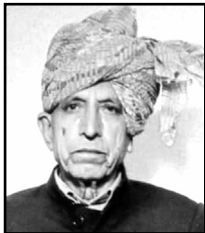

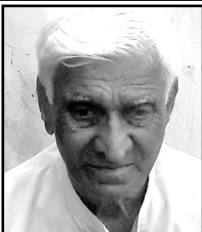

CRIME REPORT

Leopard caught in Jammu, shifted to Manda zoo

JAMMU: A leopard was caught by the officials of Wildlife Department, after it strayed into a village in outskirts of Jammu on Tuesday, officials said. The leopard got captured in a trap laid by villagers of Bhalwal-Brahmana in Akhnour to safeguard their maize crop from wild animals, they said. They further said villagers got surprised on seeing a leopard caught in one of their traps and immediately informed Wildlife Department. A rescue team was rushed to the spot, which tranquilised the leopard before shifting it to Manda zoo, the officials said.

18 bovines rescued, 2 smugglers held

KATHUA: Police on Tuesday foiled a bovine smuggling bid by rescuing 18 cattle and arrested two smugglers.

As per details, a team of Police Station Rajbagh led by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh under supervision of SDPO Border Sachit Mahajan while on Naka checking duty at NH Rajbagh noticed movement of a suspicious truck (JK02BT-6357) moving from Kathua towards Samba and directed it to stop. The vehicle was being driven by one Nisaar Ahmed, son of Gh Kader Khan, while his accomplice was identified as Showket Ahmed Mughal, son of Abdul Reyaz Mughal, both residents of Doru, District Anantnag.

During physical checking, 18 bovines were found laden in the aforesaid vehicle which were rescued and both accused were arrested. FIR No 211/2021 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act has been registered against them at Rajbagh Police Station.

Woman among three arrested with heroin & poppy straw

JAMMU/RAJOURI: Police on Tuesday nabbed two drug peddlers and recovered heroin and poppy straw from their possession.

As per details, a team of Police Station Budhal, while on routine patrolling in Draj area, observed a man attempting to evade police party. He was stopped and on his search, nine (9) grams of Heroin like substance was recovered. The accused, identified as Mohd Khaliq, son of Mohd Sharief, resident of Phalni Budhal, was arrested and FIR No. 113 /2021 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Budhal against him.

Meanwhile, Miran Sahib Police has also arrested a drug peddler and recovered 15 gm heroin and 2 Kg poppy straw from his possession. The accused was identified as Manpreet Singh alias Sartaj, resident of Simbal Camp.

In another incident, a team of Police Station Kathua led by PSI Riaz Ahmed under the supervision of DySP Headquarters Kathua Shammi Kumar during patrolling duty at Chak Drab Khan noticed a suspicious woman, who was asked to stop for checking. On thorough checking, a transparent pouch containing 3 grams (approximately) of Heroin (Chittia) was recovered from her possession. She was identified as Bindu Devi, wife of Kulbir Kumar, resident of Chankara, Gurdaspur (Punjab) and presently staying at Chak Drab Khan Tehsil Kathua. She was arrested on the spot and FIR No. 466/2021 under sections 8/21/22/29 of NDPS Act was registered against her at Police Station Kathua.

Historic Mughal road reopens for traffic after three days

JAMMU: Historic Mughal road connecting Poonch-Kashmir Valley was reopened

for vehicular movement after three days on Tuesday. Mughal road was closed for three days as a precautionary measure due to heavy rains and snowfall in the area. The traffic department has given permission to vehicles to ply on the route after snow was cleared completely from road. Although commuters told that route is still slippery, but vehicles can comfortably pass through the route. Mughal road connecting district Poonch of Jammu division and Shopian district of Kashmir gets closed frequently due to snowfall.

With help of army and police, some people trapped in snow were taken out and shifted to safer places. On Sunday afternoon, as soon as weather cleared, the Mechanical Department started its work of clearing snow and by Monday evening, the road was fully opened for vehicular movement.

Fire broke out inside Miran Sahib Power Station

JAMMU: A fire broke out near a transformer repair workshop inside power station located at Tali Morh village of Miran Sahib.

The fire broke out at around 10 AM, due to which panic gripped among employees and officers, working in the power station. The employees tried to douse the fire but when it went out of control, the fire department was informed which rushed to the spot and doused fire after hectic efforts. It was learnt that the fire broke out from junk emanated from transformer repairing workshop, which spread out quickly.

Bootlegger nabbed with 80 bottles of liquor

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday nabbed a bootlegger and recovered 80 bottles of liquor from his possession.

As per details, acting on a tip off, sleuths of DSB and Gandhi Nagar Police laid a Naka in area, intercepted a pedestrian who was carrying a bag. During frisking, police recovered 80 bottles of liquor from the bag. The accused, identified as Joginder Lal, resident of Satwari was arrested and a case under relevant section of law has been registered against him.

Youth attacked with sharp-edged weapon

JAMMU: A youth was attacked with sharp-edged weapon at Sidhra area on Tuesday.

As per details, one Muzaffar Iqbal, resident of Sidhra lodged a complaint with police that few youths intercepted his car, when he was on his way back home from opening ceremony of a gym. He further said that he was attacked with a sharp-edged weapon (Toka), due to which he got injured. He further identified one of the attackers as Shabir Ahmed, resident of Janipur. Police has registered a case and started investigation in the matter.

Three notorious criminals nabbed with sharp-edged weapons

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday nabbed three notorious criminals with sharp-edged weapons.

As per details, after getting a specific input regarding criminals roaming in the Satriyan area of R S Pura with some criminal intentions, SHO R S Pura Insp Jai Pal Sharma deputed a special patrolling party led by PSI Amit Singh for nabbing them.

On seeing patrolling party the duo tried to flee but after a hot chase, both the accused persons were apprehended and during questioning they disclosed their identity as Abhi Sharma alias Kannu, son of Surjeet Sharma, resident of Satriyan R S Pura and Sunny Sharma, son of Raman Sharam, resident of W No 2 R S Pura. During search, two sharp-edged weapons i.e., Tokas (one from each accused) was also recovered. The duo was arrested and FIR No 204/21 under section 4/25 of A Act was registered against them at Police Station R S Pura. The whole operation

was conducted under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Shabir Khan.

Meanwhile, a notorious smuggler was arrested with narcotics and a sharp-edged weapon by Miran Sahib Police. He was evading arrest in an attempt to murder case and absconding since 2019. Identified as Manpreet Singh alias Sartaj, son of Kuldeep Singh, resident of Ward no 2 Simbhal Camp Miran Sahib, he was caught along with his vehicle (JK02BH -5570) from a Naka at Miran Sahib, laid by a Police party led by SDPO R S Pura Shabir Khan along with SHO Miran Sahib Mirza Sultan. During search, 22 gm of Heroin like substance and a sharp-edged weapon was recovered from his possession. It is pertinent to mention that accused is involved in 4 FIRs previously and was active in drug peddling among school-going children. Police is investigating the backward and forward channels of the drug peddling.

Woman arrested for illicit distillation; 50 lts Lahan destroyed, 5 lts Desi liquor seized

KATHUA: In a major action against the consumption/production of illegal liquor menace in District, Kathua Police under the overall supervision of SSP Kathua R C Kotwal on Tuesday destroyed near about 50 litres of Desi Lahan and seized 5 litres of illicit liquor, near Chak Drab Khan, Kathua and arrested a woman in this connection.

As per details, a team of Police Station Kathua led by Insp Om Parkash Chib SHO Kathua under supervision of DySP Headquarters Kathua Shammi Kumar during patrolling duty in its jurisdictional area near Chak Drab Khan apprehended a suspect namely Baby, wife of Labba Ram, resident of Chak Drab Khan, Tehsil & District Kathua. On checking, 5 litres of illicit liquor was recovered from her possession along with 50 litres of Desi Lahan, which was destroyed.
