



Anti-corruption Court rejects closure reports against Police Officer

JAMMU: In a significant development, Additional Sessions Judge Anticorruption Doda, Amarjeet Singh Langeh, rejected the closure report filed by the Doda police against police officers who were allegedly involved in corrupt practices. Additional Sessions Judge Anticorruption Doda, Amarjeet Singh Langeh, while rejecting the closure report, observed that the FIR in question was registered following a preliminary inquiry conducted by the then Additional Superintendent of Police (Operation), Doda. Intriguingly, the investigating officer failed to involve the then Additional SP (Operation), Doda, in the investigation. Similarly, Vinay Kumar, the then Additional Superintendent of Police, Doda, who had charge-sheeted Sub-Inspector Pardeep Kumar and Follower Narinder Singh in a departmental inquiry with

allegations of accepting Rs. 50,500 from Farooq Ahmed, Mohd Ramzan, Gulam Nabi Malik, and others when they were transporting 86 bovines to Kashmir via Nag Mandi near Basantgarh Dessa, was not associated with the investigation either: The court noted that the involvement of these two police officers could have provided essential clues to the investigating officer and greatly assisted in uncovering the truth. It is imperative that an investigating officer conducts a fair, proper, and unquestionable investigation. Interestingly, Farooq Ahmed, Mohd Ramzan, and Gulam Nabi, the alleged bovine smugglers whose statements were recorded under section 164-A of Cr.PC, did not provide any information regarding the incident, and they did not imply that Sub-Inspector Pardeep Kumar and Follower Narinder Singh obstructed them in any way. The investigating officer's

assumption that the police officials were falsely implicated was, therefore, based on fiction and lacked a foundation.

The court further emphasized that the closure report's conclusion, which was overwhelmingly perverse and disproportionately based on the assumption that the Sub-Inspector Pardeep Kumar and Follower Narinder Singh were falsely implicated, did not stand to reason. Consequently, the acceptance of the closure report was declined, and it was returned to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Doda, with a direction for further investigation in accordance with the law. The court also ordered that the investigation be completed and the report submitted within three months.

The case came to light when the then Senior Superintendent of Police, Doda, learned on August 13, 2018, that the in-charge of the Manjimi-Dessa police picket, Sub-Inspector Pardeep Kumar, and Follower

Narinder Singh, along with three Special Police Officers (SPOs), were allegedly involved in corrupt practices related to the movement of bovines in the Basan Gala-Dessa area. A fact-finding inquiry was initiated, which was entrusted to the then Additional SP (Operation), Doda, R.P. Singh. The inquiry exonerated the three SPOs but established the charge of accepting illegal gratification from bovine smugglers to the tune of Rs. 50,500 by Sub-Inspector Pardeep Kumar and Follower Narinder Singh. Subsequently, the matter was referred to the Director of the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB), J&K, Srinagar; and then to the Director General of Police, J&K, Jammu, for further necessary action. The case ultimately landed in the office of the DIG, Doda, Kishtwar; Ramban Range, Batote, who referred it to the Senior

Superintendent of Police, Doda, for the registration of an FIR by local police under the Prevention of Corruption Act. Subsequently, FIR No. 8/2020 for an offense under section 13(2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act was registered with the Dessa police station, and the investigation commenced.

Upon the completion of the investigation, a closure report was submitted to this court by the Deputy Superintendent of Police, Head Quarter, Doda, concluding that the involvement of the accused in the case could not be proven. However, this court ordered fresh investigation by Additional SP, Bhadarwah, on November 23, 2021. Finally, an instant closure report was submitted in this court, highlighting that the alleged offense could not be proved against the accused due to a lack of evidence.

CISF nabs TFS technician staff, 2 passengers at Chennai Airport

NEW DELHI: Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) on Tuesday nabbed TFS technician staff and two passengers with yellow metal (gold) in paste form weighing about 2.744 kgs (worth approx Rs. 1.5 crores) at Chennai Airport, official said.

"On Wednesday at about 0222 hrs, on the basis of behaviour detection, CISF surveillance and intelligence staff of Chennai Airport noticed suspicious activities of a TFS technician staff later identified as Manivannan," official said adding that CISF personnel closely observed that Manivannan entered inside the washroom alongwith two passengers. "At about 0224 hrs both

passengers came out from washroom and went towards boarding gate area and the Technician Staff came out from washroom at about 0231 hrs and went towards TFS staff rest room," official said.

On strong suspicion, official said, CISF personnel approached and intercepted the technician staff and he was brought to the Security Hold Area for checking.

On physical checking eight oval shaped yellow metal (gold) weighing 2.744 Kg in paste form were detected, concealed in his pockets and shoes, official said.

On questioning, the staff accepted that he received the gold in paste form

from both the passengers who handed over the gold to him in the washroom.

On checking the CCTV footage the passenger later identified as Mohammad Rafas and Mohamed Inzamam (both Srilankan) who arrived from Dubai by Indigo Flight No. 6E 1472 (ATA 0125 hrs) was identified and intercepted by CISF personnel.

The matter was informed to Custom officials and CISF officers.

Later, the technical staff, both the passengers alongwith recovered 2.744 Kg yellow metal (gold) in paste form worth approximately Rs 1.5 crores, were handed over to Custom officials for further action in the matter, official said.

India stands for International Space collaborations for benefit of mankind: Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI: India stands for international Space collaborations for the larger benefit of mankind. It is our solemn commitment that the Outer Space is used only for peaceful purposes and kept free of conflict.

This was stated today by Union Minister, Dr Jitendra Singh while delivering keynote address at the 2-day Conference on 'Space - The final frontier for China in its quest for global leadership', organised by the Centre for Contemporary China Studies, MEA, at Sushma

Swaraj Bhavan here. The Minister said, "We have consistently adhered to the principles of transparency, accountability and peaceful uses of Space. And therefore we urge upon every other nation including China to engage in open dialogue with others so that we share each other's missions, ventures without being secretive or suspicious and also ensure that we preserve a secure, safe and stable environment."

"Prime Minister Modi has broken these taboos of the past. Starting from just 4 Space Startups in 2014, within just 3-4 years we

have more than 150 Startups," he said.

Stating that the "Anusandhan National Research Foundation" will pave the way for a greater Public Private Partnership (PPP) model in scientific research, Dr Jitendra said the NRF will catapult us to the league of handful of developed nations pioneering new research in new frontiers.

Dr Jitendra said ISRO has launched more than 380 foreign satellites, earning more than 220 Million Euros and over 170 Million US Dollars by launching American satellites.

SRINAGAR: Chief Secretary, Dr Arun Kumar Mehta on Wednesday emphasized that quality power supply during winter months can be ensured only if there is a proper demand side management and proper plan should be formulated by the Department for the purpose. He made these remarks while holding reviewing functioning of Power Development Department.

The meeting was attended by the Principal Secretary, PDD; MD, KPDC/LJPDC/L; Chief Engineers of all the Corporations besides other concerned officers.

The Chief Secretary impressed upon the officers to ensure that the availability of power during winter months is as per schedule. He maintained that there is additional demand during the extreme cold weather and the Department needs to brace itself to meet

the challenge. Dr Mehta enjoined upon them to enhance the enforcement mechanism by constituting feeder wise surveillance teams. He advised them to start media campaign to raise awareness about the judicious use of electricity and government's efforts to provide them subsidized power. He asked for involving district administration for strict enforcement of ban on use and sale of crude gadgets in their respective areas. He asked them to publish the Do's & Don'ts for general public to sensitize them about the harmful effects of using crude heating or cooking gadgets. He called for prioritizing the supply of electricity as per the feeder wise AT&C losses. He told them to saturate the feeders with smart meters having mixed gadgets currently.

Dr Mehta also stressed on giving feeder wise energy and revenue targets to the field functionaries for improved

demand side management. He directed for bringing down the overall AT&C losses especially in smart metered areas to 10% as per the established norms.

While taking review of the financial health of the associated corporations, the Chief Secretary urged the Department to carryout study of the power purchase mechanism of all the States/UTs of the country. He directed for making a comparison chart about the purchase and supply of energy in each State so that the UT too could think about bringing more efficiency into the system.

In his presentation the Principal Secretary, PDD, H.Rajesh Prasad informed the meeting that the Department has huge gap between total cost of purchase of power and revenue realization.

He further added that the Department has taken several reforms to reduce its losses besides making efforts to increase

the revenue realization. These includes installation of smart meters, cabling of LT network and taking up other loss reduction works. It was said that till date more than 5 lakh smart meters have been installed in the UT with 15 lakh to be installed more.

Moreover it was given out that to meet the demand of consumers the government is taking both short and long term measures. These include bilateral arrangement/banking with Government of UP for 500 MW energy and additional allocation of 1000 MW firm power is also being explored.

As for taking the long term measures it was informed that Power Purchase Agreements for 1600 MW solar power and 1245 MW hydro power has been done with different generation companies across the country for providing quality power to our consumers in the UT.
