## J&K Bank to complete transfer of Rs 960 cr NPAs to NARCL by October-end

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir Bank will put up for sale non-performing assets to the tune of Rs 960 crore, as part of its efforts to improve its balance sheet, sources in the bank said.

The bank is hoping that the process of sale of these non-performing assets to the National Asset

Reconstruction Company Limited (NARCL) will be completed by the end of this month, the sources said.

Of the six accounts, the JK Bank has an exposure of Rs 230 crore in the now-bankrupt Reliance Naval and Engineering Limited, Rs 188 crore in Jaypee Infratech, Rs 176 crore
