Latif, who was accompanied by his heavily armed guards, and his brother were killed on the spot in the mosque complex.

According to an Associated Press report from Lahore, the gunmen pretended to be worshippers to enter the mosque complex.

No one immediately claimed responsibility for the attack but local police chief Hassan Iqbal said it appeared that Latif was intentionally targeted. The police chief did not provide further details, the AP report said.

Latif alias Bilal alias Noor Al Din, a designated terrorist under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, was the launching commander of the Jaish-e Mohammed in Sailkot and had been involved in planning, facilitation and execution of terror attacks in India.

The officials said that Latif had entered into Kashmir in 1993 from Pakistanoccupied Kashmir as a cadre of the banned Hakar-ul-Ansar terror group. However

he was arrested a year later and sent to the Kot Balwal jail in Jammu. It is believed that he was brainwashed further by Masood Azhar, who was also lodged in that jail till he was set free in 1999 in exchange for the passengers of IC 814, an Indian Airlines plane that was hijacked by terrorists and taken to Kandahar

After spending 16 years in the Indian jail, Latif was deported through the Attari Wagah border in 2010 and was believed to have got in touch again with Azhar, who had by that time formed the Jaish-e-Mohammed terror group.

"This is the biggest blow to JeM on Pakistan soil," an official said.

Latif, a resident of Aminabad in Punjab's Gujranwala, was wanted by the National Investigation Agency (NIA). Seven IAF personnel were killed when four JeM terrorists sneaked into the Pathankot Air Force Station on January 2, 2016. The siege went on for three days. After the Pathankot attack, Latif was detained by the Pakistani authorities for some time. He was also involved in the terrorist attacks in

Samba and Hiranagar in 2013, officials said. Acquitted respondent in 2 criminal cases cannot be appointed as constable: DB

JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court compris ing Justice Sanjeev Kumar and Justice Mohan Lal in a LPA filed by emphasized DGP, held that mere acquittal of the respondent in the criminal case pending against him would not ipso facto entitle him to be appointed as Constable and it is better left to the employer to determine as to whether such person, who has faced criminal trials in two cases and has been acquitted by the competent Court of law

This significant order has been passed in LPA filed by Police Department against the judgment of writ Court whereby Writ Court directed to issue formal appoint ment order in favour of the respondent as Constable in Armed Police under RBA category. DB after hearing both the sides observed that we are of the considered opinion that the Writ Court, in the given facts and circumstances of the case, could not have straightway issued mandamus to the appellants to issue formal appointment order in favour of the respondent as Constable in Armed Police under RBA category simply on the ground that the respondent stood acquitted in the two FIRst registered against him in Police Station, Gool. DB further said that true it is that the respondent figured in the select list of RBA category, as is evident from order dated 46/2009 dated 17.01.2009. He was not issued an appointment order because of his involvement in two FIRs referred to hereinabove. It is also not in dispute that subsequently the respondent was tried before the competent criminal Court and was acquitted in both the FIRs. We need to emphasize that mere acquittal of the respondent in the criminal case pending against him would not ipso facto entitle him to be appointed as Constable and it is better left to the employer to determine as to whether such person, who has faced criminal trials in two cases and has been acquitted by the competent Court of law, is still fit to serve the police force. The legal position in this regard has already been explained by the Supreme Court in the case of Avtar Singh v. Union of India. In view of the legal position laid down by the Supreme Court, the Writ Court ought to have left it to the appellant authorities to take an informed decision in the matter. With these reasons, the Division Bench disposed off the appeal with a direction to the appellants to consider the case of the respondents for appointment as Constable in Armed Police under RBA category, under which he stands selected vide order dated 46/2009 dated 17.01.2009, in the light of parameters laid down in the case of Avtar Singh (supra). Let a decision in this regard be taken by the appellants within a period of two months from the date a copy of this order is served upon them.
