It is worthwhile to mention here that to control & curb menace of food adulteration and malpractices, there is clear-cut directions to all shopkeepers from FDA J&K to refrain from malpractices and ensure safe, quality, pure and wholesome food to public. MJR-47 welcomes Govt's step regarding regularisation of Bastis

JAMMU: Movement for Justice for Refugees of 1947 from PoJK- DPs (MJR-47) has welcomed the recent step of Government for regularisation of Bastis where PoJK DPs are residing since 1950. In a press statement issued here on Tuesday, Convener MJR-47, J S Sudan said that MJR-47 has been constantly requesting the Central Government for settlement of all issues of PoJK DPs, as recommended by Parliamentary Standing Committee on Home Affairs like political representation by allocating 8-10 assembly seats, disbursement of Rs 30 lakh per family, regularisation of Bastis where PoJK DPs are residing, reservation in Technical Institutions, jobs etc. "Central Govt after coming into power has shown

concern towards the apathy of PoJK DPs and considered various aspects like disbursement of relief amount, appointment of Delimitation Commission, effective steps towards regularisation of Bastis all along IB and LOC where PoJK DPs are residing etc. This step of regularisation of Bastis will not only give ownership rights but also give them an opportunity to construct, sell, mortgage and settle family issues etc of their property with a sense of security. This is the most welcome and a historic step of the government showing concern towards all sections of people," he added. Sudan further urged Government to fulfill all other demands of PoJK DPs for mitigating their sufferings, which they are facing from last more than 74 years.

Sikh organisations highlight demands

JAMMU: A Joint Press conference organized by Jammu and Kashmir Shiromani Akalidial under an amalgam of various Sikh Organizations J&K and Darbinder Singh President Shiromani Akali Dal Jammu and Kashmir state .

In the press conference addressed by various Sikh organizations under the chairmanship of Darbinder Singh President Shiromani Akali Dal Jammu and Kashmir, the speakers expressed their anguish for ignoring their genuine demands. They said that the Sikh community of Jammu and Kashmir mostly refugees, after migration during partition in 1947, settled in Jammu and Kashmir Provinces in seat-

tered areas. These Refugees are originally Paharis from POJK and their language is also Pahari which is crystal clear from their Revenue records and as such they genuinely deserve the Pahari Status, speakers said. They resented that in spite of their consistent demand, they have not been given the Pahari Status.

In previous visit of Jammu and Kashmir by Home Minister Amit Shah when he attended the meeting of Sikh Community at Digiana Ashram Jammu, a memorandum of demands of Sikh Community was submitted under the patronage of Mahant Manjit Singh Ji of Dera Nagali Sahib when the community was assured for the positive consideration but the same was totally

ignored. The Sikh organizations were in a hope that Home Minister shall announce something for minorities as well as refugees migrated from pahari region of POJK , but nothing has been announced. The Sikh community feels disappointed that why the Government is non-serious towards Sikhs while Sikhs stands with nation at all odds and evens and sacrifices.

The speakers have again appealed to the Government to look into the genuine demands of the Sikh Community which include Pahari Status for Refugees, balance amount of Rs 24.50 lakh package for Refugees of 1947, 8 Assembly seats and 2 Parliament seats out of those freed for POKJ and Punjabi language.
