"An integrated system and strategic plan is necessary for the empowerment of farmers, women and youth", the Lieutenant Governor said here while chairing a high level meeting to review the developmental scenario in the Bandipora District, adding that: "Our efforts must enhance their potential and progressively transform their lives."

The Lt Governor appraised implementation progress of Central and the UT Government schemes and developmental projects on the ground.



HCs can order further investigation, re-probe under CrPC in criminal cases: SC

DELHI: Supreme Court Wednesday said the high courts can order further probe or reinvestigation in a criminal case to secure the ends of iustice even after the charge sheet has been filed and the trial court has failed to order such a probe.

A bench of justices Dinesh Maheswari and Aniruddha Bose was dealing with the legal question as to whether a high court, in exercise of its inherent powers under section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC), was justified in directing a

magistrate to order further investigation when the trial court did not adopt such process after filing of the charge sheet in a criminal case.

Even when the basic power to direct further investigation in a case where a chargesheet has been filed is with the Magistrate, and is to be exercised subject to the limitations of Section 173(8) CrPC, in an appropriate case, where the High Court feels that the investigation is not in the proper direction and to do complete justice where the facts of the
