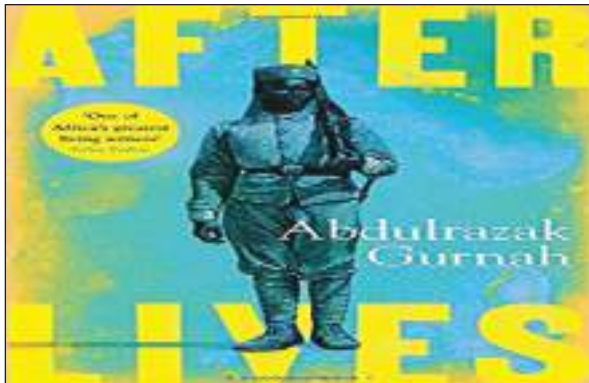
**REVIEW:** The film is stylish and fun, thanks to the twists and the unexpected humour; it is not often that we are prompted to burst out laughing when the gun is pointed at the protagonist and he bumbles and begs to be let off. Prithviraj delivers in the tricky role with his usual flair, evoking the right amounts of sympathy or even the opposite for his character. Unni Mukundan seems a bit reticent and diffident in his role, while raising some laughs.

Raashi Khanna and Ananya are passable. Shankar as a yesteryear actor is sure to evoke smiles. But it is Mamta Mohandas who steals the scene, fitting perfectly into the difficult character of Simi. It is tempting to make a comparison with Tabu who did the role in the original version, and Mamta can take a bow for her portrayal, which she makes entertaining and well-rounded with understated drama. It is also good to see female characters, with various shades of grey and even slightly over the top, assimilate without awkwardness into our films. Bhramam keeps the audience interested through its 152-minute run and is definitely a novel experience for the Malayali audience.

## BOOK REVIEW

### Afterlives

**Review:** After having written nine awe-inspiring books, Nobel Literature laureate Abdulrazak Gurnah's latest novel 'Afterlives' was published in October 2020. And exactly a year later, he has won the 2021 Nobel Prize in Literature. 'Afterlives' is an addition to the glorious archive of African Literature that was created by Chinua Achebe, Chimamanda Adichie and other notable authors. Post-colonialism, immigration, refugees and racism continue to be the dominant themes in Gurnah's books and 'After Lives' takes after its precedents in every way.

Set amidst the colonial conflict of Africa, where Germans, British, Belgians and the French are struggling for control, 'Afterlives' is the story of Ilyas and Hamza. Ilyas is a young man who was stolen from his parents by German troops. Hamza, on the other hand, was sold and has been brought up under the protection of an officer who now lays full claim over him. After getting done with the war, Hamza returns home to the same place where Ilyas lived and is now in search of a job, security and love-- in Ilyas' sister Afiya, who was given away by their parents. The book captures one of the most prominent consequences of the imminent First World War and colonization -the life and struggles of African citizens who were stolen or bought to fight for Europe.

The book has been widely acclaimed for its depiction of a prominent but rarely explored theme of the lives of soldiers who fight for the colonizer. Do add this book to your reading list if you wish to pick a novel written by this year's winner of the prestigious Nobel Prize in Literature.

## Interesting ideas on how to style your corner



without eating into the square footage area. Create an art nook or gallery with an asymmetric display. You can paint the wall in a swoon-worthy backdrop and make it the focal point for your statement pieces.

**Tip:** Cramped corner with no windows? Hang a mirror to create the illusion of space.

**Convert it into a workstation**

Bring in a sleek floating or folding desk to convert an empty corner into a functional zone. If space permits, go for a mid-century or classic desk that evokes a sense of calm and imbues elegance. Complete the look with a table lamp or pendant light for illumination.

We all have that one corner in our home that looks dull and boring compared to other parts of the house. Compared to the rest of your home, corners get much less attention and decor that can make the entire look quite haphazard. It's not uncommon to forget to design the corner decor but it's never too late to put some pretty decor in the nooks. Rachna Agarwal, Founder and Design Ideator, Studio IAAD, has some pretty interesting ideas on how to transform your mundane corner into a chic, new space.

**Provide a biophilic touch**

A hint of verdant energises a dull nook and makes one feel closer to nature. Add some subtle touches like stone tiling or even water features to create the feel of an outdoor spot. Opt for tall plants with large sprigs of green or multiple smaller ones on the shelves. Arranging plants at varying heights add dimension to the display.

**Tip:** Shun that air purifier and look for indoor plants that help purify the air like Aloe Vera, Peace Lily, etc.

**Set up storage**

Think squeezing storage into a super-small corner seems impossible? A tiny vanity, cabinet, or console punctuates a boring nook with oodles of colour and enhances functionality. Wall-mounted cubby storage can transform a tight corner into a fully functional cabinet for mail, books, and small items.

**Tip:** Layer it with some teletchke or a wall mirror to create a vignette.

**Bring in a piece de resistance**

A unique artwork, painting or even a sculpture can spruce up the aesthetics of a corner and make a stylish statement



**Tip:** Squeeze in a petite chair to accentuate the functionality of your workstation.

**Message corner**

Miss messages or forgetting chores? Set up a small message corner with a chalkboard or regular board for sticky notes. Bring in drawers for necessities like pens, paper, scissors and other accessories.

**Tip:** A vintage telephone lends character to the decor.

**Build a window nook**

A custom window nook not only offers extra seating it also gives more dimension to awkward corners. Window nooks serve as a great spot to dine with friends or cuddle up with a book. The light streaming in also induces a happy mood to brighten the ambience of your home.

**Tip:** Throw in some colourful cushions or curtains for a warm and inviting vibe.
