Addressing the people of Uttarakhand as "dear family members", Modi said he has personal bond and memory attached to every inch of the land and expressed his gratitude to the people for giving him such a warm welcome.

"The people of Uttarakhand take me as a family member. They share their joys vith me like the birth of a child or a daughter doing well in her studies through letters. I am really blessed to enjoy such an intimacy with them," PM Modi said.

Describing Uttarakhand as the land of spirituality and valour, the prime minister eposed faith in the unique ability of its people and said the decade belongs to them. I want Manaskhand also to prosper and grow like Kedarkhand." He asked people to prepare themselves to receive many pilgrims and tourists in the near future.

Following the initial seizure, a special investigation team was formed to trace both

backward and forward linkages, Singh said.

In a meticulous process, technical intelligence was gathered and a truck carrying a portion of the consignment was apprehended, he said, adding that the truck driver, responsible for delivering the contraband, was arrested.

During interrogation, the driver revealed crucial information that resulted in the arrest of another peddler from Kupwara, the DGP said adding this chain of detentions eventually led to the recovery of an additional four kilos 198 grams of a cocaine-like substance and Rs 43.17 lakh in cash.

Simultaneously, efforts were underway to trace the forward linkage of the cartel, he said. A collaborative effort with IB team, Jammu, and assistance from the Punjab Police culminated in the apprehension of a major drug magnate, Manjeet

Singh, hailing from Ludhiana, Punjab, he said. The subsequent search revealed an astonishing array of fraudulent documents, sophisticated equipment, and an extensive cache of assets, including a revolver of

German make, he said. He said that a significant amount of cash, gold, silver, and electronic devices were confiscated, underscoring the extensive network and resources at the disposal of the apprehended kingpin.

This operation marks a significant milestone in the ongoing battle against drug trafficking, reaffirming the commitment of law enforcement agencies to curb the menace of narcotic smuggling in the region, the DGP said.

As per details, under Operation Sanjeevani, in an all out war against drugs, Ramban Police seized huge consignment of 30 KG cocaine like substance worth Rs. 300 crores from two Punjab based peddlers who were transporting the contraband in an Innova car bearing registration No HR02W-4925. In this regard, case FIR No 252/2023 u/s 8/21/22/27/29 NDPS Act was registered and special investigation team was constituted under the supervision of SSP Ramban, Mohita Sharma. Further, to ascertain backward and forward linkages, special teams were deputed by the SSP, both to Kashmir for backward linkage and to Punjab for ascertaining for-

Technical intelligence was gathered and after strenuous efforts truck bearing registration No JK04 $\bar{\text{F}}$ -8057 was seized and driver arrested, who was responsible of delivering the consignment of 30 KG contraband in lieu of receiving Rs 45 Lakhs cash at Parimpora. Further, on sustained questioning, the accused driver disclosed name of another peddler who was arrested from District Kupwara. In order to nab the kingpin, continuous technical and human intelligence was simultaneously gathered which further led to arrest of 03 more peddlers belonging to District Kupwara, who confessed having receive the contraband from across the border. Their questioning further led to recovery of cocaine like substance weighing 4 kg 198 gram and cash worth Rs 43 lakh 17,000.

In simultaneous investigation, which was going on to ascertain the forward linkage, a special team was constituted in collaboration with IB Team Jammu, assisted by Punjab Police after obtaining permission from DIG DKR Dr. Sunil Gupta. Technical inputs, analysis of IPDR and CDR data alongwith gathering the trail of digital footprint on various networks, led to the arrest of major drug magnate belonging to District Ludhiana, Punjab and recoveries were made from him which included 14 cheque books - two fixed deposit receipts; 22 passbooks; 12 Aadhar cards; nine ATM cards; two pen drives; 38 fake number plates of vehicles; two fake badges of BJP and Punjab Police; one fake stickers of Punjab Government; one fake driving license; 14 R.Cs; one pan card; 8 mobile phones; one revolver (Made in Germany); four diaries; one fake passport; Passport- 06; one currency counting machine; three weighing scales; one rent deed; 44 grams gold; 385 grams silver; 600 grams cocaine like substance and currency amounting to Rs. 4,94,50,000.

buildings should be properly cleaned to make them clean and aesthetic. He asked them to install dust bins besides giving facelift to these structures including cutting of grass and whitewashing of their interiors and exteriors. Govt orders inclusion of 'third gender' in job applications in J&K

SRINAGAR: The government on Wednesday directed all administrative departments to modify the relevant rules for inclusion of a separate category of 'Third Gender/any Other Category in the application forms in recruitment to various posts in J&K.

"The Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights), Act of 2019, prohibits the discrimination, denial or unfair treatment of members of Transgender community in educational establishments, employment, health institutions and public services etc," reads a circular issued by the government. The Act makes it obligatory for the Government to take appropriate steps to secure full

and effective participation of transgender persons, their inclusion in the society, to facilitate their access to welfare schemes framed by the discrimination in matters relating to their employ-

"In pursuance to the provisions of the aforementioned Act, the Department of Personnel and Training, (Ministry Personnel Public Grievances and Pensions, Government India videOffice Memorandum 39028/02/2016-Estt (B) dated 20.04.2020, has issued an advisory to all Ministries and Departments in Government of India, requesting for modification of the relevant Examination Rules to provide for inclusion of Transgender as a separate category of gender," the circularsaid.

DOPT has also notified Civil Services Examination Examination and Service Government and to prevent Rules, 2020 on 05 February 2020, providing for inclusion of Transgender as a separate category of gender for the said exam, it noted.

No forward movement at 20th round of military talks between India & China

NEW DELHI: There was no forward movement at the latest round of India-China military talks towards resolution of the lingering standoff at the remaining friction points along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh, people familiar with the matter said on Thursday.

Senior military commanders of the two sides held the 20th round of talks on October 9 and 10 at Chushul-Moldo border meeting point on the Indian side of the LAC in the region.

The talks were cordial but there was no forward movement on resolution of the pending issues, the people cited above said. It is learnt that in the talks, the Indian side strongly pressed for resolution of the lingering issues at Depsang and Demchok. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Wednesday said the talks were held in an "open and constructive manner" for an early and mutually acceptable resolution of the remaining issues.

It said the two sides agreed to maintain the momentum of dialogue and negotiations through the relevant military and diplomatic mechanisms. "The two sides exchanged views in a frank, open and constructive manner for an early and mutually acceptable resolution of the remaining issues along the LAC in the Western Sector, in accordance with the guidance provided by the national leadership of the two countries, and building on the progress made in the last round of Corps Commanders' meeting held on August 13-14," the MEA said

SRINAGAR: In another blow to separatists in the Kashmir Valley, a prominent leader of banned Jamaat-e-Islami along with his supporters joined the April Party at its headquarters here on Thursday and said this was one of the realistic approaches being adopted by them while hoping that many more will come through.

The Jamaat-e-Islami (JeI) leader, Talat Majid, who hails from the Pulwama district of South Kashmir and was a Rukn-e-Jamaat (member of Jamaat) before it was banned. made it clear that his decision was not influenced by any pressure to be a part of a mainstream political party.

"I am not under any pressure to join the mainstream... I have been advocating this change since 2014. I wanted to bring this change from the

platform of Jamaat-e-Islami. Since I did not get a chance there, I decided to look for other options," Majid told reporters after joining one of the youngest political parties in Jammu and Kashmir.

While welcoming Majid and his supporters into the party fold, Apni Party founder Altaf Bukhari said anyone who denounces terrorism and drugs, believes in the Indian constitution and the development of Jammu and Kashmir

was welcome to join the party. "We will continue our efforts till every person in Jammu and Kashmir joins the Apni Party," he said.

In September this year, former separatist Syed Muzaffar Rizvi, who was the general secretary Itihadul Muslimeen -- a Shia separatist outfit part of the Hurriyat Conference amalgam -- had joined the April Party.

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Thursday said it will pass a common order in several nine-judge and seven-judge bench matters, including those relating to money bills and the speaker's power to disqualify MLAs, to get them ready for hear-

A seven-judge bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud took up six seven-judge and four nine-judges matters for considera-

One of the seven-judge bench matters pertains to the correctness of the 2016 Nabam Rebia verdict relating to the speaker's power on disqualification of MLAs. It was pronounced by a five-judge Constitution bench.

"... The idea is to get these matters ready for hearing. We will pass a common order in all these matters in terms of the circular of August 22, 2023 that the compilation of pleadings, documents and precedents that

must be all filed within say... we will give three weeks to everyone," the CJI said.

"We will appoint nodal counsel in every matter who will then prepare a common compilation," said the bench, also comprising Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul, Sanjiv Khanna, B R Gavai, Surya Kant, J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra.

The bench told the advocates appearing in these matters to give the names of nodal counsel in each

Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, who is appearing in some of these matters, requested the bench to indicate the dates for hearing in advance so lawyers could prepare their case. The CJI said he would look into

the calendar of the benches for this. The bench said the lawyers may indicate the estimated time for a

Many of these matters have been pending for 20 years, it noted. When the matter relating to money

bills came up before the apex court, Sibal requested the bench to consider giving it priority, saying it is a "live issue'

it would constitute a seven-judge bench to consider the issue of validity of passage of laws like the Aadhaar Act as a money bill.

The issue relates to the controversy around money bills after the government introduced legislations like the Aadhaar Bill and even amendments to the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) as money bills, apparently to circumvent the Rajya Sabha where it did not have

A money bill is a piece of legislation which can be introduced only in the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha cannot amend or reject it. The Upper House can only make recommendations which may or may not be accepted by the Lower House.

In November 2019, a five-judge bench of the apex court had referred to a larger bench the issue of examining the validity of the passage of the Finance Act, 2017 as a money

"The issue and question of Money Bill, as defined under Article 110(1) of the Constitution, and certification accorded by the Speaker of the Lok Sabha in respect of Part-XIV of the Finance Act, 2017 is referred to a larger Bench," it had said.

Demining operation in Leh, 175 mines destroyed
