## Independent India @ 75: Self-reliance with integrity

As country celebrates 75th year of its independence as 'Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav', it has many achievements to highlight and many challenges and issues to debate and discuss for a common strategy to eradicate them. Now, it has almost been seven decades of country attaining independence; yet our society is plunged with so many evils that have retarded the development trajectory of the country. One such evil is the widespread prevalence of corruption in the country. Corruption is a form of dishonesty or a criminal offense which is undertaken by a person or an organization which is entrusted with a position of authority, in order to acquire illicit benefits or abuse power for one's personal gain. Corruption may involve many activities which include bribery and embezzlement, and it may also involve practices which are legal in many countries. It exists everywhere; in our institutes, in our social structure, in our political structure and in our moral ethics. Transparency International, the global coalition against corruption defines corruption as the abuse of entrusted power for private gain. Corruption erodes trust, weakens democracy, hampers economic development and further exacerbates inequality, poverty, social division and the environmental crisis.

Infact Corruption and crime have endemic sociological occurrences which appear with regular frequency in virtually all countries on a global scale in varying degrees and proportions. Each individual nation allocates domestic resources for the control and regulation of corruption and the deterrence of crime. Strategies which are undertaken in order to counter corruption are often summarized under the umbrella term anti-corruption. Additionally, global initiatives like the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal 16 also have a targeted goal which is supposed to substantially reduce corruption in all of its forms.

Corruption- All Pervasiveness: The

Transparency International (TI) says that corruption can take many forms and can include behaviors like public servants demanding or taking money or favors in exchange for services, politicians misusing public money or granting public jobs or contracts to their sponsors, friends and families, corporations bribing officials to get lucrative deals. Corruption can happen anywhere: in business, government, the courts, the media, and in civil society, as well as across all sectors from health and education to infrastructure and sports. Corruption can involve anyone: politicians, government officials, public servants, business people or members of the public. Corruption happens in the shadows, often with the help of professional enablers such as bankers, lawyers, accountants and real estate agents, opaque financial systems and anonymous shell companies that allow corruption schemes to flourish and the corrupt to launder and hide their illicit wealth.

Types of Corruption:

a. Petty corruption occurs at a smaller scale and takes place at the implementation end of public services when public officials meet the public. For example, in many small places such as registration offices, police stations, state licensing boards, and many other private and government sectors.

b. Grand corruption is defined as corruption occurring at the highest levels of government in a way that requires significant subversion of the political, legal and economic systems. Such corruption is commonly found in countries with authoritarian or dictatorial governments but also in those without adequate policing of corruption.

c. Systemic or endemic corruption) is corruption which is primarily due to the weaknesses of an organization or process. It can be contrasted with individual officials or agents who act corruptly within the system

Corruption in India: The Corruption Perception Index (CPI) released annual-

ly by Transparency International that ranks countries by their perceived level of public sector corruption according to experts and business people. It uses a scale of zero to 100, where zero signifies the highest level of corruption and 100 is very clean. India's ranking on the Corruption Perception Index 2020 slipped from 80 to 86 even as its score decreased only by one point to 40 from 41 in 2019. The index released annually by Transparency International ranks 180 countries. In Asia, key economies such as India, Indonesia and Bangladesh with scores of 40, 37 and 36 respectively, experienced slow progress in anticorruption efforts, with several government commitments to reform not yet materializing, states the C P I - 2 0 2 0 report.

### Vigilance Awareness Week

**Corruption & Central Vigilance Commission (CVC):** In the country, the CVC as an apex body deals with the matter of Corruption. This is a Statutory Body established in the year 1964 through the executive resolution of the Central Government. In the year 2003, an act of law was passed in parliament after which CVC became a statutory body giving it the status of a Constitutional Body. As the apex integrity institution, the Commission is mandated to fight corruption and to ensure integrity in public administration.

**Vigilance Awareness Week:** Since 1999, the week beginning from 31st October every year has been observed as the Vigilance Awareness Week.

The significance of 31st October is that it is the birthday of the first Home Minister of India, Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel also called as the Iron man of India.

**Theme of the Week:** Vigilance Awareness Week observed from October 26th to Nov. 1st this year is being celebrated with the theme of 'Independent India @ 75: Self Reliance with Integrity'.

The week will be celebrated with a host of activities planned by all the institutes

to spread awareness and promote vigilance. The awareness week will start by taking integrity pledge on the first day of the Awareness Week i.e., on 26 October. This week of awareness leads campaign affirming the commitment of promoting transparency along with probity in the life of public by participation of the citizens.

**Purpose:** The Awareness week is observed as an initiative to bring an end to corruption by raising voice against corruption and bringing awareness among the citizens to understand the cause of corruption and stand against it.
