Questing BJP for its nervousness, after the announcement of the peaceful dharna in Jammu on Oct. 10 by the main opposition parties to launch a joint struggle for the restoration of democratic rights under the constitution to the people of J&K, JKPCC has said that it reflects the ruling party's frustration and lack of faith in the democracy
