengthen the base of the students for different professional pursuits. This might also help in bringing ease in seeking jobs of different nature, he said.

The emphasis will be on 2021 century key skills and flexibility in choosing the subject, he added.

People of J&K continue getting shocker of their lifetime under BJP rule: Bhalla

JAMMU: JKPCC Vice President and former Minister, Raman Bhalla on Saturday claimed that Jammu region has suffered unprecedented bias and prejudice under present BJP regime and robbing the Dogra land of is due and legitimate share its multifarious sectors and observed that Union Govt should not delay in restoring Statehood to J&K.

JAMMU: Directorate of Ayush, Health & Medical Education Department J&K in collaboration with Department of Tourism, J&K and District Administration of Anantnag, Baramulla, Udhampur, Rajouri and Reasi on Saturday inaugurated five specialized Wellness Centres of AYUSH at Phalagan, Gulmarg in Kashmir Division and Patnitop, Shadara Sharief (Rajouri) and Katra in Jammu Division to promote AYUSH based holistic wellness in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir.

The establishment of these specialized Wellness Centres of AYUSH was decided in a high level meeting chaired by Vivek Bhardwaj, Additional Chief Secretary, Health & Medical Education Department on October 11, 2021 which was attended by Deputy Commissioners of Baramulla, Anantnag, Udhampur, Rajouri & Reasi, Director Ayush, J&K, Chief Executive Officers of respective Tourism Development authorities and District Ayush officers of the respective Districts.

In the meeting it was decided that J&K Tourism Development Corporation shall provide accommodation to establish these Centres at Gulmarg and Pahalgam, whereas Chief Medical Officer Udhampur shall provide space in the shrine premises at Patnitop, Shadara Sharief (Rajouri) and Katra in Jammu Division to promote AYUSH based holistic wellness in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir.

Regarding Katra old CHC building will be allotted to Directorate of Ayush for establishment of the aforesaid Centre and Shadara Sharief Shrine authority will provide space in the shrine premises to establish the said centre.

Vivek Bhardwaj in his message advised the Directorate of Ayush, and respective Tourism Development authorities to have networking with the local hoteliers under the guidance of respective District Development Commissioner

for generating awareness amongst the visiting tourists regarding availability of specialized Ayush interventions like Yogic Asans, Pranayams and meditation for lifestyle disorders, Panchkarma/Hijama for musculo-skeletal diseases and provision of Ayush immuno-modulator and support medicines in these centres.

Rattan Lal Gupta elected NC's provincial president for Jammu

JAMMU: Former MLC Rattan Lal Gupta was elected the National Conference provincial president for Jammu on Saturday, nearly a week after being nominated to the post following the resignation of his predecessor Devender Singh Rana.

On Rana and former minister S S Slathia quitting the party and joining the BJP in Delhi on October 11, Gupta said

Every section of the society, including youth, businessmen and industrialists, are suffering immensely, and nobody is happy with the present administration," the senior NC leader said. "We will follow the guidelines of the party leadership and reach out to the masses at their doorsteps to provide assistance. The National Conference is like a fortress, and our activists will fight tooth and nail in the upcoming elections," Gupta said.

He exuded confidence that the National Conference would fight the upcoming assembly elections on every seat across the Jammu region and emerge victorious. The NC is the only party with a strong

presence in Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh, and it has never indulged in the politics of discrimination, he said, adding, "Our governments in the past have always ensured balanced development of all the three regions." "The bifurcation of the erstwhile J-K state was not a good step. After going through all the issues, she will take up the issues and demands at the concerned quarters and will ensure that no one will remain deprived of the justice and hailed the role of the chamber for ensuring continuous business and trade activity in Jammu despite many challenges. She assured to take up the matter of Gandhi Nagar residents on priority and will ensure that justice may prevail. National Conference a sinking ship: Sunil Sethi

JAMMU: The recent political developments in J&K involving National Conference, when its mainstay and most prominent leaders not only of Jammu Province but also of Kashmiri youth have deserted the party, are reflective of dwindling political position of party in Union Territory particularly in anticipated first assembly elections. It short, presently National Conference is a sinking ship. It was stated by Sunil Sethi, Chief Spokesperson, Jammu & Kashmir Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), in a press statement issued here on Saturday.

Sethi further said that National Conference received a big jolt in Jammu region with its Provincial President Davinder Rana and another senior leader Surajit Slathia decided to leave NC to join Bharatiya Janata Party at the call of their conscious and because of fact that National Conference has always done injustice to people of Jammu region and politics of proliferation and exploitation on regional discrimination. "Rana and Slathia noted at the time of their joining Bharatiya Janata Party that they want to work for betterment of Jammu region and for ensuring equality to all regions, for which the only appropriate political party is Bharatiya Janata Party. Their feeling suffocated in National Conference is clear indicative of policies of NC, which are not allowing voices from Jammu region particularly from Hindu leadership to get strengthened," he added.

The BJP Chief Spokesperson further said that joining of two prominent leaders will lead to joining of many other leaders in Bharatiya Janata Party in coming time, who are getting suffocated in their parties with no opportunity to espouse cause of Jammu region.

The Chief Spokesperson further noted that the trend is not only being witnessed in Jammu but also in Kashmir with son of tallest Kashmiri leader of National Conference, A R Rather joining People's Conference. "It clearly shows that National Conference is a house divided with no attribute of internal democracy, which led to it falling apart like proverbial 'House of Cards' and in coming elections, will be uprooted politically by voters. New political realism has set in 'New Peaceful Jammu & Kashmir' where people and leaders also are refusing to be a part of decadent practices of political blackmailing. New era has led to new real politics where there is no room for politics of division and hatred as propagated by parties like National Conference and People Democratic Party," he maintained.

J&K facing unemployment rate of 21.6 pc-highest in country

J&K has jumped from over 13 per cent in August 2021 to 21.6 percent in September 2021. As per official data, J&K is the only region in country with over 20 per cent unemployment rate. Other States, following J&K in terms of highest unemployment rate are Haryana, Delhi, Rajasthan, Tripura where unemployment rate is above 15 per cent.

Besides these official figures, there are other data sources which indicate severity of unemployment in J&K. When Government scrapped Article 370 in Jammu & Kashmir on August 5 2019, one of its promises was providing India's overall unemployment rate at 6.9 per cent which means J&K has much higher unemployment rate than the national average. According to CMIE data, the unemployment rate in

(MOSPI), the combined unemployment rate of J&K and Ladakh hit the highest 17.8 per cent in October-December of 2020, against national average of 7.11 percent. The government departments remained the highest employers in UT in absence of a flourishing industrial as well as corporate sector.

However, Lieutenant Governor, Manoj Sinha has said that there is expectation regarding creation of five lakh jobs, as UT is all set to receive Rs 25,000-30,000 cr of private investments. In Feb 2021, LG Manoj Sinha also cleared that administration is very concerned about current unemployment data in Jammu and Kashmir and focusing on providing job opportunities to 80 per cent of young population within next five years.
