Driver injured, cleaner missing after JCB plunges into Sindh River on Sgr-Leh Highway

GANDERBAL: Driver of a JCB got injured while its cleaner went missing after a JCB plunged into river Sindh near Hung Sonamarg on Srinagar-Leh highway in Central Kashmir's Ganderbal district on Monday morning.

As per police, the driver got injured while JCB cleaner went missing after the JCB plunged into river Sindh. They further said that soon after receiving the information, a team from Police Station Sonamarg launched a massive rescue operation and after hectic efforts, rescued driver of JCB in an injured condition from gushing water. He was immediately taken to PHC Sonamarg for treatment. The cleaner of JCB is still missing while rescue operation is underway to trace him.

Two peddlers arrested, 22.1 Kg poppy straw recovered

JHAJJAR KOTLI: Police on Monday recovered 22 Kg 120 gm poppy straw from a truck and arrested its driver and accomplice.

As per details, during Naka by police team of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli led by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Insp Devinder Singh under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Parupkar Singh, police intercepted a truck (PB01C/4543) and recovered 22 Kg 120 gm poppy straw hidden in a box made in boot space of the vehicle. The driver identified as Satwant Singh, son of Amarjeet Singh, resident of Tehsil Nawanshahar District Hoshiarpur, Punjab and its accomplice Charanjit Lal, son of Ram Lal, resident of Kittna Tehsil Garhshanker District Hoshiarpur, Punjab were arrested and FIR No. 164/2021 under sections 8/15/25/29 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli. The overall arrest and recovery was made under supervision of SP Rural Sanjay Sharma.

4 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which dedicated teams from Police Stations Jhajjar Kotli, Domana, Police Post Chinore and Manwal acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized four different vehicles involved in illegal mining. Seized vehicles include one dumper (JK19A 0752) seized by Manwal police; one tipper without registration number seized by Chinore police; a tractor-trolley without registration number seized by Domana police and another tractor trolley without registration number seized by Jhajjar Kotli police. The vehicles were seized by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Insp Devinder Singh, SHO Domana Insp Mahesh Sharma, Incharge Police Post Manwal PSI Ayub Khan and Incharge Police Post Chinore PSI Avtar Krishan in their respective jurisdictions.

44 bovines rescued, five smugglers arrested

JAMMU: In a massive drive against bovine smuggling, Jammu Police has rescued 44 bovines from different locations and seized four vehicles (JK12A-2805, JK02M-5297, JK20A-1006 and JK02CJ/8771) besides arresting five smugglers.

In this regard, FIR No. 258/2021 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act, 3/181, 184 of MV Act got registered at Police Station Akhnoor, FIR No. 398/2021 under sections 188 of IPC,11 of PCA Act got registered at Police Station Nagrota and similar cognizance was taken at Police Station Khour. Five accused were arrested, who were identified as Mohd Issaq, son of Mohd Yacoub, resident of Bhinehh Tehsil Haveli Poonch arrested by Police Station Khour; Mohd Safer; son of Sabir Hussain, resident of Nalli Manjakote District Rajouri, arrested by Police Station Akhnoor; Mohd Shaffiq, son of Mohd Azam, resident of Nalli Manjakote District Rajouri, arrested by Police Station Akhnoor; Muzamal Maqsood, son of Mohd Maqsood, resident of Bandipur Kashmir; arrested by Police Station Nagrota and Maskeen



Ali, son of Lal Hussain, resident of Hira Nagar Kathua, arrested by Police Station Nagrota.

2 drug peddlers arrested, huge quantity of contraband recovered

BANDIPORA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate drug menace from the society, Police in Bandipora arrested two drug peddlers in two separate instances and recovered huge quantity of contraband substances from their possession. Acting on specific information, a Police party of Police Station Hajin led by SHO Hajin at a surprise checkpoint established at Chrengpora Hajin arrested a wanted drug-peddler identified as Mohd Rafiq Malla, son of Gh Ahmad Malla, resident of Chrengpora Hajin. On checking, 6.6 Kg Charas was recovered from his possession. It is pertinent to mention here that accused was the core drug peddler of the area, operating since long and evading his arrest.

In another action, officers from Police Station Bandipora & Police Post Aloosa at a checkpoint established at Manginipora Crossing intercepted two persons riding a motorcycle bearing registration number JK05B-2912. One among them, identified as Abdul Lateef Rather; son of Mohmad Munwar Rather; resident of Gamroo Bandipora managed to escape from the spot. However; the pillion-rider identified as Ishfaq Ahmad, son of Ab Rashid Rather; resident of Madar Bandipora was apprehended. On search, 2,832 banned capsules were recovered. Efforts are on to effect arrest of escaped drug peddler. Motorcycle used in the commission of crime has also been seized. During preliminary investigation, it surfaced that the accused were supplying drugs to youth of the area in order to make them drug addicts. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective Police Station and further investigation has been taken up.

Drug peddler nabbed with heroin

POONCH: Police on Monday nabbed a drug peddler and recovered 10 gm heroin from his possession.

As per details, a party of Police Station Poonch led by Prob Sub Inspector Arun Sharma while on Naka checking duty at Kalai Bridge apprehended one person namely Maqsood Ahmed, son of Mazoor Ahmed, resident of Sheri Khawza, who was moving under suspicious circumstances and when stopped, failed to give satisfactory replies after which he was frisked thoroughly. During frisking, about 9-10 gm heroin like psychotropic substance was recovered from the accused. He was arrested and FIR No. 257/2021 under sections 08/22 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Poonch. The arrest and recovery took place under supervision of SSP Dr Vinod Kumar, ASP Liaqat Chaudhary and SHO Police Station Poonch, Farooq Ahmed.

Rs 54,500 fine recovered from COVID SoPs violators in Ramban

RAMBAN: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Monday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 54,500 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 57,03,500. The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh informed that as many as 1,872 persons were administered first and second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district on Monday. As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1,374 samples including 356 RT-PCR and 1,018 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 1,872 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

One killed, another injured as tractor falls into gorge

RAMBAN: A person was killed and other got injured after a tractor, they were travelling on, skidded off the road and fell down into a gorge in Banihal area of Ramban on Monday.

As per details, driver lost control over tractor (JK03K-8337) due to which it rolled down into 40-ft gorge near Chareel Banihal. A person identified as Mohammad Rafiq of Nowgam Banihal died on the spot while another person Wahied Ahmed from Bengal got



injured and was shifted to hospital by a rescue team comprising police personnel and locals. A case has been registered in this regard.

Man attempts suicide after killing 3-yr old son

NOWSHERA: A man attempted suicide by killing his son in Nowshera Tehsil on Monday. As per details, Manjit Singh, resident of Kanara killed his 3 years old son Harnam under the influence of liquor on Sunday night and next morning, on seeing his son dead, consumed poison. The duo was shifted to hospital where Harnam was declared as brought dead by doctors. Mother of deceased Surinder Kour stated that her husband Manjit Singh has sent her to her parental house after beating and when she refused to come back from parental house, he took his son along and killed him in night under influence of liquor. A case has been registered against Manjit Singh and investigation has been started.

Demanding action against assaulters, Kinnar community holds protest; disrupts traffic flow

JAMMU: The members of transgender community held a protest in Jammu on Monday and disrupted the vehicular movement for sometime causing great hardships to commuters.

As per details, after a dispute between two groups of eunuchs in the city, a clash erupted in which some members of the community got injured. At the same time, the members of group alleged that some outside eunuchs have come into their area and are trying to establish supremacy by doing hooliganism. They further alleged that on Sunday night, some members of the rival other group attacked four of their companions and injured them seriously. "Even after the attack, we complained regarding the same at Police Post parade, but no action was taken by police," they added.

Demanding action against all those responsible for the assault, the members of Kinnar community staged protest at Jewel Chowk. Raising slogans in support of their demands, they sat on the road and disrupted the traffic. The protesting members of Kinnar community further alleged that they are residents of Jammu but some outsiders have came here and harassing them. Leveling allegations against two transgender Sheetal and Sahra for the assault, they said that both these transgender along with their accomplice attacked their comrade with sharp-edged weapons when they were going towards Parade from Bakshi Nagar. Sensing gravity of the situation, SP City Mohita Sharma and other police officers rushed to the spot and assured protesting eunuchs that police would soon arrest the attackers and take strict action against them. After the assurance of police, the eunuchs lifted their protest.

Phallain Mandal area sealed after arms-drop incident

JAMMU: The entire area has been sealed after Pakistani drone dropped weapons in Phallain Mandal area of Makwal sector of IB adjoining Jammu city. As per a police official, as a precautionary measure and to carry out searches in the area, Police has sealed entire area after the incident. "None is allowed to move on the road, without checking, leading to spot where arms were dropped. Even if one is a resident of a nearby village, even then he/she will be allowed to move after verifying his/ her identity properly. A massive search operation by security forces is going on in the area since early hours of Sunday," he added.

The official further said that security agencies are investigating the matter of dropping weapons from drones.

0"Investigating agencies suspect that person coming to collect weapons may be using a Pakistani SIM card as along the international border; Pakistan has kept its mobile phone signals high to enable safe-talks between handlers and those coming to collect weapons. Investigation is going on to ascertain how many mobile phones were being used in Makwal area. Therefore, entire area has sealed for the time being," he asserted.

Absconder arrested

POONCH: Police on Monday nabbed an absconder who was evading arrest since long. As per details, acting on information regarding presence of absconder in the area, Surmakote Police raided the suspected location and arrested absconder. He has been identified as Maqsood Ahmed, resident of Guntal.
