He also inspected the Rural Haat setup by the Rural Development Department.

Interacting with SHGs, he said that Rural Haats should become a permanent feature for marketing of their products.

Regarding the upcoming Back to Village program, the DC said focus has to be on ensuring that all stakeholders can voice their opinion regarding development activities and implementation of schemes.

He said that the visiting officers have been deployed to ensure that they can voice the genuine issues being raised by people in a transparent manner so that effective solutions can be undertaken as well as to review the implementation of welfare measures on the ground and identify gap areas. He appealed to the people to come forward and participate enthusiastically in the program.

Speaking about involvement of youth, the DC said that youth have an important say in the course of development. He said that youth clubs must highlight youth centric issues in the upcoming B2V4 program.

Interacting with the sarpanches and panches, DC said that PRIs must lead

from the front to keep their panchayats garbage free, clean and should conduct regular gram sabhas for proper projection of their genuine demands.

The DC visited Multi-Purpose Stadium at Bijbehara where the 23rd District SQAY championship had been organized. He felicitated the participants. At the occasion, the participants displayed their skills in martial arts and Yoga.

Dr Basharat said that students are taking interest in various sports activities which will help them in development of physique and mental health besides and keep them at bay from drug menace and other social evils.

The DC also visited Nipura and Panzeth in Qazigund block and reviewed the preparations for B2V4, took stock of registrations under self-employment schemes and other activities undertaken as part of Jan Abhiyan.

## Promotion of homestay tourism will boost local economy: Col Mahan

BASOHLI: J&K Tourism Department is making all consistent efforts to promote Homestay Concept of tourism in hilly area of District Kathua. In spite of huge potential of tourism in Hilly region of Kathua, footfall has been drastically low, mostly owing to poor connectivity and lack of tourism infrastructure especially lodging, dining and basic facilities.

A team of the Tourism Department led by Neha Mahajan, Deputy Director

Tourism Planning, Dr Rajesh Raina District Tourism Officer along with other officials visited Basohli today and organised an awareness camp to promote the Homestay concept of tourism in District Kathua.

Col Mahan Singh along with BDC Chairperson Sushma Jamwal, MC Basohli President Sumesh Spolial, ADC & CEO Basohli-Bani Tourism Development Authority and others, mostly youth attended the event.

Neha Mahajan, Deputy Director, Planning, Tourism Department briefed the gathering about the concept of homestay tourism and explained components of government assistance and subsidies available for households offering their houses

for the stay of tourists.

Speaking on the occasion, DDC Chairman Col Mahan Singh said that Homestays are important community-based tourism products. They are a rapidly emerging form of tourism accommodation services, providing economic benefits to host families and communities through the use of family homes as traditional lodgings. He asserted that locals must come forward to avail this opportunity for promoting their income and doing yeoman service to develop the tourism industry in their own region.

He also urged upon the requirement of basic services such as wayside amenities, waste management facility, bio-toilets, solar lighting and improvement of connectivity

including developing Basohli-Jandrola-Sananghat-Dharmshapur as tourist circuit in Basohli Sub District.

"There is a need to dovetail local Handloom and Basohli Painting with the tourism industry to harness optimum potential of the tourism in Basohli region" said Col Mahan.

The DDC Chairman appreciated the initiative of J&K UT Government to post dedicated CEOs for Bani-Basohli & Billawar-Duggan Development Authorities with their office at Basohli & Billawar respectively. He also applauded the efforts of J&K Sports Council for establishing state of the art Water Sports Academy at Basohli to promote water sports in the J&K UT.

## Istanbul among 5 venues shortlisted to host this year's IPL mini auction

NEW DELHI: Istanbul is among the five venues shortlisted to host the IPL auction which is likely to be held on December 16, according to a BCCI official.

Besides the Turkish capital and Bengaluru, the usual venue for the auction, New Delhi, Mumbai and Hyderabad are also in contention.

But a final call will be taken when the IPL Governing Council, under new chairman Arun Singh Dhimal, meets for the first time soon.

"No final decision has been taken yet but we are looking at Istanbul. We haven't met the teams and their officials in a relaxed environment since COVID, and this way we will be able to do that," the BCCI official told PTI.

"A final decision will be taken after talking to all stakeholders."

Unlike last year, this year's will be a mini auction. The 10 IPL franchis-

es have already been asked to submit their list of retained players by November 15.

Also, the salary cap is likely to be increased from Rs 90 to Rs 95 crore for the next season.

## India play out thrilling 5-5 draw against Australia in Sultan of Johor Cup

JOHOR BAHRU: The Indian junior men's hockey team scored a last-minute goal to play out a thrilling 5-5 draw against Australia and occupy the second spot in round-robin league standings of the Sultan of Johor Cup, here on Wednesday. Amandeep (60th minute) saved India with a final minute strike after Bobby Singh Dhami (2nd), Sharda Nand Tiwari (8th, 35th) and Arijit Singh Hundal (18th) found the Australian net.

Liam Hart (3rd), Jack Holland (8th), Joshua Brooks (20th, 41st) and Jake Lambeth (49th) were the goal scorers for Australia.

Australia are leading the standings with 10 points from four games, while India are placed second with two wins, one draw and one loss.

India had beaten hosts Malaysia 5-2 in their opener, lost 4-5 to South Africa and then thrashed Japan 5-1.

Against Australia, the Indians made a superb start with captain Uttam Singh getting to the baseline and laying the ball off for his deputy Dhami to score from their very first move.

But less than a minute later, Australia equalised through Hart.

Soon after, Australia surged ahead as Holland found the back of the

Indian net to register his first goal of the day.

But Australia's lead didn't last long as Tiwari's crisp shot from a penalty corner levelled the scores.

The second quarter kicked off at a high tempo as well, with Dhami looking to run down the Australian defence in the early exchanges.

The pressure paid off as Hundal was able to deflect a pass past the Australian goalkeeper to hand India the lead again.

A couple of minutes later, India goalkeeper Mohith Shashikumar conceded a penalty and Brooks made no mistake to make it 3-3 at half time.

After the changeover,

India continued their goal hunt and it took them five minutes to succeed as Tiwari converted another penalty corner with conviction.

The lead, though, was wiped off in six minutes as Brooks' penalty corner made it 4-4.

Four minutes into the fourth and final quarter, Australia got their nose ahead with Lambeth's penalty corner conversion.

India came out all guns blazing in search of the equaliser and Amandeep rescued his side by finding the net seconds before the final hooter.

India will play Great Britain in their fifth game on Friday.
