

# Police Pensioners hold protest, project demands

JAMMU: J&K Retired Police Pensioners on Wednesday staged protest against the government for its indifference towards their demands. Led by Ajit Singh, police pensioners under the banner of J&K Retired Police Pensioners Welfare Forum assembled at Exhibition Ground and raised slogans in support of their demands. Addressing the protesters, Ajit Singh said that government is giving effect to its Order No 229-F of 2014 dated 7th October, 2014 regarding pay anomalies, from the date of order though the effect should be given from the year 1996 when Fifth Pay Commission was implemented throughout the State leaving only Police Department.

He alleged that government has played a joke with the retired police men.

He criticised the government for ignoring the just and genuine demand of the poor police pensioners, stating that since the forum launched their struggle to get their rights, government is constituting committee after committee but doing nothing to redress the

issue.

"As such we want to know the time frame because the issue is lingering for the last 20 years", he added.

Ajit lamented that no relief has been provided to the retired police personnel, who were fighting their case since 1996. He demanded release of Rs 5,93,25,000 in favour of retired ASIs and HCs.

Protesters appealed to the government to act on the issues highlighted and take necessary action for the benefit of retirees who are on the road to get their own rights and dues.

He said that NC was also expecting employment package for the youth of Jammu and Kashmir from the visiting Home Minister as unemployment rate has all time high and reached upto 32.75, which is highest in the country right now.

The Senior NC leader also corrected the Home Minister over taking the credit of five medical colleges.

He said that the same were sanctioned under the NC regime headed by Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, by taking up the matter with the then Central Government headed by former PM Manmohan Singh.

"There is no role of the Modi Government in sanctioning these colleges and whatever the HM has said is not factualy correct", he added.

# Dogra Sadar Sabha performs Shastra Pujan on Vijayadashami

JAMMU: Gulchain Singh Charak, President, Jammu and Kashmir Dogra Sadar Sabha and former minister, performed Shastra Puja here on Wednesday along with other members of the Sabha and prominent citizens of Jammu, on the auspicious occasion of Vijayadashami, marking the culmination of Sharad Navratri festivities.

While extending greetings to the citizens of the Union Territory and the countrymen on behalf of the Dogra Sadar Sabha, Charak threw light on the significance of Shastra Puja by quoting from historical texts.

During a brief interaction later, he referred to Multiple traditions surrounding Vijayadasami, notably that of Durga slaying Mahishasura and Rama killing Ravana.

Another event is that the Pandavas retrieved their weapons hidden in a Shami tree after thirteen years of exile on Vijayadasami day. Guru Gobind Singh also encouraged "Shastar Puja" or worship of swords. He

added that Sanskrit text Markandeya Purana 1 describes the conflict between Devas, led by Indra, and Asuras led by Shumbha and Nishumbha, where the supreme Goddess is transformed into a liberating divine power in the form of a sword.

He said that it is interesting to observe how a culture that has a tradition of worshipping weapons approaches questions of war, violence and non-violence.

Dharma, Artha, Kama and Moksha are the four great "Purusharthas" (goals of life) of Hinduism.

Dharmaic conduct is the basis upon which all the other goals of life are to be attained. At an individual level, it is the dharma of a soldier to fight if necessary.

At a social level, the ruler must enforce dharma and protect society. Use of weapons is seen as part of a sacred duty to protect dharma. This infusion of divinity and dharma into the use of weapons, in our minds, largely explains why in earlier times, wars in India were circumscribed by a strict code of conduct.

The most important component of this code is that wars were fought between soldiers only and other segments of society were not involved.

Charak concluded by saying that the tradition that sees divinity in ahimsa (non-violence) also prizes weapons. It is the ideal of ahimsa that inspired Mahatma Gandhi's Satyagraha, a movement unique in the annals of world history. But the martial customs or the injunctions of the Bhagavad Gita say that a refusal to fight for highly justified cause on grounds of non-violence often only empowers Adharma.

## Govt sidelined Christian community in J&K, alleges AJKCS

JAMMU: Alleging that the Government has sidelined Christian community in the Union territory of J&K, All J&K Christian Sabha (AJKCS) has urged the administration to fulfill all pending demands of the community at the earliest.

While addressing a press conference, Peter Mattoo, President AJKCS said that Government has ignored Christian community of J&K and unable to quench the vote-bank thirst of political parties, the demands of the community are not visible in election manifestos of political parties from decades. We

were having high hopes from LG's administration and also met former LG G C Murmu in August 2020 and projected a number of demands, but despite considerable lapse of time, nothing has been done to resolve the pending issues," he asserted.

Various long pending demands of the community included installation of statue of Bharat Rattan Mother Teresa at a rotary in Jammu, providing grave-yard in Purkhoo, Santra-morh areas, reservation to community in JMC and SMC, employment policy for educated Christian youth, establishing housing colony under PMAY for Christians, constitution of Christian Welfare Board, etc.

Reacting on the three families remark by Home Minister Shah at Baramulla, Rattan Lal said that Abdullah family had served the people of Jammu and Kashmir for the last more than seven decades and Sheikh Abdullah had remained in prison for the cause of getting justice and due rights of people of J and K for several years and therefore no one in the country is so big in stature to cook unfounded stories for the sake of political mileage by twisting the historical facts which are unchallengeable and true to the

"There is no doubt that people of J and K had given massive mandate to the Abdullah family several times in the past because the people like anti and its leadership from their core of their hearts and that's why BJP is now fearing to hold elections in Jammu and Kashmir.
