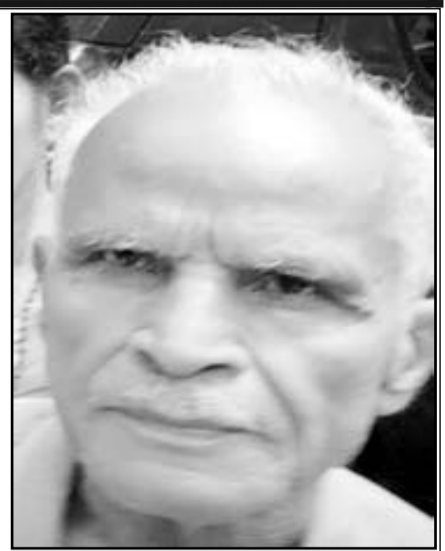

CRIME REPORT

Snatchers active in Jammu, two incidents reported in 3 days at Domana

JAMMU: These days, areas under Domana police station are under fear of snatchers. In last three days, two incidents of snatching have been reported. On Saturday late evening, two youth, face covered with black clothes, snatched a gold chain from a woman at Lale Da Bagh in Domana. The woman also suffered minor injuries in the incident, after which she reported matter at Domana police station and lodged a case of snatching. Police is scanning the footage of CCTV cameras installed in the area to get any clue about snatchers. Police also claimed that patrolling has been increased in the area.

In a complaint lodged at police station, Sunil Singh resident Lale Da Bagh told that when his wife Renu Devi was returning home late in evening from market, suddenly two youth wearing face-masks came and snatched her gold chain and locket. There was no one at the place where incident took place, taking advantage of which both snatchers managed to escape.

On Thursday, in Chinnore area under Domana police station, two motorcycle-borne snatchers snatched both Dejaru from an elderly woman. A case was registered at the Domana police station on complaint of the elderly woman's family, but police is yet to retrieve any information about snatchers.

Accident victim succumbs

Kidnapped minor girl rescued from Punjab; 2 accused arrested

JAMMU: Police on Sunday rescued a kidnapped minor girl and arrested two accused.
As per details, on September 26, 2022 an application was received at Police Station Satwari by father of a minor girl, alleging that one Rajinder Kumar, son of Roshan Lal, resident of Hakkal Ward-2 has kidnapped his daughter on September 24 when she had gone to school at Bhour Camp. Accordingly, FIR No. 180/2022 under section 363 of IPC was registered and investigation started.
After this, a team of Police Station Satwari under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Satwari Inspr Sameer Jeelani assisted by Incharge Police Post Chatha PSI Harjinder Pal Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, generated input regarding the kidnapped girl has been taken to Punjab. On this a special team was sent to Punjab and with help of native police, the girl was rescued and finally two accused namely Rajinder Kumar alias Ritik, son of Romesh Kumar, resident of Hakkal, Chatha and Gourav Kumar, son of Vijay Kumar, resident of Ward-5 Hakkal, Chatha were arrested. The minor girl was sent to CWC for counseling and subsequently the girl was handed over to family members after completing all legal formalities.

Four narco-smugglers nabbed with Ganja, Heroin

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Police on Sunday nabbed four narco smugglers and recovered 6 Kg Ganja and 48 gm heroin.
As per details, a team of Police Station Satwari constituted under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma and led by SHO Satwari Inspr Sameer Jeelani assisted by PSI Saddam Hussain while on Naka duty rounded up two suspects. During search, 6 Kg Ganja was recovered from them. Duo was identified as Hare

Ray, son of Ram Parvesh Ray and Sanjay Ray, son of Lakhanu Ray, both residents of Nayatola Patna. They were arrested and FIR No. 183/2022 under sections 8/20/29 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Satwari.

At two other Nakas in jurisdictions of Police Stations Pacea Danga and Gandhi Nagar, police teams recovered 48 gm heroin from two different drug-peddlers i.e., 40 gm heroin in jurisdiction of Police Station Pacea Danga and 8 gm heroin in jurisdiction of Police Station Gandhi Nagar.

A Naka was laid by team of Police Station Pacea Danga constituted under the supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu. The team led by SHO Police Station Pacea Danga Inspr Rakesh Sharma assisted by Incharge Police Post Chowk Chabutra PSI Jyoti Choudhary, while on Naka duty, rounded up a suspect. During search, 40 gm of heroin was recovered from his possession. The accused, identified as Chetan Sharma, son of Shiv Darshan Lal, resident of HNo 335, Rehari Colony, was arrested and FIR No. 118/2022 under section 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Pacea Danga.

Similarly, a special Naka was laid by a team of Police Station Gandhi Nagar constituted under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma. The team led by SHO Police Station Gandhi Nagar Insp Pankaj Sharma during Naka checking rounded up a suspect namely Gurdit Singh alias Prince alias Pindi, son of Bhopinder Singh, resident of House No 20, Sector-2, Model Town Gangyal. During search 8 gm heroin was recovered from his possession. The accused was arrested and FIR No 250/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Gandhi Nagar.

Three drug-peddlers nabbed with 40.9 Kg poppy straw

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Police on Sunday nabbed three drug peddlers and recovered 40 Kg 930 gm poppy straw at two different Nakas i.e., 37 Kg 430 gm poppy straw at Suketar Naka in jurisdiction of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and 3 Kg 500 gm poppy straw at TCP Bye Pass Nagrota Naka in jurisdiction of Police Station Nagrota.

As per the details, teams of Police Stations Jhajjar Kotli and Nagrota were constituted under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar. The teams led by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inspr Samson Bhatti and SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Partap Singh while on Naka duty at Suketar Naka and TCP Bye-Pass Nagrota Naka respectively rounded up three different suspects, with vehicles (JK02AD/0304 and PB05AB/5858). During search, 40 Kg 930 gm poppy straw was recovered from them. In this regard, FIR No. 223/2022 under sections 8/15/25/29 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and FIR No. 351/2022 under sections 8/15 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Nagrota. Three accused were identified as Baldev Singh, son of Surjan Singh, resident of Hardorwal, Tehsil Dera Baba Nanak Punjab; Sukhdev Singh, son of Puran Singh, resident of H.No 422, Ward-4, Amritsar, Punjab and Shokat Ali, son of Bashir Ahmed, resident of Kanger, Tehsil Kot Bhalwal.

Two missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Police on Sunday traced two missing persons and reunited them with their families. As per the details, a complaint was registered at Police station Arnia regarding a boy namely Balbir Kumar; son of Tilak Raj, resident of Biaspur who went missing from his house. In this regard, missing report was registered and investigation started. A team formed under the supervision of SDPO R.S Pura Surinder Singh led by SHO Police Station Arnia Inspr Sumit Sharma, after putting in strenuous efforts, finally traced the missing boy. The family of boy informed that he was mentally disturbed and undergoing treatment.

Similarly, another complaint was lodged at Police Post Chinore regarding a woman who went missing from her house. In this regard missing report was registered and investigation started. On this, a team formed under the supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh led by Incharge Police Post Chinore PSI Rajesh Kumar, after putting in strenuous efforts, traced the missing woman. Subsequently, families of missing persons were informed and both traced persons were handed over to their respective family members after completing all legal formalities.

Driver arrested for deterring police men on duty

JAMMU: Police on Sunday arrested a driver for deterring police men on duty at Pacea Danga.

As per details, a team of Police Station Pacea Danga constituted under the supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu while on patrolling duty got the information that two tippers jumped Manda Naka without checking during the intervening night of October 1-2, 2022, despite being stopped for routine checking in jurisdiction of Police Station Nagrota.

On this a team of SDPO City North Sharad Kalu along with his PSOs chased and apprehended them. When asked to show permission, the drivers suddenly accelerated the vehicles to run over SDPO City North and Police party with an intention to kill them. The tipper owner, identified as Aftab Mohd, resident of Kandoli Nagrota and preventive action under relevant sections of CrPC was done against him at Police Station Pacea Danga.

After this, a special Naka was laid by a team of Police Station Pacea Danga led by SHO Pacea Danga Inspr Rakesh Sharma chased tippers again and caught one of them with its driver namely Mohd Bashir. FIR No. 117/2022 under section 307/353 of IPC was registered in Police Station Pacea Danga and accused driver was arrested. Tipper, which was without Registration Number, was also seized.

Drug-peddler arrested, contraband recovered

AWANTIPORA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drug trafficking, Police on Sunday arrested a drug-peddler and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

As per details, a party led by Incharge Police Post Reshipora under the supervision of SDPO Awantipora Mumtaz Ali Bhatti during Naka checking near Panzgam crossing intercepted a suspect. During search, 17 Kg grinded Cannabis powder was recovered from his possession. Identified as Bashir Ahmad Dar son of Mohammad Ashan Dar resident Panzgam Awantipora, the accused was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 220/2022 under relevant sections of law stands registered at Police Station Awantipora and further investigation started.

3 arrested, 3 vehicles seized for illegal extraction & transportation of minerals

BUDGAM: Acting tough against elements involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, Police has arrested 3 persons & seized 3 vehicles in Budgam. As per details, a party from Police Station Chadoora intercepted 2 tippers loaded with illegally extracted soil from Government land at Magraypora Chadoora. The accused drivers were arrested and both vehicles were seized. Similarly, Police Station Beerwah seized a tractor found involved in extraction and transportation of minerals from Nalla Sukhnag.

The accused driver was also arrested. The accused were later identified as Ayaz Farooq son of Farooq Ahmed Darzi resident of Kulreth Chadoora, Mudasir Ahmed Khan son of Abdul Gani Khan resident of Nowpora Pulwama and Firdous Ahmed Sheikh son of Abdul Ahad Sheikh resident of Sutharan. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered in respective police stations and further investigation started.

Man arrested with illicit liquor
