CRIME REPORT

4 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern the menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which dedicated police team of Police Station Kahnachak and Police Post Chatha acted stringently on the specific inputs and raided at different location in their respective areas and seized 4 vehicles involved in illegal mining.

The seized vehicles included 2 Tractor bearing Chassis Nos. QRTE30605020494 and MBNAK49ADMTL51142 seized by Kahnachak Police and two tractor-trolleys (JK02CV-8778 and JK02AX-6235) seized by Chatha Police.

The recoveries were made by SHO Kahnachak Insp Rahul Mahajan and Incharge Police Post Chatha PSI Harjinder Paul Singh in their respective jurisdictions.

Bootlegger nabbed, 30 bottles of illicit liquor recovered

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday nabbed a bootlegger and recovered 30 bottles of illicit liquor from his possession. As per details, a team of Police Station Kahna Chak under the supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh led by SHO Kahna Chak Insp Rahul Mahajan raided a place and rounded up a suspect later identified Parshotam Lal, son of Ram Saran, resident of Purkhoo, Bhalwal.

During search, 30 bottles of illicit liquor were recovered from his possession. He was arrested and FIR No.125/2022 under section 48(f) of Excise Act was registered against him at Police Station Kahnachak.

20 bovines rescued

JAMMU: Acting tough against bovine smugglers and to curb bovine smuggling menace, Police on Tuesday rescued 15 bovines.

As per details, a team of Police Post Chowki Choura constituted under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Mohan Lal and led by SHO Police Station Akhnoor Insp Harjeet Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Chowki Choura PSI Pankaj Katoch while on Naka duty intercepted a vehicle (JK03E-7185) which was carrying 15 bovines.

Accordingly, FIR under relevant sections was registered at Police Station Akhnoor. Meanwhile, Samba Police also rescued 5 bovines from a truck (JK08G-9685), however driver managed to flee from the spot.

Missing minor recovered from Haryana

Warrant against drug-peddler booked in PIT NDPS Act executed

Thief arrested; 3 quintals of stolen electric wire recovered

After fulfilling all legal formalities, the duo minors were handed over to their parents.

2 arrested, 2 vehicles seized for illegal extraction and transportation of minerals

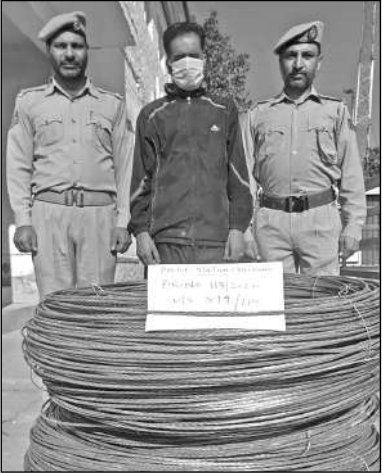
As per the details, a party from Police Post Hardipanzoo Beerwah at a checkpoint established at Wacho Crossing intercepted 2 tippers bearing registration numbers JK02Q-8971 and JK03A-1808 loaded with illegally extracted soil. Both vehicles were seized and drivers identified as Ishfaq Ahmad Sheikh, son of Ghulam Mohammad Sheikh and Mudasir Ahmed Baba, son of Mohammad Yousuf Baba, both residents of Muqaam Waterhail were also arrested. Accordingly, FIR No. 147/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Beerwah and further investigation started.

ARTO Doda suspends 9 DLs for violating rules, Rs 1,83,000 fine imposed

BHADARWAH: While giving a strong message to traffic violators, ARTO Doda suspended 9 driving licenses and imposed Rs 1,83,000 as fine. According to reports, the ARTO Doda suspended

Driving Licenses of 9 persons for using cell-phone while driving and Rs 1,83,000 (Rs One lakh eighty thousand only) was imposed as Fine. Er Kuldeep Singh ARTO Doda along with his team including MV Inspector Jasbir Singh and others launched an extensive checking drive of vehicles on different routes including National Highway NH-244. During the drive, about 158 vehicles were checked and 20 vehicles were Challenged for dif-



ferent Traffic Violations. ARTO Doda Er Kuldeep Singh said that one vehicle was seized for plying without documents and nine drivers were found using cell-phone while driving and some 2-Wheeler Drivers were found riding without Wearing Helmet. "The Licensing Authority Doda and Licenses issued by other Licensing Authorities were recommended for Suspension," ARTO informed, adding that an amount of Rs 1,83,000 was also recovered as fine during the drive. The team also includes Surinder Kumar, Amreek Singh, Irfan ul Haq, Pritam Singh and Mohd Azim.

FSSA violation: Rs 33,000 fine imposed on 6 FBOs

KISHTWAR: The Court of Adjudicating Officer (Additional District Magistrate), Kishtwar Kishori Lal Sharma on Tuesday imposed a fine of Rs 33,000 on six Food Business Operators including retailers and suppliers for violating prescribed provisions/norms of Food Safety and Standard Act 2006 & Rules and Regulations 2011 made there under. The complaints have been filed before the Court of Adjudicating Officer/ADM Kishtwar against the FBOs who have violated provisions of FSSA. The court has served the summons to both parties included in the complaint/ease. The parties appeared before the court where Adjudicating Officer Kishtwar heard concerned Food Safety Officer and Non-Complainants. The non-complainants party was found guilty of violating the provisions of 26(2)/51/52 of FSSA, on which Adjudicating Officer Kishtwar imposed a fine of Rs 33,000 under general provision 49 of FSS Act-2006 to 6 Food Business Operators (Non-Complainants) on them.

Two theft cases solved, 4 arrested, stolen jewellery, goods recovered

BARI-BRAHMANA: Police on Tuesday solved two burglary cases by arresting 2 accused and recovered stolen diamond and golden jewellery and other goods.

As per details, on September 8, 2022, a written complaint was lodged at Police Station Bari Brahmana by one Nitesh Kumar, son of Suresh Kumar, resident of Sarore Sukhiani Talab, Tehsil Bari Brahmana stating therein that some burglars struck his house and decamped with diamond & golden jewellery items. Acting over complaint, FIR No. 189/2022 under sections 454 & 380 of IPC was registered at Police Station Bari Brahmana and investigation started. Accordingly, a team of Police Station Bari Brahmana headed by SHO Inspr Inderpal Singh under the supervision of Dy SP Hqrs Samba Mohd. Usman (I/C SDPO Bari Brahmana) conducted raids at various suspicious areas and rounded up suspects for questioning. During investigation, suspects namely Kamaljeet Singh, son of Harbhjan Singh, resident of Sarore Bari Brahmana and Rohit Kumar, son of Roop Lal, resident of Sarore Bari-Brahmana were arrested in case. On their disclosure, Police Party recovered stolen diamond/ golden jewellery items.

In another instance, on September 10, 2022, a written complaint was lodged at Police Station Bari Brahmana by one Vishal Ditta, son of late Rajinder Kumar, resident of New Rehari, Jammu regarding theft of material used for construction of 220 KV LILO Jatwal to Gladni Transmission Line. Acting over the complaint, FIR No. 192/2022 under section 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Bari Brahmana and investigation started. A team of Police Station Bari Brahmana headed by SHO Bari Brahmana, Inspr Inderpal Singh assisted by PSI Anjum Hussain under the supervision of Dy SP Hqrs Samba, Mohd Usman (Incharge SDPO Bari Brahmana) after putting in strenuous efforts, developed some leads and arrested 2 suspects namely Mohd Aslam, son of Rehmat Ali, resident of Sidhra Majeen, Tehsil Nagrota and Mohd Sadiq, son of Nazir Ahmed, resident of Batra Tehsil, Nagrota. On their disclosure, stolen items were also recovered.

Police detains JK Apni Party leader Nisha Kumari, released later

R S PURA: On instructions of Tehsildar R S Pura, senior leader of Jammu and Kashmir Apni Party Nisha Kumari was taken into custody by police on Tuesday. However, she was released after intervention of lawyers who came in his support.

According to information received, Advocate Nisha Kumari reached the Tehsildar's office leading a delegation of Panchayat Malikpur. During meeting, a dispute erupted between Tehsildar and Advocate Nisha Kumari over some issue, after which Tehsildar R S Pura complained to the police. A police team reached the spot and took advocate Nisha Kumari into custody. During this, the supporters of Advocate Nisha Kumari also started raising slogans against Tehsildar R S Pura.

On this occasion, Advocate Nisha Kumari told that she had reached Tehsildar R S Pura office with a delegation regarding problem of street construction work in village Malikpur, during which her demands were ignored and she was taken into custody. She said that due to the suspension of construction work of the street, there is a lot of dirt and people are falling prey to diseases, but despite this, concerned administration and officials are taking no steps in this direction.
