Dr Jitendra calls for collective effort to meet Climate challenge

NEW DELHI: Union Minister for Science & Technology, Dr. Jitendra Singh has called for collective effort to meet the Climate challenge saying the issue is too serious to be left to the government alone.

The Minister said that there is an urgent need for decisive action to combat climate change, a challenge that is no longer a distant threat but an immediate reality affecting lives, economies, and the future of the planet. He was addressing the "Times Now" Global Sustainability Alliance's 6th edition of the SDG Summit 2024 in New Delhi today. The theme for the address was Game Changing India's Science Based Targets for Climate Change

Recognizing India's responsibility as one of the world's fastest-growing economies, Dr. Singh reaffirmed the country's commitment to balancing sustainable development with global climate change mitigation efforts. He highlighted the importance of science-based targets, which, in alignment with the goals of the Paris

Agreement, aim to limit global warming to well below 2 degrees Celsius, with aspirations to restrict it to 1.5

Dr. Jitendra outlined India's key climate targets, which include (i) A reduction of 33-35% in greenhouse gas emissions intensity by 2030,

using 2005 levels as a baseline; (ii) A commitment to increasing non-fossil fuel energy capacity to 500 GW, and (iii) An ambitious goal to achieve netzero emissions by 2070.

The Minister of State underscored the importance of collaboration in achieving these targets, urging stronger partnerships between government, industry, academia, and civil society. He highlighted that innovation will be central to India's strategy, whether through advancements in renewable energy, sustainable agriculture, or green technolo-

Dr. Singh pointed to the robust policy framework established by the Government of India to guide climate action, with the National Action Plan on Climate Change (NAPCC) playing a pivotal role.

Moreover, the Minister emphasized that India has developed various sector-specific strategies to strengthen its climate goals. These goals include (i) Energy Sector: Investments in renewable energy sources like solar, wind, and biomass, alongside the

implementation of smart grids and energy storage; (ii) Transportation: Promotion of electric vehicles (EVs) and enhancement of public transportation systems; (iii) Agriculture: Focus on climate-resilient crops, improved irrigation, and sustainable farming practices; (iv) Urban Development: Encouragement of sustainable urban planning, green building practices, and waste management initiatives; (v) Water Resources: Promotion of water conservation, rainwater harvesting, and enhanced river basin management; and (vi) Management: Disaster

Strengthening resilience against climate-induced disasters through improved early warning systems and community preparedness.

Dr. Singh urged every citizen to actively participate in the fight against climate change, emphasizing that simple changes in daily life can have a significant impact. He stressed the importance of fostering a culture of sustainability and urged all stakeholders to collaborate towards a resilient and sustainable future.

JAMMU: Former minister and ex-MLA Marh, Ch Sukhnandan has welcomed the union cabinet decision to hike the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for Ravi cropsfor marketing season 2025-

He told that rapeseed and mustard MSP has witnessed a maximum increase of Rs.300per quintal followed by Lentil at Rs.275 per quintal. MSP of wheat has been increased Rs.150 per quintal.

It is pertinent to mention here that the process of MSP was started in the year 1966-67 and and in 46 years i.e upto 2013 previous governments has raised MSP of paddy to Rs.1310 and of wheat to Rs.1350 whereas after taking over as Prime Minister of the country Narendra Modi in 2014 has increased MSP of paddy and wheat to Rs. 2300 and Rs. 2275 $\,$ respectively in the year 2024-25 (in just 10

years) which is respectable increase of 75% in paddy and 68.5% in wheat prices in just 10 years of governance. One can compare the governance of Modi Govt and the previous governments by having a look at increase in MSP in last 10 years.

People urged to use public transport to minimize traffic congestion ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: In view of ongoing festival season and notable congestion due to the construction/widening work on NHW, general public has been appealed to adopt alternate transport options such as publie transport, carpooling etc. to avoid jamming at the crowded locations of NHW/other places till the culmination of festival

Wrong, improper parking particularly at the crowded places is a major concern and cause of congestion leading to obstruction in the operation of emergency services and disruption in the flow of Traffic, said SSP Traffic Rural

"Although, adequate action against the wrong parking is being taken by Traffic Rural, Jammu and over 12878 violations have been booked during the current year on the account of wrong parking, (Overall 116153 challans enforced and fine amounting to Rs. 11,35,27,300/- imposed on the violators) co-operation of general public in this connection is mandatory to prevent disruption of traffic flow especially during the ongoing festival season" a handout issued by the SSP Traffic rural stated. It further appealed to General public to utilize earmarked parking spaces and

avoid blocking driveways or access points adding that in case of the non-availability of the parking space, the vehicle should be parked in such a way that flow of traffic is not inter-

rupted. The office of SSP further observed that negligent approach of people towards the applicable cautionary signages visible on the road is also cause of major concern which not only leads to disruption in the flow of traffic but also causes road accidents. "Public by large is appealed to strictly follow the applicable

instructions such as speed limits, parking restriction, overtake restrictions to prevent any mishap/disruption of the flow of the traffic" he added.

"Encroachment of pathways by hawkers/shopkeepers particularly during the ongoing festival gave rise to apprehension of mishap and disruption of the flow of traffic. Shopkeepers/hawkers are appealed not to occupy pathways as the encroachment of pathways forces the pedestrians to walk on the road causing apprehension of mishap and disruption of the flow of traffic", it maintained. The department said that

over 60 thousand challans of Traffic Rural, Jammu are pending before the various Courts including notable number of challans pertaining to the year 2022 and 2023. Through the medium Press, concerned owner/violators are appealed to dispose of these challans to avert punitive action under law. Winter near but weather in Kashmir constantly dry

SRINAGAR: More than 70 structures, including residential houses, mosques and other commercial structures have been reduced into ashes in the past 48 hours due to continuous dry weather in the Chennab region and Kashmir Valley. These fire incidents took

place in Warwan Kishtwar and Gurez areas ,where dozens of families lost their roof and were living in the open air on cold nights. Keeping these factors and

facts in-view, the Fire and Emergency Department in the Valley has urged caution for the locals and pressed for taking all necessary and possible precautions to prevent fires in residential homes and other buildings. The fire incidents tend to go up during these months as use of coal. kerosene, wood, and LPG becomes extensive to counter the harsh temperatures.

Given the materials used for construction in Kashmir homes, including wood, the officials from the Fire and Emergency Department have asked people to follow all the safety measures.

According to the officials of the Fire and Emergency services.It's up to individuals to ensure they follow the safety

"As the dry season begins, it becomes crucial to follow the

do's and don'ts to prevent fire incidents. Structures in this region are particularly vulnerable because of the widespread use of wood in construction, which is highly susceptible to catching fire."Officials further explained that fire protection measures are often overlooked during the design and con-

struction phases in Kashmir. "We recommend that people avoid using flammable materials like wood, or at least integrate fire-safety designs into their homes. The lack of such measures often results in widespread damage when fires occur. Having basic fire extinguishers and other safety equipment can make a significant difference in controlling small fires before they become

He also highlighted the common causes of fire during these months, including LPG leaks and electrical short circuits, both of which are prevalent due to the increased use of heating devices as winter approaches.

unmanageable," officials said.

As people rely more on heating gadgets during winter, they need to ensure proper usage and maintenance. Faulty gadgets and overloaded circuits are major contributors to fire incidents. The department's advisory also included a list of do's and don'ts, stressing simple but effective preventive measures.

The dry weather and low moisture content in forests during these months also elevate the risk of forest fires, which can quickly spread and cause extensive damage to both property and life. Residents living in forest-adjacent areas were urged to exercise particular caution.

"Forest fires are a real threat in these months due to the low moisture content. One small spark can quickly lead to large-scale destruction, so it is vital to take all necessary precautions," he emphasized.

The department has also assured the public that they are on high alert and ready to respond to any emergencies. Department of fire and emergency has advised the public to use electrical appliances with caution.

And stressed the importance of not leaving these appliances unattended and urged residents to purchase high-quality electrical items.

Winters in Kashmir are a delight for outsiders, offering snow-covered mountains and breathtaking hill stations. However, for the local Kashmiri population, these months bring a host of problems-from skyrocketing vegetable prices and electricity shortages to a rise in fire incidents, which are often deadly and destructive.
