Govt to extend Rs 2 lakh insurance cover to entire workforce: LG

SRINAGAR: Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Monday issued directions to extend Rs 2 Lakh insurance cover to entire workforce including those in the unorganized sector.

"The premium of the insurance would be borne by the Department of Labour and Employment", the Lieutenant Governor said while chairing a review meeting of Labour & Employment Department at the Civil Secretariat.

He said the government is

committed for social and economic justice to workforce in the unorganized sector and every effort are being made to protect the interest of labour, their welfare, necessary skill development to improve the capability.

Appraising the function of the department, the Lt Governor stressed that dedicated efforts be made to satiate self employment schemes, and asked the department for organizing a mega job fair each at Jammu and Srinagar.

Enquiring about the steps

put in place by the department to ensure there is no bonded labour and child labour case in J&K, the Lt Governor asked the Department to ensure J&K is free from bonded labour and child labour by regular inspections and conducting surveys. He directed for starting a help line for unorganized workforce.

"Department must ensure there is no case of exploitation of unorganized workers. Proper employment planning and flexibility in labour deployment in the backdrop

of changing market conditions should be the priority," said the Lt Governor.

The Lt Governor impressed upon the senior officers of the Labour and Employment Department for the welfare and support of the unorganized workforce and their children.

"Health, safety and social security benefits like financial assistance should be top priority. Department should also ensure that all possible assistance for children's education and scholarships is extended within a fixed timeline," the Lt Governor directed the officers.

Reviewing the Employment Sector of the Department, the Lt Governor emphasized on integrated planning by bringing all departments on a single platform and working in convergence for effective and efficient employment related services. Facilitate employment opportunities through

DGP Lohia's suspicious murder; domestic help to undergo narco analysis test

JAMMU: The Special Crime Branch Wing of Jammu and Kashmir Police, investigating the Director General Prison Hemant Kumar Lohia's suspicious murder case, is contemplating to have narco analysis test of the main accused Yasir Ahmad—the domestic help, who was killed in the brutal killing.

Hemant Kumar Lohia was found murdered at the house of his friend in Udhaywala area falling under the jurisdiction of Domana Police

Station. Reliable sources informed that the CB investigators have also got recorded the statement of the accused in the court under Section 164 IPC. He is reported to have given the consent, which is mandatory, for narco analysis.

Investigations, into the suspicious murder of Hemant

Lohia, DG Prisons J&K, was transferred to the Special Crime Wing of Jammu and Kashmir Police. On October 3, Lohia was found murdered in a house at Udhaywala on Gajansoo Resort in Jammu on late Monday night. Yasir Ahmed, the 23-year-old domestic helper, was arrested after a massive manhunt by the J&K Police on October 4. Lohia remained on central

deputation for quite a long period but returned to Jammu-Kashmir in February 2022 in the rank of Additional Director General of Police and was posted as Commandant General in Home Guards/Civil Defence/ State Disaster Response Force (SDRF). Later, he was promoted to Director General of Police and was posted as DG Prisons in August 2022.

Examining the scene of crime with forensic experts,

Centre okays lowering cut-off marks by 25 percentile for admission to 2022-23 PG Medical courses

NEW DELHI: The Centre on Monday approved lowering the cut-off marks for admission to PG medical courses for 2022-23 while taking into consideration that a large number of seats had gone vacant in the PG counselling held for the last academic session.

The reduction in cut-off marks will be by 25 percentile across all categories, official sources told PTI.

The decision has been taken based on recommendations by the National

Medical Commission (NMC), they said.

Around 1,400 seats had remained vacant mainly in pre- and para-clinical subjects in the last session, the sources said.

"Since such post-graduate seats going vacant is a sheer wastage of resources in a country where postgraduate medical seats are premium, a decision to reduce cut-off for admission to post-graduate courses for 2022-23 by 25

percentile across all categories has been taken,"
