

Maiden meeting of Poplar Commission held

SRINAGAR: The "Poplar Commission" recently constituted by the government on Sunday held its maiden meeting here under the chairmanship of Principal Chief Conservator Forests (HoFF), Dr. Mohit Gera.

Pertinently, the Commission has been constituted to advise on introduction, cultivation, utilization and regulation of poplars as well as formulation of policy on Poplar cultivation in Jammu and Kashmir. The first of its kind in the country, the Commission is being chaired by PCCF and Head of Forest Force with members and experts from Forest Department, Social Forestry Department, SKUAST and allied fields including representatives from Wood Based Industry, poplar growing farmers and nursery growers.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Mohit Gera informed that as the Poplar cultivation is well suited to the climate and ecology of Jammu and Kashmir, there is a huge potential of increasing the scale of its planting and utilization. He informed about the import of wood to the tune of Rs. 500 crore in J&K saying that promotion of Wood Based Industry can substitute for this import as well as value added products could be made for export from J&K. This will create employment opportunities and enhance the GDP of the U.T, he added.

He said that growing of wood and making of wood-based products is being promoted all across the world as wood is seen as carbon neutral and environmentally friendly option compared to other materials like steel and cement. J&K is blessed with abundant resources and scope to promote more production of wood as well use of more wood for sustainable development, he added.

The Commission focused on important issues on improving the quality of planting stock of Poplar, cultivation techniques, improving new fast-growing varieties, varied requirement of the industry as well as the problems being faced by the farmers, nursery growers in cultivation as well as issues on marketing of Poplar wood. Worried about Biharis getting killed in J&K, Nitish dials Manoj Sinha

PATNA: Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on Sunday called up Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha and expressed concern over the recent killings of people from the eastern state in terrorist strikes.

Kumar spoke to Sinha over telephone upon learning about the death of Raja Rishidev and Yogendra Rishidev in Anantnag, which came a day after Arvind Kumar Sah was gunned down in Srinagar.

The chief minister has announced an ex-gratia of Rs 2 lakh for the next of kin of all the three deceased, and issued instructions to the departments of labour and social welfare to ensure that benefits under relevant schemes reach the bereaved families.

Meanwhile, the BJP has requested a hike in the quantum of ex-gratia, stating that the amount was far lower than even what is being given to victims of accidents and natural disasters in the state.

The party's OBC Moreha national general secretary and state spokesman Nikhil Anand said in a statement, "The Jihadis are fighting their last battle and carrying out dastardly attacks out of desperation. They will be taught a lesson by our armed forces and the Narendra Modi government at the Centre."

It is, however, requested that the Bihar government consider raising the ex-gratia. The sum of Rs two lakh is just half of Rs four lakh paid to victims of accidents and natural disasters. We must help members of the bereaved families, which belong to the backward classes and have lost their breadwinners, he said.

The deceased men from Bihar were a symbol of the resilience characteristic of the land and its people, Anand added. The BJP is the senior partner in the ruling NDA in the state.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MINORITY SCHOLARSHIP: 2021-22 (Pre-Matric, Post-Matric and Merit-cum-Means)

The Ministry of Minority Affairs implements three Scholarship Schemes viz. Pre-Matric, Post-Matric and Merit-cum-Means based Scholarship Schemes for the Minorities as Central Sector Schemes through National Scholarship Portal (NSP) of the Government of India and the students can apply under these schemes through URL www.scholarships.gov.in or through the link available on www.minorityaffairs.gov.in or through Mobile App- National Scholarships (NSP). Scholarships are awarded under these Schemes to the economically weaker and meritorious students from the six centrally notified minority communities viz. Buddhist, Christian, Jain, Muslim, Sikh and Zoroastrian (Parsis) pursuing studies in India in a Government or recognized private university/institute/college/school. The course being pursued should be Minimum one year duration. The applicant should have secured 50% marks in the last annual Class examination.

"All renewal applicants/ students, who have got scholarship during 2020-21, shall apply by giving their existing Application ID".

The Central Government has decided to open the National Scholarship Portal (NSP) on 18th August, 2021 for the three Scholarship Schemes for 2021-22 and detailed is as under:-

***Only Online applications under the Schemes will be accepted and no request for Offline applications will be entertained.**

All Universities/Institutes/Colleges/Schools, having valid AISHE/U-DISE/NCVT/SCVT codes, located in the UT should be advised to register themselves and their courses details on the NSP at the earliest so that their students can apply and they can verify such applications on the Portal within the timelines.

All Verification Authorities (INO/DNO) can mark an application fake if he/she is satisfied that the applicant is not a Bonafide student. In other circumstances, in case of non-fulfillment of eligibility criteria or inconsistency of records, the verifying authority may either reject the application or mark it defective with remarks and give the applicant another opportunity to correct their records.


It needs to be noted by all the INOs, DNOs that in case if any application is marked fake at L2 Level by the DNO then the entire bunch of applications from that School/Institute will go back to the respective INO login of that School/Institute for re-verification. Hence, the DNOs are advised to exercise caution while using the option of marking an application fake.

The facility of Aadhaar based demographic authentication of L-1 i.e. Institute Nodal Officer (INO) and L-2 i.e. District Nodal Officer (DNO) has been made mandatory prior to the verification of the applications by them for which the INOs/DNOs have to provide their Aadhaar number on NSP Portal.


A feature of Aadhaar demographic authentication based on beneficiary's/ student's name, gender and year of birth as given in Aadhaar has been introduced on NSP Portal.

KNOW THE FACTS AND ACT NOW

Symptoms

1. Headache
2. Eye pain (typically behind the eyes)
3. Muscle, joint, or bone pain
4. Rash
Nausea and vomiting
5. Unusual bleeding (nose or gum bleed, small red spots under the skin, or unusual bruising)

Do's

1. Empty and scrub, turn over, cover or throw out items that hold water, such as tyres, buckets, planters, birdbaths, flower pots or trash containers.
2. Use Mosquito repellents, even while indoors.
3. Use screens on windows and doors. Repair holes in screens to keep mosquitoes outside.
4. When outside at dawn, dusk, wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants tucked into socks.
5. Spray the House/ environs with Organophosphate or Pyrethroid Insecticides.

Don't's

1. Don't let water accumulate anywhere in your house or the surrounding areas.
2. Don't throw things like broken pots, cups, tyres etc. , where water gets accumulated during rains, in the open.
3. Don't wear clothes that expose your hands & legs.
4. Don't leave the water tanks kept on terraces & other places open. Fix the lid immediately if broken.
