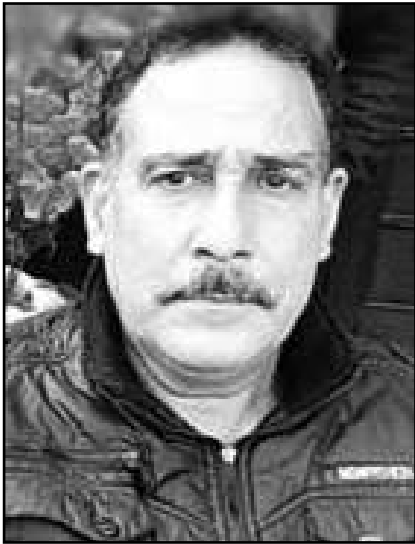

PoK resident arrested along LoC in Poonch

JAMMU: A man from Pakistan-occupied Kashmir was arrested by the Army for allegedly infiltrating along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch district on Friday, officials said.

"Today, at about 1230 hours, one PoK national (male) crossed LoC and has been apprehended by Indian Army troops along Mendhar river in Balnoi area," PRO defence said. He said further investigation is underway and updates will follow.

2 women drown in flash flood in Rajouri

JAMMU: Two women were washed away in a flash flood in a rivulet in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district on Friday, officials said here.

The incident took place when the women were at a farmland near the rivulet in Chatyari Bagla village, they said.

In the search and rescue operation launched by authorities, body of one the women has been recovered, the officials said.

Gang of thieves busted, 6 arrested, property worth lakhs recovered

R S PURA: Police on Friday arrested 6 thieves and recovered huge stolen property worth lakhs of rupees from their pos-session.

As per the details, a special police team under the supervision of SDPO RS Pura Shabir Khan, led by SHO RS Pura Jai Pal Sharma after generating a tip off zeroed in and arrested two members of the gang namely Honey Kumar, son of Sardari Lal and Ravi Kumar alias Bandri, son of Raj Kumar red-handed and recovered one bike.

When put to sustained questioning the duo disclosed their modus operandi and also the other gang members namely Rajat Kumar alias Donkey, son of Sardari Lal; Sunny Kumar alias Katti, son of Raj Kumar; Vishal Kumar alias Shalli, son of Yash Pal and Romi Kumar, son of Sat Pal, all residents of RS Pura.

After cross questioning and taking help of technical footprints recovery of stolen property worth lakhs of rupees was made. Recovered items include 8 motorcycles; 8 pumps motor; 3 smart phones; 2 cylinders; kitchen utensils; washbasin; inverters & batteries; speakers and kitchen utensils.

Subsequently investigation is going on in cases FIR No 173/2021 under section 457/380/IPC; FIR No 189/2021 under section 457/380/IPC and FIR No 195/2021 under section 379 for some more recoveries. Whole operation was done under the supervision of SP Hqrs Jammu Ramnish Gupta.

Two lifters nabbed, 3 stolen bikes recovered

JAMMU: Police on Friday arrested two notorious bike lifters and recovered three stolen bikes from their possession.

As per the details, on July 26, 2021, a written complaint was lodged at Police Station Bakshi Nagar by Sachin Kumar, son of Krishan Lal, resident of Venus Chowk, Udhampur at present Opposite Central Cooperative Bank, Resham Ghar Colony, Jammu stating that his motorcycle (Glamour) bearing registration no. JK02AG-0095, Chassis No. 07GAWC04271, Engine No 07GASM04801, has been stolen from Resham Ghar Colony. On this case FIR NO. 109/2021 under section 379 IPC was registered Police Station Bakshi Nagar and investigation started.

After this special police teams of Police Station Bakshi Nagar under the supervision of SDPO West Rahul Nagar were constituted. The team led by SHO Bakshi Nagar Insp Ravi Kant connected the various leads and with the help of CCTV footages and other technical aids finally rounded up two suspects namely Sahil Mehra alias Felli, son of Kamal Kishore, resident of Jewel and Sumit Kumar, son of Lt. Dharam Pal, resident of H.No. Pamposh Colony, Talab Tillo Camp, SOS Home, Jammu. During sustained questioning accused confessed their involvement in the above case and on the disclosure of accused namely Sumit Kumar stolen items were recovered which include M/ Cycle Glamour (JK02AG-0095), M/cycle Pulsar 220 ce bearing Chasis No. MDLA13EZ0CCJ39424 and M/cycle Passion (JK02AT-6321).

14 bovines rescued, smuggler arrested

MANVAL: Police on Friday foiled a bovine smuggling bid by rescuing 14 bovines and arrested a smuggler.

As per the details, on a specific information, a party of Police Post Manwal led by PSI Ayub Khan, In-Charge Police Post Manwal laid a surprise Naka checking at Nadal Manwal and intercepted one truck (Jk03D/7396) which was found loaded with 14 bovines. All 14 bovines were rescued accused namely Surjeet Kumar, son of Satpal, resident of Tanda Rs Pura. FIR No. 160/2021 under section 188 IPC, 11 PCA Act was registered against the accused at Police Station Jhajjarkotli. Naka checking conducted under the direct supervision of SHO Jhajjarkotli Inspr. Devinder Singh, Parupkar Singh, SDPO Nagrota and Sanjay Kumar Sharma SP Rural Jammu.

Bootlegger arrested, illicit liquor recovered

Inter-state narco smuggler arrested with 2. 6 Kg Ganja

JAMMU: In continuation to its drive launched against narcotics, Jammu Police achieved a success by apprehended one inter-state narco smuggler and recovered 2 kg. 610 grms of Ganja like substance from his possession on Friday.

As per the details, a police team during routine patrolling/Naka checking on near Railway Pulli Narwal road, Jammu noticed that one person was coming from Narwal towards Panama Chowk having white coloured plastic bag in his hand. On seeing police, he tried to run away which created suspicion. He was chased away and over powered by the alert cops on duty. On search, 2 kg. 610 grms of Ganja like substance was recovered from his possession.

The accused identified as Kedhar Nath, son of Mewak Ram, resident of Raigarh Chhatisgarh was arrested and FIR No. 322/21 under section 8/20 NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Trikuta Nagar. Police team led by Insp. Deepak Pathania SHO Trikuta Nagar and assisted by PSI Balbir Singh made the arrests/recovery under the supervision of Bilkram Kumar SDPO City East, Jammu and Deepak Digra SP City South, Jammu .

Mobile snatching case solved, snatcher arrested

UDHAMPUR: Police on Friday solved a mobile snatching case by arresting the accused. As per the details, based on a written complaint lodged by complainant namely Umesh Kr, wife of Manawar, resident of Rathian, Udhampur stating that one miscreant person restrained her and snatched his mobile phone and fled away from the spot.

Accordingly, FIR No 363/2021 under section 382 was registered in Police Station Udhampur and investigation started. During the course of investigation, a team of Police Station Udhampur led by Insp. Chaman Gorka SHO Udhampur after strenuous efforts, succeeded in arresting the accused person and also recovered the mobile phone from the possession of the accused person namely Mohd. Sadiq, son of Karim Ali, resident of Near Battal Ballian, Udhampur from Circular road Udhampur.

Police foils smuggling bid of forest produce medicinal plants

SRINAGAR: Police on Friday foiled a smuggling bid by arresting a smuggler along with 450 Kgs of forest produce medicinal plants in Ganderbal. Besides, Police in Bandipora also carried out an extensive drive to destroy wild Bhung in Alosa area.

In Ganderbal, a Police party of Police Station Gund under the supervision of SDPO Kangan Yasir Qadri established a checkpoint following a credible information regarding smuggling of forest produce medicinal plants at Surfraw Gund area of Ganderbal intercepted a vehicle (Maruti Van) bearing registration number JK02AN-3855 with one person on board. He has been identified as Asif Ahmad Lone son of Ghulam Mohammad resident of Surfraw Gund.

During checking, Officers recovered 450 Kgs of Minor Forest Produce including Kuth (Costus), Podophyllum and Pierorhiza from his possession. He has been arrested and shifted to Police Station where he remains in custody. Vehicle used in the commission of crime has also been seized.

In this regard a case vide FIR number 42/2021 under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Gund and investigation has been initiated.

Similarly in Bandipora, a Police team from Police Post Alosa under the supervision of DySP Hqrs Bandipora Shri Mohammad Idrees along with the officers from Revenue Department, destroyed wild bung spread over 30 Kanals of land in Trimukhan and Bamsi forest areas of Alosa. General public of the area have appreciated the action of Police and have urged to continue such drive in nearby areas also.

Two absconders arrested

BUDGAM: In continuation to stringent actions against absconders, Budgam Police on Friday arrested two absconders who were evading their arrest from last 12 years.

They were wanted by law for their involvement in different cases in various police stations of the district.

The arrested accused persons will be produced before Hon'ble Court of law accordingly.

Kidnapped girl recovered; accused arrested

PULWAMA: Police on Friday recovered a kidnapped girl and arrested the accused person involved in the commission of crime.

As per the details, on September 28, 2021, Police Station Litter received a written complaint from one person stating therein that his daughter (name withheld) was kidnapped by one person namely Showkat Ahmad Wani, son of Ab Rashid Wani, resident

of Khellan Pulwama.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 103/2021 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Litter and investigation was initiated.

During the course of investigation, a team headed by SHO Police Station Litter under the supervision of SDPO Litter Shri Furqan Qadri was constituted to trace and rescue the kidnapped girl. Acting on specific leads and by utilizing all available means, the team was able to recover the kidnapped girl from village Kulpora and arrest the accused person involved in the commission of crime within two days after complaint was received.

After fulfilling all medico-legal formalities, the girl has been handed over to her legal heirs. Further investigation into the matter is in progress.

COVID SOPs: Rs 24,000 fine recovered from violators in Ramban

RAMBAN: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement Covid protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Friday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 24,100 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 56, 07,800.

The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking Covid vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr. Suresh informed that as many as 2415 persons were administered first and second Covid vaccine doses across Ramban district today.

As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr. Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1549 samples including 354 RT-PCR and 1195 RAT samples besides administering Covid vaccine to 2415 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

Two killed in mishaps

JAMMU: Two persons were killed in separate road mishaps on Friday.

As per the details, a unknown vehicle hit a pedestrian while he was crossing road near Link road, Rajpura in Kanachak area as a result he got injured. Onlookers informed the police which rushed the spot and shifted the injured to hospital where doctors declared him as brought dead. As per the locals he was a beggar and was staying in the area since long.

Meanwhile, 41 years Darbar Singh, son of Janak Singh, resident of Sumb area of Samba who was on his bike (JK21G-9270) was hit by a tipper (JK02CL-0166) near Mansar Morh as a result he got injured. He was shifted to hospital where he succumbed to injuries. Police has registered a case and arrested tripper driver namely Farhandin, son of Mohd Saleem, resident of Batote.

Two thieves nabbed, stolen golden/ silver ornaments, mobile phone recovered

Further investigation is going on.

Drug peddler arrested with heroin
