Jammu and Kashmir Bank's Rs 960 crore NPAs are part of the Rs 9,234 crore bad assets of the Public Sector Undertaking (PSU) lenders that the NARCL has offered to buy at Rs 3,570 crore in the first phase.

The proceeds from the sale of the NPAs, which the NARCL is doing on 15-85 basis over a period of five years, will aid Jammu and Kashmir bank's plans to raise capital for its foray into markets beyond the union territory of Ladakh and Jammu and Kashmir:

The bank has set a goal of raising Rs 2,000 crore capital by the end of the current fiscal to fuel its expansion plans.

The bank has started 27 new business initiatives over the past five months while making gold loans available at 152 of its branches. It has also opened cluster offices in Mohali, Lucknow and Bengaluru.

The bank declared Q2 results earlier this week, which showed an increase of net profits to Rs 243 crore, up by 119 per cent on a year-on-year basis.

The good performance of the bank has also been reflected in the price of its shares on the stock exchange. The JK Bank share has witnessed an appreciation of 33 per cent in its value over the past 30 days.

terrorist. However, taking advantage of the darkness, the other terrorist managed to flee to PoJK side," he added.

In a search operation launched at the site this morning, one AK series rifle, two pistols and a large quantity of ammunition and war-like stores were recovered, according to the statement.

Timely action and close coordination between the Indian Army, the Jammu and Kashmir Police and other intelligence agencies led to foiling of the infiltration attempt and potential threat to peace in the hinterland, the spokesperson said.

"Continued engagements along the Line of Control are uncanny reminders of efforts by Pakistan to infuse terrorism in Kashmir and disrupt peace and harmony while putting on the facade of ceasefire understanding," he said.

He said the search operation turned into an encounter after the terrorists opened fire on the security forces who retaliated. No casualties have been reported in the encounter so far, the official added.

## J&K Govt asks Mehbooba to vacate Fairview residence by or before Nov 15

SRINAGAR: The Jammu & Kashmir Government has asked PDP president and former Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti to vacate her Fairview residence by or before November 15, saying the reply furnished by her in response to the eviction notice served to her on October 15 doesn't justify retaining of the accommodation.

The Jammu & Kashmir's Estates Department has asked Mehbooba Mufti and other occupants of the Fairview residence to vacate the accommodation by or before November 15. "Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred under sub-section (1) of section 5 of The Jammu and Kashmir Public Premises (Eviction of Unauthorized Occupants) Act, 1988, I, hereby, order that Ms. Mehbooba Mufti, ex-chief minister and all persons who may be in occupation of scheduled premises or any part thereof to vacate the scheduled premises on

or before 15.11.2022," reads the order.

"In the event of refusal or failure to comply with this order within the period specified, provisions of sub-section (2) of section 5 of The Jammu and Kashmir Public Premises (Eviction of Unauthorized Occupants) Act, 1988 shall be invoked against you and every such person occupying the scheduled premises," it further states.

In the order, the Estates Department has said that the grounds raised by her in reply to the eviction notice don't justify her retaining the scheduled accommodation, particularly against the backdrop of the fact that the Government has communicated in writing its willingness to provide her an alternate accommodation, on security or any other ground (s).

According to the order, the Government didn't give any extension to Mehbooba Mufti to retain the accommodation beyond

December 31, 2018.

The order states that the legal provision under which ex-CMs were entitled to various facilities including "rent-free residential accommodation" was repealed by the Government of India in 2020.

"Section 3(C) of The Jammu and Kashmir State Legislature Members' Pension Act, 1984 where under Ex-Chief Ministers were entitled to various facilities including "Rent free Residential Accommodation" stands omitted by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, (Department of Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh Affairs) in "Jammu & Kashmir Re o r g a n i z a t i o n (Adaptation of State Laws) Order, 2020" issued vide Notification S.O. No. 1229(E) dated 31, March 2020, which means you are no longer entitled to retain the government accommodation in the capacity of ex-chief minister," reads the order.

## Rajnath, Army Chief to attend Infantry Day anniversary event in J&K today

SRINAGAR: Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande will attend an event in Jammu and Kashmir on Thursday to mark the 75th anniversary of Infantry Day, officials said on Wednesday.

Infantry Day is celebrated to commemorate the arrival of Indian Army at Budgam airfield on October 27, 1947,

to protect Jammu and Kashmir from Pakistani forces. It was the first military operation of Independent India.

The Army landed at the airfield after the 'instrument of accession' was signed on October 26, 1947, between the then Maharaja of Jammu and Kashmir Hari Singh and the Union of India.

Some of the key scenes of the historic Budgam landings are scheduled to be reenacted, among other events planned to be held on Thursday to mark the landmark occasion. "The defence minister and the Army chief will take part in the Infantry Day anniversary event in Jammu and Kashmir tomorrow. And, a number of other top officers of the armed forces will also be present," a senior official said on Wednesday.

In New Delhi, Chief of Defence Staff Gen Anil Chauhan will lay a wreath at the National War Memorial to commemorate the historic

day, he said.

The reenactment of the historic event (Budgam landings) to be organised at Old Air Field, Srinagar; is to pay obeisance to the brave soldiers and people of Jammu and Kashmir who laid down their lives, and also to honour the next of kin of war heroes who participated in the 1947-48 war; another official said.

The Budgam landings were the first military operations of Independent India, and Thursday will mark the 75th anniversary of the key event.

Under command of Lieutenant Colonel Devan Ranjit Rai, who later laid down his life at Baramulla, changed the course of the war, wherein people and soldiers of State Forces of Jammu and Kashmir and the Indian Army fought alongside valiantly, to evict Pakistani forces, driving them out of most of Jammu and Kashmir till ceasefire on January 5, 1949, the Army had earlier said.

A commemorative postage stamp and coin dedicated to the saint was also released

on Wednesday. Paying tributes to the saint, Modi said when the world is experiencing the crisis of war, terror and violence and is looking for inspiration to break out of this vicious circle, ancient traditions and philosophy coupled with the power of today's India is turning out to be a big hope. He said the path shown by Surishwar and the teachings of Jain gurus is the solution to these global crises. Mahatma Gandhi had also adopted the path of 'aparigraha' as laid down by Jain gurus, he said. Also recalling Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the prime minister said Gujarat has given two Vallabhs' to the country and noted that Patel's birth anniversary will

The accused persons were arrested on the spot and contraband item along with Tractor-Trolley was also seized.
