# JKPEECC holds protest against Police action on power employees in Puducherry

JAMMU: Jammu & Kashmir Power Employees and Engineers Coordination Committee (JKPEECC) held a protest at all District headquarters of Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh UT supporting call of National Coordination Committee of Electricity Employees and Engineers (NCCOEEE) and All India Power Engineers Federation (AIPEF) for nationwide protest against midnight arrest of protesting electricity employees and engineers of Pondicherry Electricity Department who were on peaceful work boycott since last 4 days over issue of complete privatization of electricity distribution in Pondicherry.

Speaking on the occasion, Sachin Tickoo, Convenor

JKPEECC and President JKEEGA said that Pondicherry electricity department had invited request for proposal (RFP) on 100 per cent stake sale of electricity distribution network which irked thousands of the employees and engineers, forcing them to proceed on work boycott and after four days of peaceful Satyagrah, when entire city

was in darkness, the administration instead of working towards resolution of issue adopted confrontation path with protesting employees and initially arrested leaders followed by court arrest of thousands of employees.

Jaipal Sharma Chairman JKPEECC and President DEA said that All India Power Engineers Federation Chairman Er Shailendra

Dubey is in Pondichery along with the other leaders of National Coordination Committee of Electricity Employees and Engineers and monitoring the situation. Jammu and Kashmir Electricity Employees and Engineers coordination committee urged Union Government to withdraw privatization proposal in the Union Territory of Pondicherry and don't push the proposal in haste without taking stakeholders onboard. JKPEECC resolved to fight against any such move of privatization in Union territory and all instructions and course of action as decided by the National Coordination Committee of Electricity Employees and engineers shall be followed across the UT of J&K in letter and spirit.
