

Court rejects bail in loan case

JAMMU: Special Mobile Magistrate Electricity Jammu Vinod Kumar rejected the bail application of one Saleem Yousaf S/o Mohd Yousaf Bhatti R/o Narol, Mendhar District Poonch who was arrested by the Crime Branch in loan fraud case.

According to the Crime Branch Jammu that accused has taken fraudulent loans of taken Rs.32 lakhs himself in addition to this he has prepared forged salary certificates of co-accused on the basis of which availed loan amount up to

approx. Rs. 1.38 crores which was later on shared with Co-accused. The accused in connivance with coaccused has taken first fraudulent loan in March 2022 and continued taking other fraudulent loans from different branches of J&K Bank till Dec. 2022 and siphoned huge amount of public money, all of them have criminally conspired as an organized gang.

Court after hearing APP Anil Saini for the Crime Branch, observed that the accused has submitted that he is innocent and asserted that he is the

sole bread winner of his family. However, it is the duty of the court to safeguard the interests of justice and protect the integrity of the criminal justice system. Granting bail in this case could send a wrong signal to society therefore, considering the seriousness of the charges, the court finds it inappropriate to grant bail to the accused at this juncture. Moreover the investigation is still at an early stage and more facts are yet to emerge. Keeping in mind the facts and circumstance of the case the bail

DB disposes of PIL regarding construction of GDC Marheen

JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court comprising Chief Justice N Kotishwar Singh and Justice Rajesh Sekhri disposed of PIL regarding establishment and construction the Govt. Degree College, Marheen, Kathua.

Division Bench observed that respondents have filed objections wherein, in para no. 3, it has been stated by respondent no. 4-Tehsildar, that Marheen Government has already taken necessary steps for transfer of land situated at village Ladwal Andhar, Tehsil Marheen, District Kathua

establishment/construction of Govt. Degree College at Marheen. Para 3 of the objections reads as under, "In reply to the contents of para no. 3 of the petition to the extent that the land has been handed over for construction of Govt. Degree

College, Marheen, Kathua, it is submitted that the Commissioner/Secretary to Government, Higher

Education Department, J&K, vide order No. 86-HE of 2019 dated 25.02.2019 had issued directions for identification of State Land for construction of newly sanctioned Colleges at Ramkot and Marheen, District Kathua. Accordingly, State land measuring 197 kanals 19 marlas situated at village Ladwal Andhar, Tehsil Marheen was identified for the purpose and the posses-

sion of the State land meas-

uring 197 kanal 19 marlas

has been given to Principal, Govt. Degree College, for Kathua on 27.02.2019. The revenue papers were prepared and submitted to the Director Colleges Education Higher Department, J&K Jammu for authentication and furnishing of proper indent. The Director Colleges,

Education Department, Jammu has returned the papers after authentication and proper indent placed vide his office DC/HE/

INDENT/2019 dated 14.11.2019 for transfer of the State land measuring 197 kanal 19 marlas situated at village Ladwal Andhar, Tehsil Marheen, District Kathua for establishment/construction of Government Degree College at Marheen. The matter was taken up with the Govt. for transfer of State land in favour of Education Higher Department and Revenue Department has raised observations. some Accordingly, observations were removed and finally land measuring 151 kanals 05 marlas situated at village Ladwal Andher, Tehsil marheen has been transferred in favour of Higher

Education Department,

J&K for establishment/

construction of Degree College at Marheen vide order No. 43-JK-(Rev) of 2021 dated 07.07.2021, issued under endorsement Rev-Sectt/18/2021 {26942} dated

07.07.2021. DB observed that it is evident that the Government Degree College is going to be established in village Ladwal Andhar within the jurisdiction of Tehsil Marheen. Since same is also the prayer of the petitioners for establishment of the College in Marheen, we are of the view that nothing survives in the present PIL $\,$ for further consideration, inasmuch as, the authorities are going to construct Government Degree College in village Ladwal Andhar in Tehsil Marheen as per the stand taken by the respondent No. 4 at para 3 of the objections.

With these observations, Division Bench closed the PIL.
