Centre extends LTC facility by 2 more years for its employees to visit J&K, northeast air to the northeast region

NEW DELHI: The Centre on Tuesday extended by two more years, till September 25, 2024, the facility that allows its employees to visit Jammu and Kashmir, Ladakh, Andaman and Nicobar Islands and northeast while availing leave travel concession (LTC).

The eligible central government employees get reimbursement of tickets for to and fro journeys, besides paid leave, when they avail

The scheme allowing government servants to travel by (NER), Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir (J&K). Ladakh and Andaman and Nicobar Islands (A&N) is extended for a further period of two years, September 26, 2022 till September 25, 2024, an order issued by the personnel ministry said.



Crime Branch Wing of Jammu and Kashmir Police has ordered re-investigation of major scandal of flouting municipal laws, befooling the municipality incurring loss of lakhs of rupees to the state exchequer, by Jammu-based fraudulent couple Anita Sharma municipality. and her husband Shiv Kumar

Gandhi Nagar, Jammu also known as Bunty & Bubli of town. Anita Sharma, impersonating as owner of house number 84/110-A Block (Pvt) Gandhi Nagar submitted an application before MCJ for approval of building permission on 22-08-2019 which was

entertained by municipality vide no.9820 despite the fact that she had already sold that house a year ago and had no authority on that house. It is said that the application was given with a motive to construct house no.44 D/C under the grab of showing the under process document to field staff of

During the investigations into the case when the office of Special Director General of Crime branch came to know about a certificate issued by the municipality against RTI that no building permission has been ever granted, it not only confirmed the fraud but proved municipality lost lakhs of rupees as permission fee.



Though the certificate of RTI confirmed 100 % violation the municipality with a motive to oblige Anita Sharma issued a notice of minor violation which was stayed by the Special Tribunal considering the violation

when a case was still sub-judice in the court of Special Tribunal.

It is a known fact that if a case is sub-judice in any court, it cannot be processed in any other court. But Anita Sharma hiding the fact of the case before Special Tribunal lodged the case in the court of Learned principal District Judge Jammu from where on 12-01-2022 1st Civil Subordinate Judge, Jammu an order of stay was issued on the same subject

Gandhi Nagar purchased a plot of land at 44 D/C, Gandhi Nagar on April 25, 2018 for Rs. six crores. She paid the cash vide Cheque No.029516 on April 5, 2018, Cheque No .029519 on April 12, 2018 for Rs One Crore and the third Cheque No. 029524 on April 16, 2018 for Rs 3.14 Crore. An amount of Rs 6 lakh as TDS @ 1 per cent was deducted over all

cheques payable at YES Bank, Gandhi Nagar, Jammu

After purchase of the property, the owner Anita Sharma applied to Jammu Municipal Corporation for Building Permission on August 22, 2019, which had already been sold to someone vide two sale deeds. However with malafide intention to commit fraud, the site for the proposed construction was reflected Plot No.84/110-A Block (Pvt) Gandhi Nagar Jammu instead of Plot No 44/DC Gandhi

As expected, Jammu Municipal Corporation rejected the application of Anita Sharma, seeking building permission, on February **■ CONTD ON PAGE 9**

Kansal compliments College of Education Srinagar, **GDC Khour for excellent NAAC Scores**

SRINAGAR: The Principal Secretary Higher Education Department Rohit Kansal on Tuesday complimented the Government College of Education Srinagar, Islamia College of Science and Commerce Srinagar and Government Degree College Khour, Jammu on their excellent performance in the accreditation gradings.

The GCOE Srinagar has been Accredited with an A grade with a CGPA of 3.24. The grading is valid for 5 years. The GDC Khour has scored a CGPA of 2.68 and has been graded as B+. The autonomous status of the Islamia College too has been extended. In a message Kansal made a special men-



tion of the efforts of the Director Colleges as well as Principals of these colleges and their entire staff.

Following a vigorous effort by the Higher Education Department, as many as 52 degree colleges have so far been accredited under the National Assessment and Accreditation exercise conducted by the National Assessment

Council (NAAC). While 4 colleges have secured 'A' grading, 1 college has secured B++ grading and 10 colleges 'B+' grading. As many as 26 colleges have completed the formalities and are awaiting formal inspection and award of grades. Kansal reiterated that the Higher Education Department was determined to ensure that all eligible degree colleges get NAAC accredited this year.
