# Management of solid waste: DB seeks details of steps taken for implementation of action plan

JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court directed Commissioner, Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC); Commissioner, Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC); Director, Jammu/ Srinagar to inform the Court regarding details of steps taken for implementation of action plan for management of solid waste in their respective jurisdictions. The Division Bench comprising Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey and Justice Moksha Khajuria Qazmi while hearing a Public Interest Litigation (PIL), observed that in terms of Order dated August 12, 2022, the Principal Secretary to Government, Housing and Urban Development Department, J&K Government, was directed to file personal affidavit indicating compliance of each and every order, so far passed by the Court in the matter from time to time. In compliance to that Principal Secretary to Government, Housing and Urban Development Department, J&K Government filed an Affidavit, wherein the scheme of disposal of municipal solid waste in

terms of the Solid Waste Management Rules and Bye-Laws is stated to have been undertaken having reference to collection, segregation, storage, transportation and disposal of municipal solid waste. "In paragraph 6 of the Affidavit, reference is made to the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 notified on April 8, 2016 by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India which assigns the duty/ responsibility to various Ministries of Central Government/ State Government, Central Pollution Control Board and State Pollution Control Boards, District Magistrates, local authorities, Village Panchayats, Industrial Units and Waste General units, etc. It is also stated in the Affidavit that State Policy and Solid Waste Management Strategy, 2017 has been notified on January 25, 2018 with direction to the Director, Urban Local Bodies, Jammu/ Kashmir to circulate the policy among Chief Executive Officer/ Executive Officers of Municipal Committees/ Councils for implementation of the same and furnish monthly compliance report to the Administrative Department. Besides, the policy was uploaded on the website of the

Housing and Urban Development Department for perusal of the public at large," the Court observed.

Further, on examination of the submitted affidavit, DB felt that much more practical steps are required to be taken by the concerned authorities in the Government of Union Territory for dealing with the process of solid waste management inasmuch as the contents of the Affidavit clearly appear to be confined to paper work only at this stage. DB directed Commissioner, Jammu, Municipal Corporation; Commissioner, Srinagar Municipal Corporation; Director, Urban Local Bodies, Jammu/ Srinagar; and Director, Rural Development Department, Jammu/ Srinagar to inform the Court as to the steps taken for purpose of implementation of the action plan for management of solid waste in their respective jurisdiction. The court also directed the Commissioner-Secretary to Government, Health and Medical Education Department to file affidavit detailing out the steps taken for segregation, collection and transportation of solid and medical waste from the Hospitals of Union Territory of J&K and other associated Hospitals.

JKPCC President expressed confidence over the enthusiasm found in the delegates with regard to upcoming Presidential elections and said Congress is the only party which believes in internal democracy, so the elections are being held shortly the delegates across the country would
