HANGZHOU: Indian para athletes on Thursday created history by winning the highest number of medals in the Asian Para Games, taking the country's tally to 82, including 18 gold.

India have now gone past the earlier best of 72 medals achieved in the 2018 edition in Indonesia. India added 18 medals, including three gold, on

India's medals tally stood at 18 gold, 23 silver and 41 bronze at the end of the fourth day of competitions.

India's position in the medals tally, however, dropped two places to eight, as not too many gold medals were won on Thursday.

Korea South and Indonesia moved ahead of India in the medals tally led by China (156 gold, 128 silver, 108 bronze).
