board examinations for classes 10 and 12 will be conducted offline in November-

"The exams will be objective and the duration of the tests will be 90 minutes. The exams will start from 11.30 am instead of 10.30 am in view of the winter season. The exams for the minor subjects will be conducted by schools though the question paper will be provided by the board. All these minor subjects are not offered by all schools," Bhardwaj said.

"All schools will be sanitised before exam and effort will be made that students are not going far away. A large number of schools will be fixed as self centre only keeping in view the distance and the comfort. Efforts are to ensure there is minimum discomfort to parents and students," he added.

The plans by the board to split the session into two terms had come against the backdrop of the pandemic, which forced the cancellation of board exams for some subjects last year and a complete cancellation of the exams this year. The result was then announced on basis of alternative assessment schemes developed by the board.

"After the conduct of the term-1 exams, the results in the form of the marks scored will be declared. No student will be placed in the pass, compartment and essential repeat categories after the first term. The final results will be announced after the first and the second-term examinations," Bhardwaj said.

The examination controller further added that the second-term examination would be conducted in March-April, 2022 and whether it will be objective or subjective-type will depend on the Covid situation in the country.

"Every citizen is free to go to any corner of the country for work. The latest incident in which two labourers from Bihar were killed in J&K is quite serious as terrorists barged into the accommodation of the victims and fired on them. Their bodies are being brought back to Bihar," he said.

Sunday's was the third attack on non-local labourers in less than 24 hours. The deceased have been identified as Raja Rishidev and Joginder Rishidev, while Chunchun Rishidev was injured. Arvind Kumar Sah, a golgappa seller, was shot dead a few days ago.

"I hope that J&K authorities will now be alert and make adequate security arrangements to ensure that no one, especially migrant workers, is attacked there. They should obtain information about migrant workers and the place where they are residing," Kumar said. The Bihar government has announced an ex-gratia of Rs 2 lakh for the next of kin of the deceased, and issued instructions to the department of labour and social welfare to ensure that benefits under relevant schemes reach the bereaved families.

Meanwhile former Rihar chief minister Jitan Ram Manihi has also condemned killings and even targeted the prime minister and the union home minister. "I'm deeply upset because our Bihari brothers are being killed in Kashmir. If Prime Minister Modi and

Home Minister Amit Shah are unable to improve the situation in Kashmir, then they should leave it to us Biharis, we will turn things around in 15 days," said Manjhi in a tweet. The terror attacks have drawn strong condemnation from political parties across the spec

We were putting up in Awantipora area of south Kashmir's Pulwama. We used to work in paddy fields. We got our wages and left, he said, hoping to return next year.

Some labourers from Chhattisgarh working in brick kilns in Kakapora area of Pulwama alleged that it was not the fear of terrorists, but the highhandedness of the brick kiln owner which forced them to leave the Valley.

The brick kiln owner forced us to leave our rented accommodation on the pretext that he is not responsible if anything happens to us. He arranged a vehicle for us, but did not pay our wages for the past five months, Lok Chand said. He said they went to the local police station and lodged a complaint against the owner.

Police assured us that they will take up the matter with the brick kiln owner and ensure transfer of our money in our bank accounts, he said.

Meanwhile, anti-Pakistan protests continued for the second day in different parts of Jammu against the targeted killings.

The Union MoS e-inaugurated various projects of Public Works Departments( R&B) costing Rs 519.50 lakh, laid efoundation stones of different projects under JJM worth Rs 198.2 lakh. She also inaugurated Pasteurized Compost Unit under Trikuta Mushroom Corridor Project, Burmal coming up at the cost of Rs 46.94 lakh to boost Mushroom Production in the district.

The Union minister gave away farming equipment, tractors, thrashers, combined harvesters, laser levelers to farmers besides Ladli Beti passbooks, and adolescent kits to ICDS beneficiaries.

The Union MoS said the Union Government under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi is keen to uplift the agriculture community by providing financial as well as technologi-

cal support under various schemes run by the central government.

She said the government has infused Rs 1,31,000 cr to boost Agriculture and allied sectors with special emphasis on becoming export oriented economy as India has tremendous potential to satiate global demand. # PMDP projects: CS directs completion of various infrastructural works within stipulated timelines

SRINAGAR: The Chief Secretary, Dr. Arun Kumar Mehta on Monday chaired a high-level meeting to review the progress of PMDP projects in Jammu and Kashmir under execution in the different schemes of UT and Central governments. Administrative Secretaries of Health and Medical Education, Home, Housing &Urban. Agriculture Production and Farmers Welfare, Power Development, Public Works (R&B), Secretary PD&MD and other senior officers

attended the meeting. It was informed that the out of 53 PMDP projects, 21 projects have been completed while another 10 projects will be completed by the end of

the current fiscal year. It was further informed that the two lane Uri-LoC road with a road length of 17.25 km has been completed except for one bridge which will be completed by

July 2022. While reviewing the construction of Semi Ring Road, Srinagar the Chief Secretary directed the Public Works Department to explore the feasibility of constructing take off point at Pandach so that the issues of relocation of 199 shops and the land acquisition that may result due to the present alignment are effectively dealt with.

It was informed that the ongoing feasibility study for

Poonch-Uri road project followed by the DPR preparation, tendering and allotment of work is likely to be com-

pleted in next 3-4 months. It was further informed that while work on Tangmarg to Gulmarg road has been completed, the work on the remainder stretchBaramullah - Gulmarg road will be completed by December 2022. Dr Mehta directed the department to expedite the work on various packages on Jammu-Akhnoor road by liasoining with the army authorities wherever necessary so that the original timelines are adhered to.

It was noted that work on Chenani Sudhmahadev road is going on briskly and the geo-technical surveys of three tunnels on this road are being completed and once sanction to the construction of these tunnels is received, work will pick up pace. Dr Mehta directed the department to take steps, including coordinating with the law enforcement agencies, to ensure that Sinthan pass road may be kept in functional condition.

The department informed that work on Semi Ring Road Jammu and Semi Ring Road Srinagar will be completed by May 2022 and February 2024 respectively. While reviewing Udhampur-Ramban Road, the Chief Secretary directed that the 10 structures at Dalwas be

Dr Mehta while directing that 34 acres of private land on the AIIMS Kashmir campus should be immediately handed over to the executing authority, advised the department that it should start classes in AIIMS Kashmir on the pattern of AIIMS Rishikesh from the next academic session.
