It is pertinent to mention that The Electricity (Amendment) Bill 2022 had been sent to standing committee of parliament on energy after uproar across the country against the various provisions of the Bill in August 2022.

JKEEGA demanded that the Bill should not be rushed through and instead the standing committee on energy of Parliament should invite the stakeholders and particularly the National coordination committee of Electricity Employees and Engineers (NCCOEE) besides hundreds of Power employees and engineers from all the districts of Jammu and representatives of Kashmir Province to discuss the provisions of the Bill.

They urge the Government of India and standing committee on energy to hold wider discussions with all the stakeholders on Electricity Amendment Bill 2022.
