JAMMU: Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) in collaboration with CoE Chandigarh and Jammu schools organized a National Conference on Inclusive Education on 21st and 22nd Oct 2022 at Teachers' Bhawan, Gandhi Nagar, Jammu.

The two day-long conference aimed at Inclusive Education focusing that all students, irrespective of any changes they may have, are placed in age-appropriate general education classes to receive high quality instruction, interventions and support that enable them to meet success in the core curriculum.

The programme began with the kindling of the auspicious lamp of knowledge and wisdom, the students of Jammu Sanskriti School presented the Saraswati Vandana followed by a welcome song by

the students of Model Academy School, Jammu.

The inaugural session commenced with the welcome address by Dr Ram Shankar, Director Training CBSE.

He, in his address welcomed the Chief Guest, the chairperson CBSE Nidhi Chhibber, Ravinder Kumar Sinha, the Vice Chancellor SMVDU Katra, as the Guest of Honour, Dr Ravi Shankar Sharma, Director School Education Jammu (DSEJ), Renu Gupta, Director MIER Group of education, all the teachers and heads of various schools across the country, briefly introducing the elaborate audience about the two day long programme.

Opening remarks were delivered by the Chairperson CBSE Nidhi Chhibber, who, highlighted the importance of Inclusive Education (IE) which is a

new approach towards educating children with disability and learning difficulties with that of normal ones under the same roof.

She stressed upon bringing all students together in one classroom and community regardless of their strengths or weakness in any area, and sought to maximize the potential of all students.

Ravinder Kumar Sinha, Vice Chancellor SMVDU Katra in his key note address enlightened everyone on successful inclusive education that happens primarily through accepting, understanding, and attending to student differences and diversity, which can include physical, cognitive, academic, social and emotional.

Schools in collaboration with CBSE on inclusive education which is the need of the present society.
