Govt cracks whip on corrupt; 8 employees sacked

JAMMU: Government on Thursday sacked eight tainted employees under article 226 (2) of the Jammu Kashmir Civil Regulations. The rules say government in the public interest may retire an employee after completion of 22 years of qualifying service or attaining 48 years of age. All the 8 employees have been sacked on charges of corruption and misconduct.

This is yet another list of employees terminated from the services. However, some unscrupulous employees are yet to be touched.

According to sources, a Forest Guard from Domana area in Jammu reportedly involved in forest land grab and drawing salary without joining his duties continues to remain the blue eyed boy, least to speak of any action against him.
