Army intensifies ops against terrorists holed up in Poonch forests

▶ Gen Naravane visits forward areas along LoC in Jammu

JAMMU: After suffering nine casualties in as many days, the army has upped the ante against the terrorists holed up in the jungles of Poonch in the Jammu region, asking locals not to venture out of their homes and blocking main roads for a full-scale operation, officials said.

As loud explosions and staccato of gunfire pierced the air in the border district of Poonch with the troops advancing into the dense forests, Army Chief General M M Naravane on Tuesday visited forward areas along the LoC to review the ground situation and ongoing counter-infiltration operations.

"General MM Naravane #COAS (Chief of Army Staff) visited forward areas of #WhiteKnight Corps & undertook a first-hand assessment of the situation along the Line of

Before concluding his two-day tour, the officials said the Army chief visited the border districts of Rajouri and Poonch, where the massive operation to track down terrorists hiding in the forest areas of Mendhar, Surankote and Thanamandi has been going on since October 11.

The operation to neutralise the

Tuesday with authorities asking people in Mendhar in Poonch to stay indoors for their safety.

The people were alerted through the public address system in local mosques in Bhatta Durrian and adjoining areas as the security forces were preparing a final assault against the terrorists believed to be hiding in the forest area, the officials said.

The residents were asked not to venture into the forest area and also keep their livestock at their homes in view of the ongoing operation. Those who have gone outside were asked to suspend their activities and return to their homes along with their animals, the officials said.

The deafening sounds of explosions and gunfire shook the forest area shortly after the announcements with security forces launching assaults on suspected locations, mostly natural caves. However, there was no immediate report of any casualty.

A Junior Commissioned Officer (JCO) and four other security personnel laid down their lives in a

J&K on path of development, Migrant workers fleeing Kashmir throng railway stations, bus stands in Jammu, Udhampur

JAMMU: Thousands of migrant workers fleeing Kashmir along with their families queued up outside ticket counters of railway stations and bus stops here on Tuesday as targeted killing of minorities and nonlocals by terrorists triggered an exodus from the Vallev.

The security in and around the railway stations and bus stands in Jammu and Udhampur has been beefed up as a precautionary measure as people have been arriving in large numbers, desperate to leave ahead of schedule and more are on the way, officials said.

Outside the railway station in Jammu, men, women and children were seen waiting on the roadside in long queues without basic facilities of water or shelter.

As per rough estimates, 3 to 4 lakh migrant labourers, most of them Hindus, from Uttar Pradesh, Bihar. Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Uttarakhand come to the Valley every year in early March for skilled and unskilled jobs such as masonry, carpentry, welding and farming, and go back home

before the onset of winter in November.

But the selective killings have triggered a fear psychosis among them, propelling them to flee before they had planned to.

On Sunday, two labourers from Bihar were gunned down when terrorists barged into their accommodation in Kulgam district, taking the number of civilians killed in targeted attacks in Jammu and Kashmir this month to 11. Another labourer sustained bullet injuries.

"There is grave fear and terror after the killings of

labourers. This has never happened in the past. So we fled the Valley to save our lives and also our children,' Santosh Kumar of Bihar's Sitamarhi district said.

A brick kiln worker in the Rajpora area of Pulwama district, Kumar said most of those fleeing are scared as there is no guarantee of their security. "It is the last gift from

Kashmir. I will not go there again to earn my livelihood," said a distraught Mintu Singh, a labourer from Chattisgargh, holding

NIA to probe killing of minority community members in Kashmir

STATE TIMES NEWS SRINAGAR: The NIA is likely to take over cases related to the killing of minority community members, including those of two teachers and a pharmacy owner, who were among 11 civilians shot dead in targeted attacks by terrorists in different parts of Kashmir this month, officials said on Tuesday. Five of those killed were non-local labourers and these included four residents of Bihar. The killings triggered panic among skilled and unskilled migratory workers who started leaving Kashmir a fortnight ahead of their normal schedule. Lakhs of labourers from different parts of the country come to the Valley every year in early March for jobs such as masonry, carpentry, welding and farming, and go back home before the onset of winter. Makhan Lal a prominent Kashmiri Pandit and the owner of Srinagar's most noted pharmacy, was shot dead at his shop on October 5. Two days later, two teachers -- Supinder Kaur, a Srinagar-based Sikh, and Deepak Chand, a Hindu from Jammu -- were killed inside a government school here.

The probe into the three killings, which drew widespread condemnation from across the country, is likely to be taken over by the National Investigation Agency (NIA), the officials said, adding that the notification for takeover of the cases is vet to come. They said that the NIA is also likely to take over the killing of non-local labourers. On the same day when

Bindroo was killed, two more civilians -- a chaat' vendor Virendra Paswan from Bihar and a taxi driver Mohammad Shafi Lone - were shot dead at Hawal in Srinagar and Naidkhai in Bandipora district, respectively. Besides the five killings,

terrorists gunned down Majid Ahmad Gojri at Srinagar's Karan Nagar locality and Mohammad Shafi Dar at the city's Batmaloo area on October 2. Two non-locals --Arvind Kumar Sah of Bihar and Saghir Ahmad of Uttar Pradesh were killed in Srinagar and Pulwama districts, respectively on October

In another attack on nonlocals on October 17, two labourers from Bihar were killed and another injured in Kulgam district of south

Kashmir. The officials said that the Counter-Intelligence Kashmir (CIK), a wing of the Jammu and Kashmir Police. is also likely to take over cases related to the killing of two members of the Gujjar gang along with a case related to the killing of Mehran Ali Sheikh, who was shot dead outside his house at Nawa Kadal locality here in July.

Sheikh and Gojri were friends and part of a group called "16 Gujjar Gang". After a spate of civilian

killings, security forces shot dead 13 terrorists in nine separate encounters this month till October 16. The dead included four terrorists who, according to police, were responsible for four civilian killings in the first week of October.

tant attacks, there is an attempt to spread fear among the workers who are coming to the Valley from UP and Bihar. But the Centre will not fall prey to such tactics and a strategy is being formed to end militancy. There is need to conduct another surgical strike against Pakistan, which needs to vacate PoK and stop terror activities," the minister added. Queried on the upcoming
