JAMMU: Department of Anaesthesia, Critical Care & Pain Medicine, Government Medical College (GMC) Jammu celebrated World Hospice & Palliative Care Day on Saturday.

Every year the same is celebrated on October 9 to create awareness about improving the quality of life of terminally ill patients, patients suffering non-curable disease and patients where just symptomatic and supportive treatment is advised but it was celebrated today because October 9 is a holiday.

The theme for this year is 'Leave no one behind, equity in access to palliative care'.

On the occasion, essay and poster making competitions were organised in the NMCN hall in which faculty, residents and MBBS students participated.

Principal & Dean GMC Jammu, Dr. Shashi Sudan Sharma was the Chief Guest, who said that the Government of India has started a national programme for palliative care with the objective of giving the benefit of easy access to palliative care to all the suffering humanity right upto the District and Sub-district level.

She further said that Department of Anaesthesia has to take a lead role in training the faculty of the peripheral Medical Colleges and the

residents in palliative care so that trained human resource is available at the grassroot level. She said in GMC Jammu the Palliative Care OPD is functional since February 2020 and recently we have also dedicated a 8 bedded Ward for the palliative care Patients.

The event was organised under the supervision of Dr. Anju Jamwal HoD and by Pain & Palliative Care Specialist Dr. Rajesh Mahajan.

The winners of the essay and poster making competitions were judged by a team of senior faculty members and the winners were given certificates and gifts by the Chief guest.

JAMMU: J&K dairy sector is witnessing a strain in supply chain as production cost has increased manifold due to sharp increase in feed, fodder besides outbreak of lumpy skin disease. It was stated by Punjab Singh, Member J&K Kissan Board in a press statement issued here on Saturday.

Singh further said that dairy sector is reeling under stress due to immense problems. "No doubt, J&K Animal Husbandry Department has launched a unique integrated dairy development scheme to help dairy farmers but in this crucial time it is difficult for dairy farmers to sustain without high yielding milking animals from outside J&K," said Singh adding that insurance of all milch animal is need of hour. "I appeal to the Government for taking necessary measures for development of Kissans besides lifting ban on animals from outside J&K under integrated dairy development scheme," said Singh. He further sought some time from LG Manoj Singh for highlighting some crucial issues regarding development of dairy sector.

JAMMU: Better road connectivity is a vital component of socio-economic development and all road projects in Jammu and Kashmir shall be completed within their set timeframes.

This was stated by former Legislator and senior Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader Vikram Randhawa while interacting with residents of Brahaman Mohalla in Ward Number 5 of Chowdhari here on Saturday.

He expressed gratitude to Minister for Road Transport & Highways in the Government of India (MoRTH) Nitin Gadkari for sanctioning the project for

development of Jakh (Vijaypur)-Kunjwani section of NH-44 to 6-lane Expressway standards as part of the Delhi-Amritsar-Katra Expressway including

development of Kunjwani to 4th Tawi Bridge section of NH-144A to four-lane NH standards at the revised cost estimate of Rs.1917.32 cr. under Bharatmala Pariyojana in the UT of Jammu & Kashmir on Hybrid Annuity Mode.

"Once completed, the stretch would boost connectivity to Jammu Airport", Randhawa said, adding that these projects are the road of J&K's destiny that will accelerate the development, meet aspirations of people and facilitate ease of living.

"Strong road connectivity is the vital component of the socio-economic development of any region. All major road/highway projects under execution in J&K shall be completed within the set timeframes to facilitate the trade and smooth movement of the public", Randhawa said and stressed on timely main-

tenance of highway stretches, especially those with high frequency of transportation.

He also discussed about the implementation of the

Pradhan Mantri Gramin Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir. He said that proper healthcare facility, education and economic activities will reach the masses with the availability of roads, Randhawa added.

"The remote circles, vil-

lages and areas of our Union Territory need to be road connected," he said, adding that the "PMGSY is the path

through which it can be done.

Koul, the difficulties being faced by party leaders on ground. Voter list available is only in Urdu and the time span for a scattered community is very less. They urged Koul to take up the issue of extension of last date with authorities at appropriate level. KDD leaders stressed upon the need for the Election Commission to undertake an intensive awareness campaign

before organizing camps in any area. They also highlighted the necessity to involve election commission mechanism for registration of Displaced voters presently living outside Jammu Kashmir.

Ashok Koul, while agreeing to take up their issue raised with concerned authorities; impressed upon Core Group Member to galvanize party workers at Booth and Mandal

level and undertake an intensive door-to-door contact programme for awareness to register voters in Kashmir. He instructed leaders to prepare short video messages for awareness on the subject.

Anganwari workers highlight demands, seek release of pending salary

JAMMU: To highlight a number of issues faced by Anganwari Workers, a number of workers under the banner of Anganwari Workers Welfare Association (AWWA), Jammu affiliated to Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh (BMS) held a press conference at Union Office, Parade on Saturday.

While talking to reporters, Ashok Choudhary, Organizing Secretary BMS stated that Anganwari workers/helpers are working since long in J&K and getting a meager state share.

"After including centre share, Rs 5100 per month is paid to Anganwari workers and while Helpers get Rs 2550 per month, which

is not enough for sustaining life. Moreover, centre share was revised by Govt of India in 2018 but the state share has not been revised from 2010," he added.

The Association further stated that salary from April 2022 till date has not

been released while arrear on account of enhanced honorarium in centre share of Rs 1500 per month for Anganwari workers and Rs 750 for Helpers has also not been paid till date. The Association demanded that the Government must give 100 per cent promotion to

Anganwari workers to the rank of supervisor.

The Association further demanded that since Govt of India has adopted new education policy and it has proposed to convert Anganwari centres to Pre Primary schools, as such Anganwari workers, having requisite qualification must be considered for the post of teachers in new schools.

Neelam Sharma, General Secretary BMS, Swarna Choudhary President and Roshi Sharma General Secretary AWWA urged LG to intervene into the matter and direct concerned authorities for releasing pending salary besides fulfilling all other demands on merits.


