SRINAGAR: In follow up to the Swachhta Pakhwada programme which was inaugurated on October 02, 2021 by the Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha from SKICC and which will continue for fifteen-days, Divisional Commissioner Kashmir Pandurang K Pole on Sunday participated in the de-weeding drive in Dal Lake.

The Divisional Commissioner also had an extensive tour of Dal Lake and took stock of various activities being conducted. Besides, he also participated in the de-weeding process. The Div Com also inspected the lily extraction activity which is being done on a large scale by J&K LDA. He also visited the interior of Dal lake and Dolemb area

to take first hand information.

On the occasion, the Deputy Mayor, Parvez Ahmad Qadri along with corporators Aqib Renzu, Zubair Fayaz, Mohd Saleem and Iniyat Mir also participated in the de-weeding drives along with the Divisional Commissioner.

The Divisional Commissioner was also accompanied by VC LAWDA Dr. Bashir Ahmad Bhat, besides other officers of LAWDA and SMC. The de-weeding process in Dal Lake has been taken up on a large scale by J&K LDA since May 2021 and will continue till November 2021. In order to have greater participation in cleaning operation of Dal Lake various organisations like SDRF, NDRF, house boat owners association, shikara association

NGOs like

Jannat Mission, JK Srinagar Eco watch, Go green are actively involved in the exercise who are also working in association with J&K LDA for de-weeding and solid waste management areas.

Meanwhile, Div Com urged the houseboat owners to clean the areas around the houseboats by de-weeding & collection of solid waste so as to keep the area clean in order to attract more tourists. He also emphasised the need to add more water transport and recreational facilities like jet skies in Dal Lake to add to the dynamics of the aquatic ecosystem. On the occasion, J&K LDA has sought cooperation of all stakeholders for participation in cleaning of Dal Lake to upkeep the aesthetics of the lake.

Union MoS for Textiles & Railways conducts whirlwind tour of Srinagar Distt

SRINAGAR: As part of the Central Government's Public Outreach Programme for the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, Union Minister of State (MoS) for Textiles and Railways, Darshana V. Jardosh on Sunday conducted whirlwind tour of district Srinagar.

During the tour the MoS visited Govt. Arts Emporium Raj Bagh, Silk Factory and Bemina Wollen Mills.

While visiting the Govt. Arts Emporium, Srinagar, the MoS asked the officers to create awareness across the country about the products being sold at the centre. She added that the products of Kashmir are known worldwide and they need proper publicity and marketing.

The MoS directed the officers to tie-up with e-commerce sites for marketing and selling of products and make provision for online selling through website. She also asked them to devise a mechanism for checking the authenticity and originality of silk. During the visit to Silk Factory Rajbagh, the MoS interacted with various artisans of papier mache clusters, willow wicker clusters and crevel crafting clusters. She also distributed certificates among the artisans for participating in Color and Design Trends workshop and Market Research and Buyer Trends Workshop.

Speaking on the occasion, the MoS said that the artisans here are unique and their uniqueness is reflected in the show-cased products of the factory.

She asked the officers to establish Common Facility Centre for artisans so that required training as well as marketing techniques can be provided to them. During the visit, Jardosh also inspected the stalls of various clusters like Shaksaa, Bandipora weavers, Noor Aari Crafts and Zaidal craft and interacted with them.

During the tour, the MoS also visited Govt. Wollen Mills Bemina.

The Minister said that Jammu and Kashmir has vast potential in terms of textile industry as world renowned silk having GI mark is being produced here. She stressed upon the officers to tap this potential of J&K and make it hub of textile manufacturing industry. Meanwhile, the MoS also paid a visit to Directorate of Sericulture here and participated in Cocoon Auction Market 2021-22 and also interacted with cocoon weavers. Speaking on the occasion, the Minister highlighted that the purpose of this visit is to ascertain the development of textile sector in

the UT of J&K. She added that the government has launched several schemes for the development of this sector and the people associated with it should take due benefits of these schemes. The Minister further said that under the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the textile sector has seen a sharp growth and technical infrastructure as well as knowledge resources for the farmers are given due importance. While interacting with the cocoon weavers, the MoS asked

them to take due advantage of all the schemes of government and assured them of constant support. Later in the day, the MoS visited Central Sericulture Research and Training Institute (CSRTI), Pampore. During the visit, the Minister interacted with the scientists of the institute on research and development of sericulture sector across North India. Speaking during the interaction, the MoS asked the scientists to provide all kind of support to the cocoon weavers. She asked them to devise those varieties which can increase the productivity and strengthen the levels of efficiency. The Minister asked the scientists to provide training, transfer of technology, coordination and market development, seed organisation and other related support to the weavers so that gainful employment avenues are created here. The minister was informed that CSRTI is rendering Research and Development, Technical,

Technological, Human Resource Development and Extension Service Support to sericulture farmers in entire North and North-western parts of the country. Later, the Minister visited district Anantnag and took part in a series of events and activities that witnessed participation of public officials and delegations.

She inspected the stalls installed by Handicrafts and Handloom Department and interacted with multiple public delegations, members of Panchayat Raj Institutions, SHG members, youth clubs and entrepreneurs among others. The Minister also visited Carpet Centre Siligam and interacted with artisans and listened to their grievances and demands. Director Handicrafts and Handloom Kashmir, Mehmood Ahmad, RTO Kashmir Sajid Yehya Naqash, President Grameen Art, Sofi Yousuf and other officers were present on the occasion.

800 Mini Sheep Farm units allotted to tribal youth: Shahid

SRINAGAR: Tribal Affairs Department J&K has initiated an ambitious plan to offer gainful employment to 10,000 tribal youth apart from a number of skill development courses and employment opportunities. Phase-I of the mini Sheep Farm scheme was formally initiated with draw of lots among the applicants across various districts conducted by the Sheep Husbandry department.

In phase-I under the Sheep Farming scheme 1500 youth have been selected. The mini Sheep Farm scheme launched by the Tribal Affairs Department aimed at establishment of 1500 mini Sheep Farms this year followed by 30% addition every year. The scheme entails to establish more than 10,000 such sheep farming units in next 4 years. Sheep Husbandry Department is implementing the scheme

with active participation of tribal farmers. An awareness programme has also been initiated by Sheep Husbandry Department to elicit greater response from tribal concentration areas.

More than 6000 applications were received in various districts under the flagship scheme which was launched in 13 districts for establishment of 835 mini Sheep Farms. The scheme is 100% funded by J&K Tribal Affairs Department. A total of 5225

applicants were found eligible under the scheme and draw of lots was conducted in all 13 districts selecting 835 tribal youth for establishment of Sheep Farms. Further, every district has also maintained a 10% waiting list of eligible tribal youth. The draw of lots was supervised by District Sheep Husbandry Officers in presence of DDC members, BDC Chairpersons and PRI members. Director of Sheep Husbandry, Kashmir/ Jammu are supervising the flagship

scheme.

Secretary, Tribal Affairs Department, Dr Shahid Iqbal Choudhary informed that under the guidance of Lieutenant Governor J&K the UT administration earlier initiated an ambitious plan to offer gainful employment to 10,000 tribal youth this year which involved establishment of 1500 mini Sheep Farms in two faces. He further informed that Department is working on process to establish 500 dairy farms and 700 mini Sheep Farms under the scheme apart from 17 milk villages and support for procurement of milk chilling plants, packaging units and transportation. The draw of lots was held in 13 districts covered under Phase-I which include Samba, Kathua, Doda, Reasi, Poonch, Rajouri, Srinagar, Shopian, Kupwara, Anantnag, Ganderbal,

Pulwama and Kulgam while remaining districts will be covered in Phase-II later this year. The schemes includes establishment of sheep units along with related infrastructure, insurance, veterinary healthcare, market linkages and skill development.

Pertinently, two youth will be trained for each of the Sheep Farm under Skill Development component of Mission Youth offering opportunities for value addition and market linkages. The Agriculture Skill Council of India has been roped in by the Tribal Affairs Department to impart training to 1500 youth in Phase-I in coordination with Mission Youth and J&K Skill Development Mission. Financial institutions have also been roped in for providing financial support to tribal youth desirous of establishing bigger Sheep Farms with 200-500 livestock.
