Shah said Prime Minister Narendra Modi had promised elections after abrogation of Article 370 on August 5, 2019.

Modi had held local body polls and handed over the power to the 30,000 elected representatives of local bodies, he said.

Earlier power was with three families, 87 MLAs, 6 MPs. With abrogation of Article 35-A and 370, all downtrodden societies including Paharis in Jammu and Kashmir are getting or going to get their rights, he said.

The home minister said tribal reservation has become possible in Jammu and Kashmir only after abrogation of Article 35-A and 370.

He alleged that those who ruled Jammu and Kashmir for 70 years "wanted to keep Paharis crushed and pushed their voice. Now it is turn of Paharis to get their right in Jammu and Kashmir".

Shah said the development of Jammu and Kashmir is Modi's priority.

"Earlier, all money sent by the Centre for development was usurped by a few, but now everything is spent on people's welfare," he said.

"I want to appeal to you to free Jammu and Kashmir from the clutches of these three families and to make hands of Modi strong for betterment and welfare of Jammu and Kashmir," he said.

Shah did not take names of the three families.

"Today's rally is a befitting reply to those who used to say that there would be blood bath if Article 370 is abrogated," he said.

The Home Minister said Modi snatched stones from the hands of stone pelters in Kashmir and handed them laptops and jobs and this has resulted an end to stone pelters.

"The decline in number of deaths of security forces shows that Jammu and Kashmir is in safe hands now," he said, adding the Modi government has started strong drive against terrorism, stone pelters and Hurriyat conference.

He also appreciated the Union territory administration's decision to announce a holiday on the occasion the birth anniversary of Maharaja Hari Singh, the erstwhile ruler of Jammu and Kashmir, who signed the instrument of accession.

The Home Minister said on the last day of Navratri he paid obeisance at Mata Vaishno Devi temple and and prayed for peace in Jammu and Kashmir.

Shah also praised the people living in Rajouri and Poonch who are "standing like rocks for security of India" and entire country salutes them.

"Paharis, Gujjars and Bakerwals always stood for country whenever there was risk on India. Mountains of Rajouri and Poonch are guardians of LoC of India," he said.

There have been reports of protests by the Gujjars and Bakerwals in Jammu and Shopian in Kashmir recently against the move to grant ST status to the Paharis.

The Gujjars and Bakerwals constitute 40 per cent of the population in the border districts of Rajouri and Poonch.

Paharis also live in the same area but they are numerically small.

The Gujjars and Bakerwals are the third largest ethnic group in Jammu and Kashmir after Kashmiris and Dogras.

Since April 1991, they have enjoyed benefits of 10 per cent quota for STs in jobs and educational institutions.

The Paharis are also seeking same benefits, which was opposed by the Gujjar and Bakerwals.

Since January 2020, the Paharis have been getting 4 per cent quota benefits in jobs and educational institutions in Jammu and Kashmir following a change of rules by the Union Territory administration.

This was also opposed by the Gujjars and Bakerwals, saying they get benefits under other categories such as OBC, EWS.

Terming it as an unfortunate incident, the police chief said the force has got relevant clues from the scene which indicate that the accused had a history of aggressive behaviour.

He said the suspect had bolted the room from inside when the DGP was rubbing balm on his foot.

The 57-year-old Lohia, who was promoted and appointed as Director General of Prisons in the Union Territory in August, had shifted to his friend's house only a few days back.

Earlier, the ADGP had said that preliminary examination of the crime scene indicated that Lohia must have been applying some oil on his foot which showed swelling.

The killer suffocated Lohia to death and also used a broken ketchup bottle to slit his throat and later tried to set the body afire, he said.

The guards present at the residence of the officer saw fire inside his room and broke open the door, the ADGP said.

The officials said raids were conducted by special teams at different places including the domestic help's home town in Halla-Dhadrath village in Ramban district where some persons including his fiance were detained for questioning.

The ADGP said the CCTV footage collected from the incident site showed the accused running away after the commission of the crime.

"Lohar was working in this house for nearly six months. Initial investigation revealed that he was quite aggressive in his behaviour and was also under depression, he said.

"A thorough probe is on to rule out any possibility. The weapon of offence has been seized besides some documentary evidence reflecting his (domestic help's) mental state, he said.

Officials said the body of the deceased officer was shifted to the Government Medical College (GMC) hospital Jammu for postmortem.

Sharing some pages from the diary of the accused, a police official said Lohar, a school dropout, was apparently fed up with his life.

The domestic help wrote in his diary that he was 99 percent sad but wearing a 100 percent fake smile'.

I am 10 percent happy, having zero percent love in life and 90 percent tension in life. I hate my life which only gives pain and waiting for death to restart my life, he wrote in the diary.

DG (Prisons) Lohia was found dead at his residence on the outskirts of Jammu on Monday night. His throat was slit and there were burn injuries on the body.

### BSF 'Retreat Ceremony' along IB in Jammu completes one year

JAMMU: The 'Retreat Ceremony' along the International Border here has successfully completed one year with the BSF contemplating to increase the seating capacity owing to its growing popularity among the people, officials said.

The "Wagah-Attari-style" ceremony, comprising a structured parade by the Border Security Force (BSF) personnel on every Saturday and Sunday, was launched on October 2 last year as part of the border tourism promotion programme of the government.

BSF band live display, splendid retreat parade and visit up to the zero line are the key features of the ceremony and during the last one

year, the parade has been witnessed by thousands of tourists, VVIPs and celebrities.

"This event has now become a centre of attraction for the locals as well as tourists and part of the overall tourism package," a BSF official said.

He said the parade was conceptualised by BSF frontier headquarters, Jammu, in collaboration with the tourism department and after a lot of efforts and hard work, the retreat ceremony was inaugurated by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha last year.

The retreat ceremony has become popular among the masses and the number of visitors are increasing day by day. Seeing its popularity, the

BSF has decided to increase the seating capacity to accommodate more visitors and has included presentation of cultural programmes during the retreat ceremony," the official said.

actions along the frontier including in the Ladakh sector are being monitored constantly and the IAF's overall preparations are part of continuing efforts irrespective of whether it sees any challenge from China.

He was addressing a press conference ahead of the Air Force Day on October 8.

"The benchmark to say the situation on LAC is normal would be to return to status quo ante and complete withdrawal from all the points all along the

LAC. That is the situation that we are looking for," he said, replying to a question.

His comments came days after Chinese envoy Sun Weidong claimed that the situation along the border is "overall stable" and the two sides have moved from the "emergency response" that followed the Galwan Valley clashes in June 2020 to "normalised" management.

India has been insisting on the restoration of the status quo ante prior to the standoff in eastern Ladakh.

Asked about reports of China's air incursions and military activities along the LAC in eastern Ladakh, Air Chief Marshal Chaudhari said the issue was taken up with the Chinese military and that all the activities by the adversary are being monitored.

"As regards to the recent air violations or incursions or increased air activity by the Chinese, we continuously

monitor it by continuously enhancing our air defence efforts there. We have increased the presence of radars," he said.

"Appropriate non-escalatory measures have been taken. I think we have been able to signal our intent and... our state of readiness with the actions we have taken so far," he said.

Air Chief Marshal Chaudhari said confidence building measures are in place between the two sides, but noted that a hotline is yet to be set up.

The IAF chief said recent events on the global landscape have clearly indicated that the presence of a strong military is imperative to ward off external threats through deterrence.

"The armed forces in general and the IAF, in particular, will continue to remain a lynchpin in the national security matrix both as a deterrent as well as a war-winning instrument," he said.

Air Chief Marshal Chaudhari also

said that the IAF has been preparing for all kinds of security challenges including "worst case scenario" and asserted that it is fully ready to face any situation.

"We continue to be actively deployed while at the same time expediting the operationalisation of recently inducted systems like Rafale, Light Combat Aircraft and S-400 among others. Today, as I speak, the IAF continues to be ever vigilant and deployed," he said.

"Our air defence elements are deployed 24x7, 365 days of the year to prevent any violation or transgression of our national airspace. Our fighters are always on readiness to be scrambled in a matter of a few minutes to counter any emergent threat," he said.

The Chief of Air Staff also spoke on the depleting number of its fighter squadrons and phasing out of the Mirage 2000s, Jaguars and the MiG 29s.

Meanwhile, Lt Governor Manoj Sinha on Tuesday expressed shock and grief over the murder of Director General (Prisons) H K Lohia, saying he served the country with great honour and dedication.

A 1992-batch IPS officer, Lohia was found murdered under suspicious circumstances at his residence on the outskirts of Jammu on Monday night. His domestic help has emerged as the main suspect in the case.

"Shri Hemant Lohia was an outstanding Police officer and a great human being. He served the country with great honour & dedication. Shocked and deeply grieved at his sad demise. My condolences to the bereaved family and friends," the Lt Governor said in a tweet.

The Director General of Police, Dilbag Singh, on behalf of all ranks of Jammu and Kashmir Police have condoled and expressed grief over tragic, sad and unfortunate demise of Director General of Prisons, J&K, H.K Lohia who was found murdered last night at Jammu.

In his condolence message the DGP, J&K has expressed his grief over the loss of a professional, hardworking and dedicated senior officer. He said that the officer was a very dear colleague and his services and contributions to the different organizations will always be remembered. The department and he himself are "deeply saddened by this huge loss", DGP said.

DGP conveyed his heartfelt condolences to the bereaved family and relatives of the departed officer on behalf of the Jammu and Kashmir Police Pariwar and prayed for the departed soul.

He said that the murder of Lohia will be investigated thoroughly from all the angles to reach to the bottom of the crime.

IPS officer of 1992 batch H. K Lohia was born in 1965 to Shayam Sunder Lohia of A.T. Road Gowhati Assam. During his services the officer served at key positions including both staff and field and contributed immensely for Jammu and Kashmir Police, BSF and Prisons Department. He remained posted as SDPO Gandhi Nagar, SP (R&H) Srinagar, SP Rajouri, CO JKAP-7th Bn, SSP CID CIK, AD SKPAU, DIG Admn. PHQ, DIG CCR SGR, DIG CID, DIG SKR Ang., DIG Doda Range, DIG CCR Srinagar, IGP Traffic J&K, Director SSG, IGP Technical Services, DGP to GOI (BSF as IG), Comdt. Genl. HG/CD/SD and DG Prisons.

From "I hate my life" and "Dear death I am waiting for you" to Bollywood songs about sadness and the final farewell, the recent diary entries of a man who allegedly killed Director General (Prisons) Hemant K Lohia reveal he was "under depression".

Yasir Lohar, the 23-year-old domestic help, was arrested following a major manhunt through the night. It seemed, according to police, the school dropout was fed up with life.

In Hindi and broken English, he has also written in his diary one-line sentences like: "I want Restart My life", "Zindagi to bas taklif deti hai, sukoon to maut hi deti hai (life only hurts, death brings peace)", and "everyday starts with expectation but ends with bad experience".

Lohar, a school dropout, has also scribbled in his diary a popular Bollywood song from movie Ashiqui 2 - "Bhula dena mujhe, hai alvida tujhe" - in which the lyrics talk about separation and goodbyes.

He wrote he was "99 percent sad" in his life but wore a "fake smile 100 percent".

"I am 10 percent happy, having zero percent love in life and 90 percent tension in life. I hate my life which only gives pain and waiting for death to restart my life," he wrote.
