### Officer, Jawan martyred...

shoes. An army officer said there was no breakthrough against the holed-up terrorists who are avoiding direct contact with the search parties and are on the run taking advantage of thick foliage, natural caves and difficult terrain.

The entire forest area is under tight security cordon and the operation to neutralise the terrorists is going on, the officer said.

The officials said smoke was seen billowing from deep inside the forest at a few places after dry grass caught fire during the ongoing operation. The fire, however, was put off by the search parties.

Over a dozen persons, including two women, were detained so far for questioning after it came to light that they allegedly provided logistic support, including food and shelter, to the terrorists, the officials said.

Traffic between Bhimber Gali and Jera Wali Gali in Mendhar along the Jammu-Rajouri highway remained suspended as a precautionary measure for the 15th day on Saturday in view of the ongoing operation.

Rajouri and Poonch in Jammu region have witnessed a rise in infiltration attempts since June this year, resulting in the killing of nine terrorists in separate encounters.

Moreover, 87 more COVID-19 patients have recovered and been discharged from various hospitals including 16 from Jammu Division and 71 from Kashmir Division.

On COVID vaccination, the officials said that 63,155 doses of COVID vaccine have been administered in the last 24 hours bringing the cumulative number of doses administered across J&K to 14,590,656.

According to the daily Media Bulletin, out of 332154 positive cases, 886 are Active Positive (103 in Jammu Division and 783 in Kashmir Division), 326836 have recovered and 4432 have died; 2176 in Jammu division and 2256 in Kashmir division.

The Bulletin further said that out of 16163431 test results available, 332154 samples have tested positive and 15831277 samples have been tested as negative till date. Besides, 39,002 COVID tests have been conducted in last 24 hours.

Till date 3825024 persons have been enlisted for observation which included 6267 persons in home quarantine including facilities operated by government, 886 in isolation and 448797 in home surveillance. Besides, 3364642 persons have completed their surveillance period.

Eleven fresh COVID cases were detected in Ladakh, taking the overall virus tally in the union territory to 20,941 and the active cases to 58, officials said.

Ladakh has registered 208 Covid-related deaths 150 in Leh and 58 in Kargil since the outbreak of the pandemic last year.

The officials said 1,207 persons were tested for COVID-19 in the twin districts on Friday and 11 of them were found positive in Leh.

Two coronavirus infected patients were discharged from a hospital in Leh, thereby taking the number of recoveries in Ladakh to 20,675, they said, the number of active cases stands at 58 --- 54 in Leh and four in Kargil.

The officials said no fresh covid-related death was reported in Ladakh on Friday.

### Rs 16,800 fine recovered from COVID SoPs violators

RAMBAN: Continuing enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Saturday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 16,800 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 61,63,750.

The Enforcement officers urged people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh informed that as many as 1677 persons were administered first and second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district. As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1,201 samples including 345 RT-PCR and 856 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 1,677 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

### Over 55 Kanals Govt land retrieved

On this, FIR No 154/2021 under Section 379 of IPC got registered and investigation started. ### Drug peddler nabbed with 5.5 Kg poppy straw

SAMBA: In its drive against drug smugglers & its propagators, Police on



Saturday arrested a narcotics smuggler and recovered 5.5 Kg Poppy Straw (Blukki) from his possession.

As per details, a team from Police Station Samba while performing vehicle checking duty near Nud, Samba, signaled a Nissan Car (PBO7AD-4880), to stop, which was coming from Kashmir side and moving towards Punjab. During checking of vehicle, 5.5 Kg of Poppy Straw packed in 8 polythene bags were recovered, which were concealed in specially-fabricated cavity.

The accused identified as Jaga Singh, son of Balwinder Singh, resident of Aabadi, Verka, Amritsar was arrested and FIR No. 310/2021 under sections 8/15 of NDPS Act has been registered against him at Police Station Samba.

As per details, a party from Police Station Samba, while performing routine vehicle checking duty in Samba area, intercepted a Canter (RJ02GA-7259) driven by one Sukhwinder Singh, son of Nand Lal, resident of Abhor, Punjab



which was on its way from Gujarat to Srinagar. During checking of vehicle, 130 sacks of polythene bags, each weighing about 20-25 Kg were found laden inside the vehicle, without any permission. In this regard, the matter was handed over to District Pollution Control Board, Samba for further action at their end.

The Dogra certificate issue may not bring too much of extra employment benefits to the Dogra people of J&K but one thing is sure that with such like Identity the people of Jammu Division will stand more firmly against the forces who may be there to weaken the socio religious ties amongst the simple & innocent masses Hindu and Muslim of Jammu Division. But why did the leadership from Jammu Division did not unitedly carry the provision for issue of Dogra Certificate further after that making the J&K Revenue Department Order No. Rev.(LB) 69 of 2011 dated: 25-03-2011 issued with the approval of the then Revenue Minister Raman Bhalla almost an unknown identity even in 2021 ? ### T20 WC: Mehbooba...

three students from Kashmir studying in Agra were arrested for allegedly celebrating Pakistan's victory over India in the T20 World Cup match played in Dubai on October 24.

"I write to you with a deep sense of disappointment and concern about the alarming situation in Jammu and Kashmir. Not too long ago when you presided over an all-party meeting in Delhi you expressed your intention to remove 'dil ki doori' between Delhi and J&K. In my capacity as the President of PDP, I suggested a few confidence building measures that would have provided a sense of relief and breathing space to the people of J&K," Mehbooba wrote.

"We had been waiting for the roll-out of a policy to address the hearts and minds of people, especially youth," she said.

The PDP president said there were also expectations that Union Home Minister Amit Shah's recent visit to J&K would have led to a meaningful outreach, especially after his statement about engaging with the youth here.

"Instead, what followed was shocking and worrying. A friendly cricket match between India and Pakistan that was solely a source of entertainment for people here...led to booking (of) youngsters under the draconian UAPA for simply choosing to cheer the winning side," she said. Mehbooba said the brightest young people pursuing professional courses like MBBS have been targeted and slapped with anti-terror laws. "...three students in Agra too have been arrested and charged with sedition for the same reasons. This, despite the college's own admission that they didn't engage in any activity that might be construed as anti-national," she said. The former chief minister said patriotism and a sense of loyalty have to be cultivated with compassion and cannot be "forced by wielding the baton or by the barrel of a gun".

"Such punitive actions laced with contempt will only further the sense of mistrust and alienation between the younger generation and rest of the country.... Wisdom deems it prudent for this government to engage with them, understand their aspirations and goals. I fervently request you to intervene so that the future of these young bright minds is not destroyed," she wrote to Modi.

Mehbooba said political parties and their fortunes will wax and wane over the course of time, but what matters the most is the future generation that will have to carry the burdens of the past yet strive to fulfil the expectations of a better tomorrow.
