Two HM terrorists killed in Kulgam encounter

SRINAGAR: Two terrorists were killed in a gunfight with security forces in Kulgam district on Wednesday, police

The killed terrorists of proscribed outfit HM have been identified as Basit Amin Bhat of Frisal and Saqib Ahmad Lone of Hawoora, Kulgam.

The encounter started earlier in the day when security forces launched a cordon and search operation at Kujjar following information about the presence of ultras there.

"02 terrorists killed. Bodies of the killed terrorists being retrieved from the site of encounter. Cordon & search operation is still in progress. Further details shall follow," Kashmir Zone police posted on X.

The search operation had turned into an encounter after the terrorists opened fire on the security forces, which retaliated.

8 dead, 22 armymen among 69 missing as flash

STATE TIMES NEWS GANGTOK: At least eight people died and 69 others, including 22 army personnel, went missing on Wednesday after a cloudburst over Lhonak Lake in north Sikkim triggered a flash flood in the Teesta River basin, officials said.

Three of the dead were washed up in north Bengal, they said.

The flood in Sikkim that started around 1.30 am was made worse by the release of water from Chungthang dam, the officials said.
