Apni Party prioritizes reconciliation over confrontation: Bukhari

SRINAGAR: Apni Party President Syed Mohammad Altaf Bukhari, on Sunday, emphasised that his party advocates reconciliation as the primary approach to free the people from the extensive destruction caused by years and decades of confrontations. He urged the government to take the necessary steps for reconciliation, thereby fostering a peaceful environment in Jammu and Kashmir.

Apni Party President made these comments today while addressing a public meeting in the Soribal Konibal area of the Pulwama district. Bukhari, while explaining the purpose and policies of Apni Party, said, "Recognizing the vulnerable state of the people of Jammu and Kashmir, who have suffered years of bloodshed and turmoil, Apni Party was established to ensure reconciliation, protecting the people from further losses, and making peace

and prosperity a reality in this land." Expressing his deep concern regarding the current state of affairs, Bukhari said, "We continue to endure suppression. Many of our youth still remain jails, while those striving to build their careers confront unwarranted obstacles in job and passport verifications imposed by authorities."

He said, "We observe that the verifications of job applicants and passport seekers are obstructed by the concerned authorities merely because a relative of the applicant was involved in some past wrongdoing. This practice needs to be stopped to open up opportunities for our youth to flourish in their careers."

Taking a dig at the traditional political parties and their leaders, Bukhari said, "The traditional political parties and leaders who mourn the loss of young lives in Gaza these days forget that they, while in power, ruined the lives of thousands of youth in Jammu and Kashmir by putting them in jails."

He further said, "Over the past 70 years, these parties and their leaders deceived the public, using emotional slogans and false promises like 'Autonomy' and 'self-rule' to secure votes and power for themselves."

"They had promised to obtain Autonomy and self-rule, but did they achieve these objectives despite being in power for years and decades? These parties formed an alliance called PAGD, claiming they would safeguard Article 370 and 35A. Did they protect these constitutional articles from being abrogated?" he asked.

Appealed to the people not to fall for the false promises of these political parties. He said, "It is your responsibility to convey to traditional political parties and their leaders that enough is enough. They underestimate your intelligence and repeatedly return with hollow promises. You must prevent them from exploiting your emotions."

He said that Sukanya Samridhi Yojana is a saving scheme by Government of India, which is aimed at the betterment of girl child in India. It is launched to help

"Sukanya Samridhi Yojana, also referred to as SSSY, is a deposit scheme made especially for the girl child. This scheme was introduced to ensure a financially secure future for the girl child", the Former Legislator said, adding that through regular deposits, you can create a sufficient corpus as the years pass by, which can later be used for meeting your child's life goals.

Govt employees to hold protest on Nov 4

The meeting aimed to review the preparedness for a one-day protest demonstration scheduled for November 4, 2023, at Maharaja Hari Singh Park, Jammu, and Press Enclave, Srinagar, starting at 11:00 AM.

Ganesh urged government to clear and release pending bills related to GP Fund advance that have been pending in government treasuries for several months, release pension gratuity, pension commutation amounts, and leave encashment/earned leave (cash-in-lieu) for retired government employees waiting for these benefits since March 2023, release monthly salaries for government employees on the first of every month by ensuring the release of salary grants and MT (Money Transfer) to the concerned offices and government treasuries.

7th Pay Commission recommendations for all employees of Public Sector Undertakings, old pension scheme for government employees working under the New Pension Scheme (NPS) in the J&K UT, clearance of pending cases involving the employment of individuals under the provisions of SRO 43, implementation of a five-day work-week pattern in all government departments in J&K UT, and regularization of all daily-rated workers engaged in different government departments and working on meager wages for an extended period.

he further demanded release and regularization of pension cases that were stopped on the pretext of inquiries.
