Underscoring the role of sea routes in global trade, the prime minister emphasized he need for a reliable global supply chain in the post-Covid world.

Modi listed the systematic steps undertaken to strengthen the sector in the last few years and underlined the transformative impact of the historic G20 consensus on the proposed India-Middle East Europe Economic Corridor.

The prime minister reiterated that investors have a great opportunity to become part of this campaign and join India.

Modi said his government has been working to strengthen the maritime sector in the last 9-10 years, and added that whenever India's maritime capabilities have been strong in history, the country and the world have benefitted from it.

In the last decade, major ports' capacity has doubled, turnaround time for containers has come down to 24 hours from 42 hours in 2014, thousands of kilometres of roads have been built for better port connectivity, Modi said, pointing that employent generation and ease of living are the primary drivers for these efforts

'Ports for Prosperity' and 'Ports for progress' are a vision for the government, Modi said, adding that the mantra is to 'Make in India, make for the world'.

Without specifying a timeline, Modi said the government will develop shipbuilding

and repair centres across the country. Building the indigenous aircraft carrier INS Virat is a testament to the country's

eapabilities, he added. Four global ship leasing companies have registered with the GIFT-IFSC, Modi

said, exhorting more entities in the ship leasing trade to set up business in India's only IFSC in Gujarat. He said India's large coastline, strong riverine ecosystem and rich cultural heritage

create great possibilities for maritime tourism. A cruise terminal is being built in the financial capital, while similar facilities have come up in Visakhapatnam and Chennai, he said.

Terming the 5,000-year-old Lothal dockyard as the 'cradle of shipping', Modi said National Maritime Heritage Complex is also coming up at the site in Gujarat. He also noted that the country has started the world's biggest river cruise service

to promote maritime tourism. Talking about the government's focus on the ship-building and repair sector, the orime minister said that indigenous aircraft carrier INS Vikrant is proof of India's

"India is going to become one of the top five ship-building nations in the coming

decade. Our mantra is 'Make in India - Make for the world'," the prime minister said. He said that the government is working to bring together all stakeholders in the sector through maritime clusters.

"We are moving towards a future where the blue economy will be the medium to create a green planet," he said.

He underlined that coastal shipping Modes are also being modernised and said that the coastal cargo traffic has doubled in the last decade, thereby providing a cost-effective logistic option to the people.

On the development of inland waterways in India, the prime minister said that eargo handling of national waterways grew by four times

Rs 50,000 from him and told him that he will be given seized items back and will be allowed to work also if he pays the bribe money.

On this complainant pleaded that he cannot pay huge bribe and it was later on negotiated for Rs 30,000, official said.

The chargesheet was filed on October 28, 2021 which established offences committed under Section 120-B of RPC and Section 5(1)(d) rws 5(2) of the J&K PC Act Samvat 2006 by Kanta Andotra (Chairperson RBET) and Ravinder Singh, then Patwari of Patwar Halqa Karandi Khurd and & Muthi Hardo in 2011, who in criminal connivance issued three fards of more than 329 Kanals of land during January 4,2011 to January 7,.2011 without mentioning details in respect of violation of ceiling limit of 100 standard kanals imposed under Section 14 of the J&K Agrarian Reforms Act 1976 thereby giving undue pecuniary advantage to the trust. Basis the three fards, the trust acquired multiple pieces of land approx 329 Kanals vide three gift deeds executed on January 5,2011 and January 7, 2011.

The main persons involved included Ch. Lal Singh, son of Saran Singh, ex-MP and ex-MLA and his wife Kanta Andotra, also an ex-MLA and Chairperson of the trust and the then Patwari

Chugh termed this as a struggle of ideologies, as BJP envisions strengthening democracy, and development and opposition parties want to promote nepotism at the cost of innocent lives. He said that these parties glamorized terrorists and separatism and we should not forget how these parties allowed the whole J&K to burn on the direction of Pakistan.

"Corrupt individuals will face consequences. The ED is an independent agency that operates based on its own information and investigations," he said.

SC refuses to...

judgement in which he broadly agreed with Justice Chandrachud's views.

Justice S Ravindra Bhat, who authored an 89-page judgement for himself and Justice Hima Kohli, disagreed with certain conclusions arrived at by the CJI including on applicability of adoption rules for queer couples.

Justice PS Narasimha said in his 13-page verdict that he was in complete agreement with the reasoning given and conclusions arrived at by Justice Bhat.

The judges were unanimous in holding that queerness is a natural phenomenon and not "urban or elite" occurrence.

"There is no unqualified right to marriage except that's recognised by statute including space left by custom," Justice Bhat said in his judgement.

"An entitlement to legal recognition of the right to union akin to marriage or civil union, or conferring legal status upon the parties to the relationship can be only brough enacted law. A sequitur of this is that the court cannot enjoin or direct the creation of such regulatory framework resulting in legal status," he said.

Justice Bhat made it clear that these findings should not be read as to preclude queer persons from celebrating their commitment to each other or their relationship in whichever way they wish within the social realm.

Referring to the statement made by the Centre during the hearing on the matter, he said " the Union shall set up a high-powered committee chaired by the Union Cabinet Secretary, to undertake a comprehensive examination of all relevant factors, especially including those outlined above. In the conduct of such exercise, the concerned representatives of all stakeholders, and views of all States and Union Territories shall be taken into account".

In his judgement, the CJI also recorded the assurance by Solicitor General Tushar Mehta that the Centre will constitute a committee chaired by the Cabinet Secretary for the purpose of defining and elucidating the scope of the entitlements of queer couples who are in union.

He said there is no universal conception of the institution of marriage, nor is it static.

"Under Articles 245 and 246 of the Constitution read with Entry 5 of List III to the Seventh Schedule, it lies within the domain of Parliament and the state legislatures to enact laws recognizing and regulating queer marriage," Justice Chandrachud said.

He said the freedom of all persons, including queer couples, to enter into a union is protected by Part III of the Constitution.

"The failure of the state to recognise the bouquet of entitlements which flow from a union would result in a disparate impact on queer couples who cannot marry under the current legal regime. The state has an obligation to recognize such unions and grant them benefit under law," the CJI said, adding the right to enter into a union cannot be restricted based on sexual orientation.

He said intersex persons, who identify themselves as either male or female, have the right to marry under existing law including personal laws which regulate mar-

Observing that unmarried couples, including queer couples, can jointly adopt a child, the CJI said regulation 5(3) of the adoption regulations is ultra vires the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act and Articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution.

"Regulation 5(3) of the CARA (Central Adoption Resource Authority) regulations cannot be held void on the grounds urged," Justice Bhat said, striking a note different from Justice Chandrachud.

"At the same time, this court is of the considered opinion that CARA and the Central government should appropriately consider the realities of de facto families, where single individuals are permitted to adopt and thereafter start living in a nonmatrimonial relationship," he said.

Justice Bhat said the State shall ensure that choice exercised by queer and LGBTQ couples to cohabit is not interfered with and they do no face any threat of violence or coercion.

"This court is alive to the feelings of being left out, experienced by the queer community; however, addressing their concerns would require a comprehensive study of its implications involving a multidisciplinary approach and polycentric resolution, for which the court is not an appropriate forum to provide suitable remedies," he

In his verdict, the CJI passed a slew of directions to the Centre, states and Union Territories to ensure that the queer community is not discriminated against because of their gender identity or sexual orientation and also to take steps to sensitise the

public about queer identity, including that it is natural and not a mental disorder Justice Chandrachud directed the police machinery that there shall be no harass ment of queer couples by summoning them to police station or visiting their place of residence solely to interrogate them about their gender identity or sexual orienta

In his separate verdict, Justice Kaul said, "Non-heterosexual unions and hetero sexual unions/marriages ought to be considered as two sides of the same coin, both in terms of recognition and consequential benefits.

He said legal recognition of non-heterosexual unions represents a step forward towards marriage equality.

"I believe that this moment presents an opportunity of reckoning with this histor ical injustice and casts a collective duty upon all constitutional institutions to take affirmative steps to remedy the discrimination," he said.

Justice Kaul said the duty of a constitutional court is to uphold the rights enshrined in the Constitution and to not be "swayed by majoritarian tendencies or opular perceptions".

In his judgement, Justice Narasimha said he was not oblivious to the concerns of LGBTQ+ partners with respect to denial of access to certain benefits and privileges that are otherwise available only to married couples. "I am of the firm belief that a review of the impact of legislative framework on the flow of such benefits requires a deliberative and consultative exercise, which exercise

the legislature and executive are constitutionally suited, and tasked, to undertake, The LGBTQIA++ persons, who had won a major legal battle in 2018 in the Supreme Court which decriminalised consensual gay sex, had moved the apex court seeking validation of same-sex marriage and consequential reliefs such as rights to

adoption, enrolment as parents in schools, opening of bank accounts and availing succession and insurance benefits. On May 11, the bench had reserved its verdict on the pleas after a marathon hear ing for 10 days. The apex court had commenced hearing arguments in the matter on April 18. Some of the petitioners had urged the apex court to use its plenary power, "prestige and moral authority" to push the society to acknowledge such
