ReK teacher among two arrested with 160 Gms heroin

POONCH: Police on Wednesday arrested 2 notorious drug peddlers and recovered
huge quantity of 160 Gms of Chitta (Heroin like sub-
stance) from their posses-
sion.

As per details, Poonch
Police during Naka near
Shamshan Ghat, Dungus
Poonch for vehicle check-
ing stopped a blue-
coloured FZ Bike
(JK12B/1206) coming
from Christ School and
going towards Sher-e-
Kashmir Bridge. On being stopped, 2 persons riding on motorcycle started behav-
ing awkwardly which created suspicion in the minds of police party present on Naka.

On checking, 130 Gms of Chitta (heroin like substance) was recovered from the
possession of pillion-rider who disclosed his identity as Arshad Mehmood alias Vicky
Tadda, son of Khurshid Ahmed, resident of Palera, Mandi at present Moh. Radio
Station, Poonch and 30gms of Chitta was recovered from the possession of rider
namely Tahir Iqbal Shah, son of Munir Hussain Shah, resident of Moh. Power
House, Poonch. Both the persons were arrested and the bike seized. FIR
No.163/2023 under section 8/21/22/25/29 NDPS Act was registered at Police
Station Poonch.

Arshad Mehmood alias Vicky Tadda is working as Rehbar-E- Khel (ReK) teacher
at Govt. High School Palera Mandi.

Police team led by SHO Poonch Insp. Deepak Pathania assisted by PSI Sohan
Singh made the recovery/ arrests under the supervision of Alhjaz Ahmed In-Charge
Dy SP Hqrs. Poonch, Mushim Ahmed ASP Poonch and overall supervision of Vinay

CISF nabs passenger with country made pistol at Anand Vihar Metro Station

NEW DELHI: CISF nabbed passenger with country made pistol (Desi Katta) at
Anand Vihar Metro Station on
Wednesday

As per details, during baggage
screening through X-BIS machine
at Anand Vihar metro station,
Constable Brajesh Kumar of
CISF noticed a suspicious image
inside a bag of a passenger.
Immediately, he stopped the con-
veyor belt of X-BIS machine as
well as passenger. Subsequently,
the bag was checked physically in
presence of the passenger. On
physical checking of the bag, a
country made pistol (Desi Katta) was detected from the bag. Immediately, the mat-
ter was informed to the senior officers of CISF, Station Controller & DMRP. On
questioning, the passenger did not reply satisfactorily. Later, he revealed his identi-
ty as Manoj Kumar, aged about 18 yrs, resident of Bulandshahar, (UP). He was
accompanied with another passenger.

On arrival of DMRP from Yamuna Bank Police Station, the said passenger along
with the seized country made pistol (Desi Katta) was handed over to them for fur-
ther legal action in the matter.

Crime Branch Jammu charge-sheets mother-daughter duo in Rs 12 Lakh admission fraud

JAMMU: Economic Offences Wing - Crime Branch Jammu charge-sheeted fraud-

sters Mother- daughter duo Balwant Kour, widow of Lt. Tagjit Singh and her
daughter Simran Mann daughter Tagjit Singh both residents of Sec.44, Chandigarh
in case FIR No. 34/2021 under section 420,120-B /IPC P/S Crime Branch Jammu
for their involvement in hatching eriminal conspiracy in duping the complainant of
Rs 12 Lakhs after they promised him to send his daughter to Canada for Higher
Education and later cheated him. 149 Page chargesheet was produced in the Court
of law for judicial determination.

The case was registered on a written complaint lodged by Raj Kumar Nischal, son
of Kidar Nath Nischel, resident of 309, Chowk Chabutra Lane Opp. Gurdwara
Baba Chanda Singh Pacca Danga Jammu wherein it was alleged that his daughter
Miss Aditi Nischal while doing private job as Graphic Designer at M/S Sunrise
International, SCO 86-87 in 2016 his daughter came in contact with accused Ms.
Simran Mann who was also serving there as IELTS Teacher assured to send her
daughter to Canada for higher studies by charging Rs. 12.00 lacs. On the request
of his daughter, the complainant transferred the amount from his account to the
account of accused through RTGS. When his daughter approached the accused
Simran Mann for necessary documentation she dodged her on one pretext or other
and finally cheated them.

On receipt of the complaint, a preliminary verification was initiated and the al-
legations were prima-facie established and subsequently, the instant case was reg-
istered for in-depth investigation. Relevant record was seized, statement of witnesses
recorded, Scientific, Circumstantial and other Material evidence was gathered and
offences of cheating against the accused Mother- daughter duo Balwant Kour and
Simran Mann both residents of Sec.44, Chandigarh for luring the complainant and
cheating them on the pretext of arranging Higher Education in Canada has been
established. While the accused Balwant Kour is on bail after she was arrested by
Crime Branch Jammu, her daughter co-acused Simran Mann is still at large and
proceeding U/S 512 Cr.PC stands initiated against her.

Notorious criminal booked under PIT NDPS Act

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday booked notorious criminal under PIT NDPS Act.
As per details, an information was received at Police Station Pacca Danga through
reliable sources regarding one notorious drug peddler namely Gourav Khajuria, son
of Prem Nath Khajuria, resident of H.No 91, Peekho, Jammu.

On this, a team of Police Station Pacca Danga led by SDPO North Sunil Kumar
Kesar assisted by SHO Pacca Danga Inspsr Sushil Kumar raided at the suspected
place and arrested the above said drug peddler.

It is pertinent to mention
here that the accused person
was a notorious criminal and
was involved in many cases of
drug peddling and dealing in
narcotics. Also a warrant of
arrest was issued against the
said accused by Divisional
commissioner Jammu.

Finally today in compliance
to the Prevention of Illicit
Traffic of Narcotic Drugs and
Psychotropic Substances Act
of 1988 (PITNDPS) the war-
rant has been executed and
the accused person has been
shifted to District Jail Kathua.



CWC nails big parent-child begging nexus in Kashmir; 14 kids rescued in surprise raid

SRINAGAR: Acting swiftly after receiving repeated complaints about child begging
in the capital city of Srinagar, Child Welfare Committee (CWC) of the district on
Wednesday swung into action and conducted a "surprise raid" in the city centre Lal
Chowk where 14 child beggars were rescued and taken for counselling.

This was for the first time that a 'special surprise drive' against child begging was
launched by the CWC at Lal Chowk. "We had been receiving complaints about fre-
quent child begging in various parts of Srinagar. Today, we decided to conduct a sur-
prise check at Lal Chowk where we caught hold of 14 child beggars including four
girls," CWC head for Srinagar, Dr Khair-un-Nisa said.

She said while they were taking the child beggars to a shelter home at Nishat 'their
parents started begging for the release of their kids. "This is what makes our job
tough. There is a nexus between parents and kids. Ironically, the parents of the kids
rescued today were also beggars," Dr Nisa said, adding that "we will counsel all the
14 kids (all of them minors) and handover them to the CWCs of their respective dis-
tricts/States."

Asked about any tentative number of outside beggars in Srinagar, she said there
is no accurate data available as the same may be lying with the Labour department.
"Majority of these beggars are from Punjab, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh," she said. "In
three months, we have rescued 32 child beggars including today's 18."

Dr Nisa said that the special drive will continue in the days ahead as complaints
of large numbers of street children including those indulging in begging outside
major shrines and markets of Srinagar.

"So far, the previous cases have been transferred to CWCs of other places outside
J&K for their rehabilitation as almost all among them were non-J&K residents. All
of them were migrants and were shifted to their native places," she said.

She said an eight-year-old domestic helper was also rescued from Srinagar after a

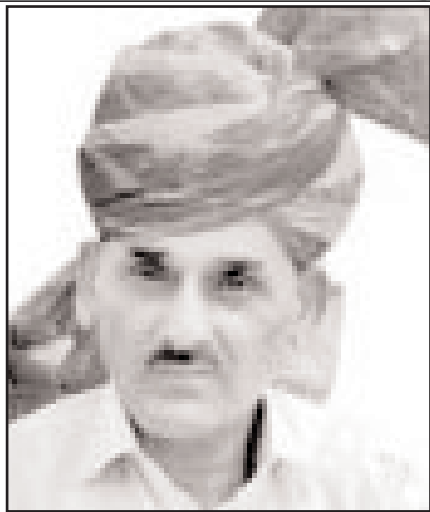
SHRADHANJALI

neighbour called the CWC. "Our primary job is to counsel and rehabilitate the res-
cued persons and hand them over to their respective CWCs," Dr Nisa said. She said
that all the residents of Srinagar who have minor domestic helpers at their should
voluntarily approach the CWC. To a query about how she feels to lead the drive
against children in street situations being a woman, Dr Nisa said that she has done
LLB and being a law-aware person, she forgets about gender and focuses on her
duty while on the streets."

"I forget I am a woman and my primary focus always remains to perform my duty
without fear," she told. It may be recalled that every year, Kashmir sees the arrival
of lakhs of outside beggars especially in the month of holy Ramadhan. They arrive
in the month of March and stay here till November. An official in the social welfare
department told a Srinagar based news agency that there is a proper rehabilitation
policy for the beggars in J&K. "We rescue the beggars especially child beggars and
lodge them in shelter homes. They are later being handed over to concerned CWCs,"
he said. Locals at Hazratbal shrine told that last Friday on the eve of Eid-e-Meelad-
un-Nabi (SAW), at least 500 outside beggars including children were found begging.
"Many children were found chasing the devotees seeking money. The devotees felt
irritated by the huge presence of non-J&K beggars especially children," said Abdul
Aziz Mir, a shopkeeper outside the revered shrine of Hazratbal.

Fire renders 4 families homeless

BANDIPORA: Four families were rendered homeless after a devastating fire incen-
dient turned three residential houses into ashes in the Quil area of Bandipora dis-
trict on Tuesday night.

An official told Kashmir based news agency, that fire broke out in a residential
house belonging to Imran and Irfan son of Mohammad Maqbool and damaged hous-
es of Nazir Ahmad and Ashiq Hussain son of Sonaulah of Quil.

Although no casualties were reported in the incident, three double-storied residen-
tial houses got completely damaged, he said.

The official added 15 sheep, three cows were charred to death in the incident.

He said that till the fire was brought under control four families were rendered
homeless and property worth lakhs got perished.

A police official said that they have taken cognizance of the matter and the cause
of fire is being ascertained.

Locals appealed to the district administration to provide compensation to the
affected family.

Earlier two incidents of overnight fire were reported in Kaloosa and Watrina areas
of Bandipora district.

3 notorious bovine smugglers arrested
