Clean India: GDC Jindrah conducts 'Bye-Bye plastic'

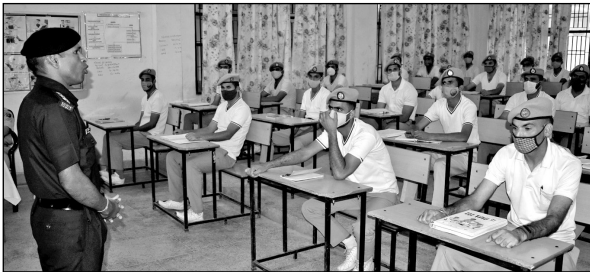
