Two found hanging

JAMMU: Two persons were found hanging in their respective houses on Sunday.

As per details, a 35 years old youth namely Mustkin Ansari, son of Sikandar Ansari, resident of Kalichamni, Bengal presently staying in a rented house at Talab Tillo, was found hanging in his room. Huge consignment of medicinal plants seized, 5 arrested

GANDERBAL: Police on Sunday foiled a smuggling bid and seized about 11 quintals of medicinal plants from a godown in Kangan area. Besides, arrested five persons involved in the commission of crime.

Acting on credible inputs about dumping of huge consignment of medicinal plants in a godown located in main town Kangan, a team headed by SHO Police Station Kangan under the supervision of SDPO Kangan Yasir Qadri was constituted on the directions of SSP Ganderbal Nikhil Borkar. The team raided the godown and recovered huge consignment of forest produce containing medicinal plants weighing about 1,102 kilograms. 37 vehicles seized for transportation of illegally extracted minerals
