Values inculcated by...

The PM said Lord Ram's ideals are a beacon of light for people aspiring for a developed India in next 25 years and give the "courage to achieve the most difficult goals".

Asserting that a picture of Lord Ram, his brother Lakshman and Mother Sita is inscribed on the original copy of the Constitution, he said, "That is another guarantee of our constitutional rights."

He, however, stressed that more the resolve of performing duties is strengthened, the more the concept of Ram Rajya will be realised.

"We will have to reiterate our resolve. We have to learn as much as we can from Shri Ram," he said.

The prime minister also said he got the deity's "darshan" due to his blessings.

"I am happy that people of Ayodhya, entire UP and world are witnessing this event. As we are celebrating 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsava', the determination like Lord Ram will take the country to new heights," he said referring to the Deepotsav celebrations.

This was the sixth edition of Deepotsav, organised every year by the Yogi Adityanath government the day before Diwali. Around 15.76 lakh diyas were lit on the banks of the Saryu during the celebrations, a Guinness World Record.

The PM was welcomed by Governor Anandiben Patel and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on his arrival.

Immediately after reaching Ayodhya for the celebrations, the PM went to the makeshift Ram temple and offered prayers to Ram Lalla. He lit an earthen lamp there and performed an "aarti".

Modi was also briefed by officials on the construction going on for a grand Ram temple at the site.

PM Modi also witnessed a 3-D holographic projection mapping show at Ram ki Paidi, along with a grand musical laser show.

Earlier in the day, artistes enacting the roles of Lord Ram, his brother Lakshman and Goddess Sita descended from a "pushpak vimana", a helicopter, at the Ram Katha Park.

They were received by Governor Anandiben Patel, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and his deputies Keshav Prasad Maurya and Brajesh Pathak.

Ayodhya divisional commissioner Navdeep Rinwa had earlier said more than 15 lakh earthen lamps will be lit as part of the Deepotsav celebrations by over 22,000 volunteers at Ram ki Paidi near the Saryu bank. The rest will be placed at important intersections and spots in the town.

Five animated tableaux and 11 Ramlila tableaux showcasing dance forms from

different states will also be presented during the Deepotsav.

ISRO renames GSLV...

orbits of 36 OneWeb satellites on Sunday.

"Earlier, the launch vehicles were named for a specific purpose, such as PSLV for putting polar satellites in orbit or GSLV for geostationary satellites, a senior ISRO official said.

"The rocket no longer goes only to the geosynchronous orbit. A rocket can go anywhere, it does not have a fixed orbit to go anywhere -- GEO (Geosynchronous Earth Orbit), MEO (Medium Earth Orbit), LEO (Low Earth Orbit), the official said.

The decision to rename the rocket was to remove the confusion regarding the type of orbits identified for launch.

"A GSLV for the GEO orbit will continue to be called so, but the GSLV-Mark III has been renamed as LVM3. The LVM3 will go everywhere -- GEO, MEO, LEO, missions to the moon, sun, the official said.

GSLV Mark-III or LVM3 was used to launch the Chandrayaan-2 mission to the moon in 2019, which was the first operational flight of the rocket.

LVM3 was used to put 36 OneWeb satellites into orbit on Sunday and will also be used for a similar mission next year.

Lease deeds have been executed in favour of 260 applicants while 1,230 acres of land have so far been allotted to prospective unit holders. These unit holders have in turn deposited a sum of Rs 217 crore into the government exchequer as their lease dues, he added.

As per details, on October 16, 2022 inquest proceedings under section 174 CrPC into suspicious death of one Shalla were initiated at Police Post Ghordi.

Thereafter, accused grabbed the woman, beat her and tied a scarf around her neck and then hanged her in room to project her killing as a suicide. The inquest proceeding was converted into FIR No. 137/2022 under section 302 of IPC at Police Station Ramnagar and accused namely Parma was arrested by police. Further investigation of case has been entrusted to Insp Pushpinder Singh SHO Ramnagar.

Admn must gear up to overcome rising Dengue cases challenge: Danish

JAMMU: Danish Mishra, Co-Incharge Social Media Department and Prabhari Jammu Poonch Lok Sabha Seat, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Jammu and Kashmir, while expressing concern over the rising dengue cases across the Union Territory especially in Jammu, has urged the authorities in the Health Department to gear up to overcome the imminent challenge of this disease in the coming days so that there is least chance of the spread of this deadly disease and taking a serious turn.

In a statement issued to media persons here today, the BJP leader said that the reports reveal that about 90 per cent cases of Dengue are from Jammu district alone which is quite a worrisome fact and craves immediate attention of the concerned departments of the Union Territory Administration. He said that as per the official reports this year there have been 3600 reported cases of Dengue in J&K till date with five deaths, but the figures could be on the

upper side as there is apprehension of much more cases having gone unreported.

Danish said that this disease being spread by the specific species of mosquitoes, can be prevented from further spreading by leaving no scope for stagnation of any type of water that provides a healthy breeding ground for the mosquitoes. While the people need to proactively ensure that they don't have stagnant water in their respective areas, at the same time the Municipal Corporation and other local bodies have to be on the front-line in this campaign by intensifying the fogging drives in every nook and corner of habitations across Jammu District, the senior BJP leader asserted.

Danish Mishra appealed to the Administration headed by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha to rise to the occasion and put its men and machinery especially belonging to the concerned departments on an alert standby mode to cope up with any serious eventuality due to this fast spreading disease and overcome the challenge.
