

Dr Jitendra addresses International Conference commemorating Madrid Protocol on Environment

NEW DELHI: Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh on Monday addressed the International Conference commemorating the signing of the Madrid Protocol for Environmental Protection to the Antarctic Treaty.

The conference was attended virtually by Prime Minister of the host country Spain Pedro Sanchez, Prime Minister of New Zealand Jacinda Ardern, Prime Minister of Australia James Morrison, Ministers and delegates representing the different countries signatory to the Protocol.

Dr Jitendra Singh said that India under Prime Minister Narendra Modi is committed to curtail carbon emissions in the Antarctic atmosphere. He said, India has already adopted the green energy initiative by experimenting with the feasibility of wind energy production and installed moderate output of Wind Energy Generators (WEG) on an experimental basis.

The choice of Combined Heat and Power (CHP) for Bharati station to reduce carbon emissions in the Antarctic also promotes India's pledge to protect the environment, he added.

Dr Jitendra said, India is looking forward to contributing to the evolving

ing Climate Change Response Work Programme of the Committee for Environmental Protection (CEP).

He said, Climate-induced Carbon Dioxide (CO₂) uptake by polar oceans causing acidification that destroys marine environments and ecosystems, gradually affecting fisheries, and lastly, propelling disastrous biome shifts is one of the challenges for the next 30 years. The Minister reiterated that India also anticipates tourism growth and illegal Unreported and Unregulated (IUU) fishing as potential issues.

Dr Singh said, India is committed to the comprehensive protection of the Antarctic environment and dependent ecosystems.

Dr Jitendra said, "We have completed 30 years of adoption of signing and implementation of the Madrid Protocol, which reaffirms its commitment to preserving Antarctic environmental and dependent ecosystems". Forty-two state parties acceding to the Madrid Protocol are a remarkable feat of sustainable preserving the Antarctic environment and Indian felt honoured to sign the "Protocol" in the year 1998, he added.

The Minister congratulated Spain for organizing this successful meeting

and the designation of Antarctica as a natural reserve devoted to peace and science. He said, India also reaffirms its commitment to the Protocol on Environmental Protection to the Antarctic Treaty and at this moment claims to as follows:

1. Implement all Decisions, Resolutions and Measures adopted at ATCM in the Indian Antarctic programme effectively.
2. Use green alternate energy system in both the Indian Antarctic research stations; Maitri and Bharati like solar panels and wind energy generators so compromising use of fossil fuel gradually and make station efficient with alternate green energy.
3. Reduce carbon footprints by using vehicles and machinery only when required at the most.
4. Use shared supply ship to deliver human resources, materials and machines to Antarctica.
5. Control the introduction of non-native species into Antarctica by any means or through vector transfer.

India has two active research stations; Maitri (commissioned in 1989) at Schirmacher Hills, and Bharati (commissioned in 2012) at Larsemann Hills in Antarctica. India has successfully launched 40 annual scientific expeditions to Antarctica till date. With Himadri station in Ny-Alesund, Svalbard, Arctic, India now belongs to the elite group of nations that have multiple research stations within the Polar Regions.

The Protocol on Environmental Protection to the Antarctic Treaty was signed in Madrid on October 4, 1991 and entered into force in 1998. It designates Antarctica as a "natural reserve, devoted to peace and science".

Wanchoo condemns Mattan Temple desecration, demands stringent punishment to culprits

JAMMU: Bharatiya Jana Yuva Morcha (BJYM) State Spokesperson, Chetan Wanchoo has strongly condemned the desecration of the religious place in Mattan and has demanded that the Government take immediate steps for the protection of the temples across the J&K Union Territory especially those in Kashmir Valley.

In a statement issued to media here today, Chetan Wanchoo said that this is a historical temple of Mata Barghashakha Bhagwati and vandalizing of this sacred shrine has hurt the sentiments of people of Hindu religion in general and Kashmiri Pandits in particular. Expressing utter displeasure over this, he urged the government to take steps for the protection of the temples so that such incidents do not happen again.

"It becomes the bonafide duty of the government to ensure safety and preserve the sanctity of all religious places by placing the all time protection round the clock and not only on any festival or ceremony. The latest desecration of Mattan (Martand) has hurt the sentiments of Kashmiri Hindus in particular and all Hindus in general. It may be a part of some serious designs of those outfits who intend to stall any action related with the return of displaced community," Wanchoo said, adding that this needs to be looked into from a broader horizon so that



the resentment brewing inside the community may not explode as the desecration of any religious place damages the tender fabric of secular set up adopted by the founding fathers of the Nation.

The BJYM leader stated that the Central Government is taking all possible steps for the safe return of Kashmiri Pandits to Valley besides launching a portal for the safety of property of Kashmiri Pandits. He demanded that elements responsible for the incidents should be identified and handed over stringent punishment under law.

Wanchoo however lauded the Modi Govt for working day and night to rehabilitate the KPs in Valley in a dignified manner despite all odds.

The BJYM leader appealed to the Lt Governor to intervene in the matter and take all possible steps in protecting the religious places in the Kashmir Valley. He asserted that being the Head of Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory, it became the moral responsibility of Lt Governor for safety of religious places as well as property of Kashmiri Pandits in the Kashmir Valley. He also warned that if the administration does not take any concrete action against the culprits of such desecrations, it will undoubtedly have an adverse impact on the secular fabric of the Union Territory as well as the nation.

HC rejects bail of Cross Border Narco Smuggler

JAMMU: Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul rejected the bail application of one Mohammad Tajamul Masoodi business man who was booked by the Police in Cross Border Narco Smuggling.

According to the police case that on 21st July 2017, acting on an information received from SSP, Baramulla, police party of Sub Division Uri along with security wing and Custom Department officials, deployed at TFC Salamabad for Cross LOC trade checking, recovered 1332 packets/sachets of contraband apparently Heroin/Brown Sugar, concealed/hidden in 333 suit boxes, which were carried from Chakotia Muzaffarabad in a truck bearing registration No.AJ&KXA-267, driven by one POK resident driver, namely, Syed Yousef Shah S/o Syed Ali Akbar Shah R/o Charwaya, Tehsil & District Muzaffarabad. The consignment was sent by M/s J. K. International, Muzaffarabad, to M/s Kuloo Suppliers, Srinagar and in this regard case FIR No.54/2017 was registered in police station Uri. The investigation of the case had been closed as challaned and produced before the court of Additional Sessions Judge, Baramulla, on 23rd November 2017.

As regards the present bail application of the accused, it is stated by respondents that he used to do cross LoC trade jointly with his nephew, namely, Musadiq Afzal Masoodi, and assigned him the job of crossing of vehicles at TFC Salamabad, Uri, and himself used to dispose of the material reached to him from Pak/Pok to Srinagar/Delhi/ Surat etc., with the active participation of accused, namely, Nayeen Rasool Bhat.

Justice Vinod Chatterji koul observed that at this stage prima facie for the purpose of this bail application, is unable to form the required satisfaction that there are reasonable grounds for believing that applicant is not guilty of offence and hence this Court cannot persuade itself to accede to the prayer of applicant for being enlarged on bail. Accordingly, the application for bail is rejected.

JAMMU: In compliance with order of High Court of J&K and Ladakh regarding holding of co-ordination meetings at District level, a co-ordination meeting was held on Monday in the office chamber of Principal District and Sessions Judge, Jammu which was attended by Deputy Commissioner, Jammu, Senior Superintendent of Police, Jammu, Superintendent Central Jail Kot Bhalwal, Jammu, Superintendent District Jail Amphalla, Jammu, Deputy Director Prosecution, Public Prosecutor, Additional Public Prosecutor and other stake-holders.

The meeting was convened by Chief Judicial Magistrate, Jammu who is also the Secretary of the Co-ordination Committee following directions of Principal District and Sessions Judge, Jammu.

Various issues having bearing on the administration of justice were dis-

cussed in the meeting.

Apart from security issues in District Court Complex, Jammu and peripheral courts of the District viz. JAMMU: Deputy Commissioner Jammu, Anshul Garg on Monday reviewed implementation of Mission Youth, Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojna (PMAY), e-Darpan and formulation of strategy to carry out Swachhata activities during the month of October, here in state meetings.

The DC took stock of progress made in the engagement of youth in different activities as envisaged under Mission Youth in the meeting of District Level Task Force.

Officer on Special Duty for Mission Youth, Dr Abdul Khabir gave a detailed resume on the objectives envisioned under the Mission. He apprised that Mission youth is the Apex body of the government for youth engagement and outreach in J&K and its core agenda is to positively engage youth by making them stakeholders in the development of the Union Territory.

Similarly 2000 students will be provided coaching for various competitive exams including UPSC, SSC, JKPS, JKSSB under PARVAZ, he added.

He further informed that Mission Youth will cover 5000 Diyang Youths across the UT to make them self-dependent in life in collaboration with the Social Welfare Department.

"75 Boys and 75 Girls from marginalized sections who were forced to leave their studies due to financial difficulties shall be given financial assistance upto Rs 1 lakh" he added.

In order to empower young innovators to innovate new products, services or models in any area of their interest, the

initiatives for youth with disabilities, Universities collaboration initiatives JK Super-75 (boys and girls), young innovators programs for holistic and pragmatic youth engagement and empowerment on sustainable lines.

He informed that 500 youths will be provided benefits under SAHYTA scheme which offers 15 self employment activities and assistance up to Rs 2 lakhs in two installments.

Mission Youth will provide Rs 5 lakhs per person and 50 applicants will be catered in a calendar year under Youth Innovation Program.

It was also informed that Youth clubs will be set up in each Panchayat and ULB ward comprising minimum 5 youths of that particular area and District Youth centres will also be established in each district.

The OSD said that the vision is to make Mission Youth a one-stop solution for all youth aspirations and channelise their energy in a positive direction by providing ways of livelihood generation. The Deputy Commissioner said that special training/ coaching for the girls in consultation with the Mission Youth shall also be organised in the district to help them prepare for the NDA exam. He also directed the concerned officers to generate mass awareness about the schemes being implemented by the Departments under Mission Youth so that the public can avail the benefits of the same. While reviewing the status of Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojna, the Deputy Commissioner directed the

BDOs to get the works identified by PRIs. He further asked them to make the estimates of identified works in conversion with MGNREGA and send it to DSWO for uploading the same in order to put the works in public domain.

While formulating strategy for carrying out Swachhata activities during this month, the Deputy Commissioner said that the activities have already been identified for cleanliness drive. He asked them to make the plan and carry out the activities in their respective Blocks according to the calendar. He also directed the district officers to regularly upload the status of ongoing and identified projects on e-Darpan in order to put them in public domain.

Protests held in Jammu over vandalism of temple in Kashmir

JAMMU: Protests were held in Jammu against the governor administration for allegedly failing to protect the religious places of Hindus in Kashmir after ancient Bargheshekha Bhagwati Mata Temple was vandalised by miscreants in Anantnag district.
